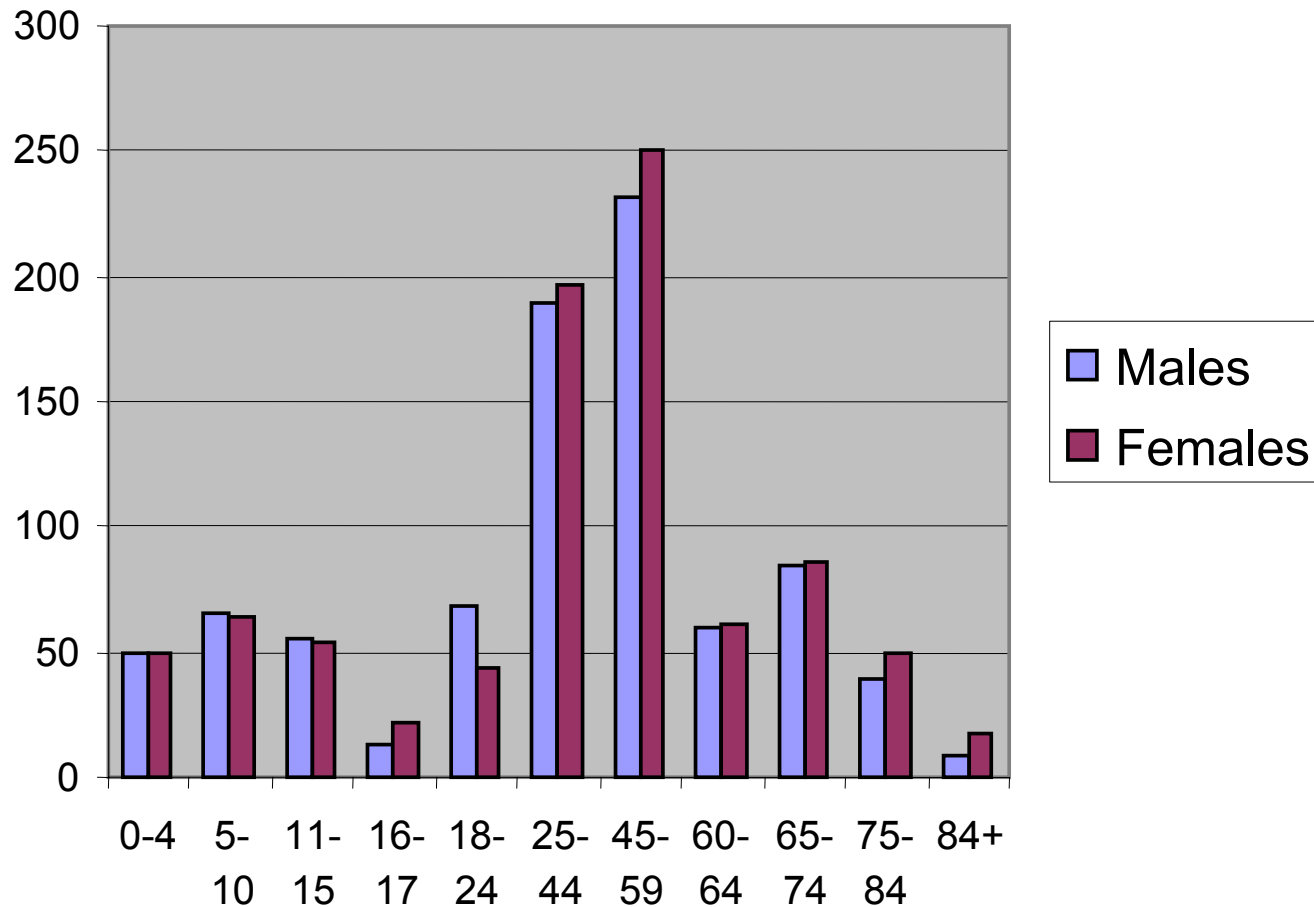

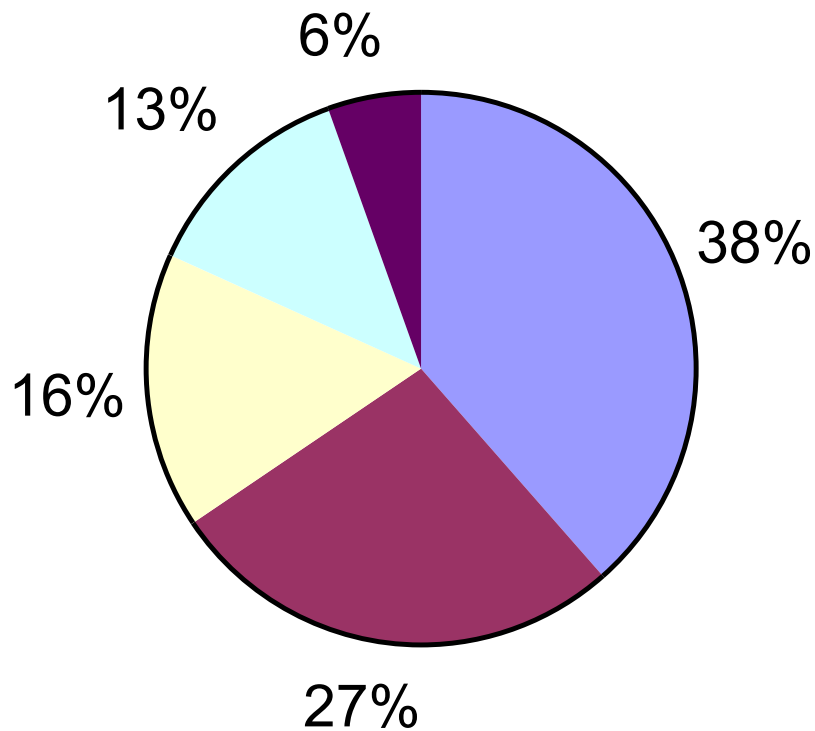

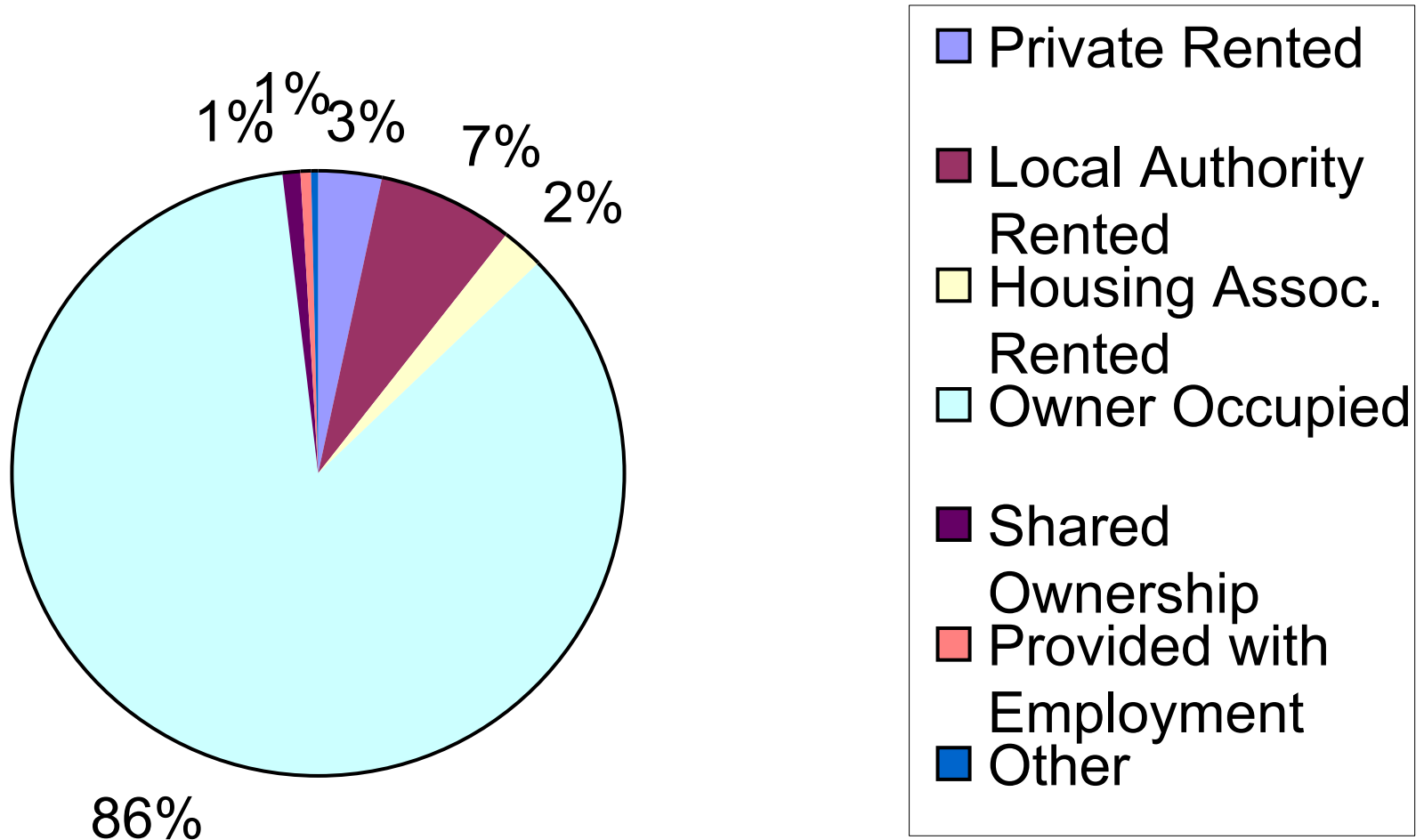

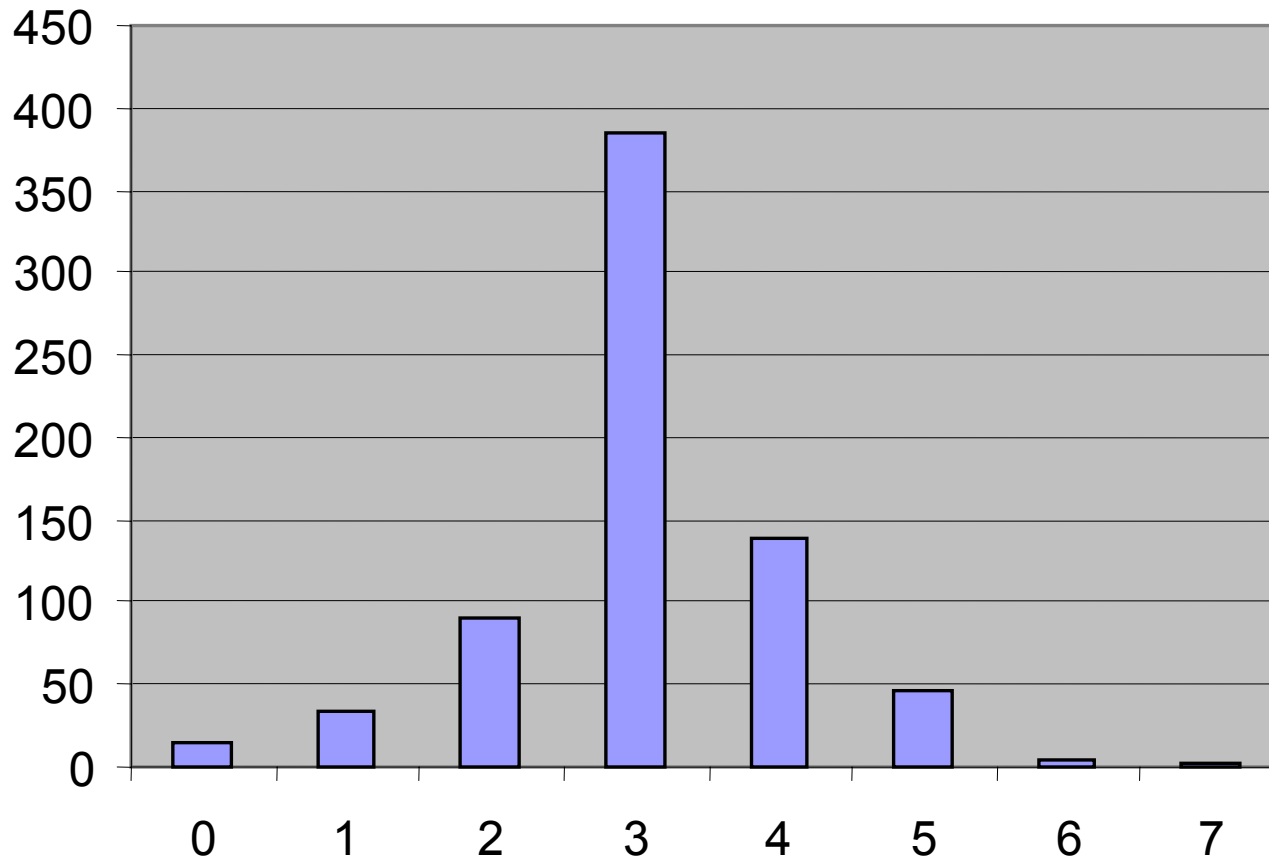

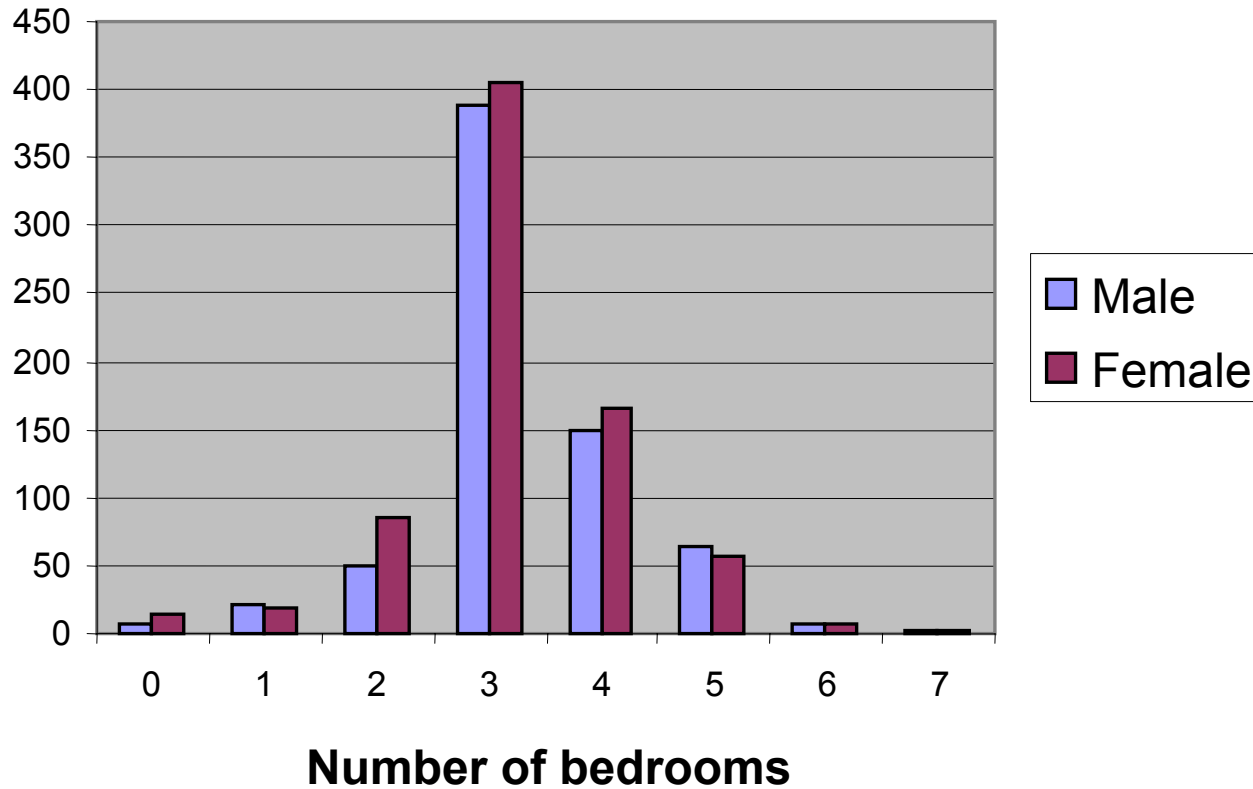

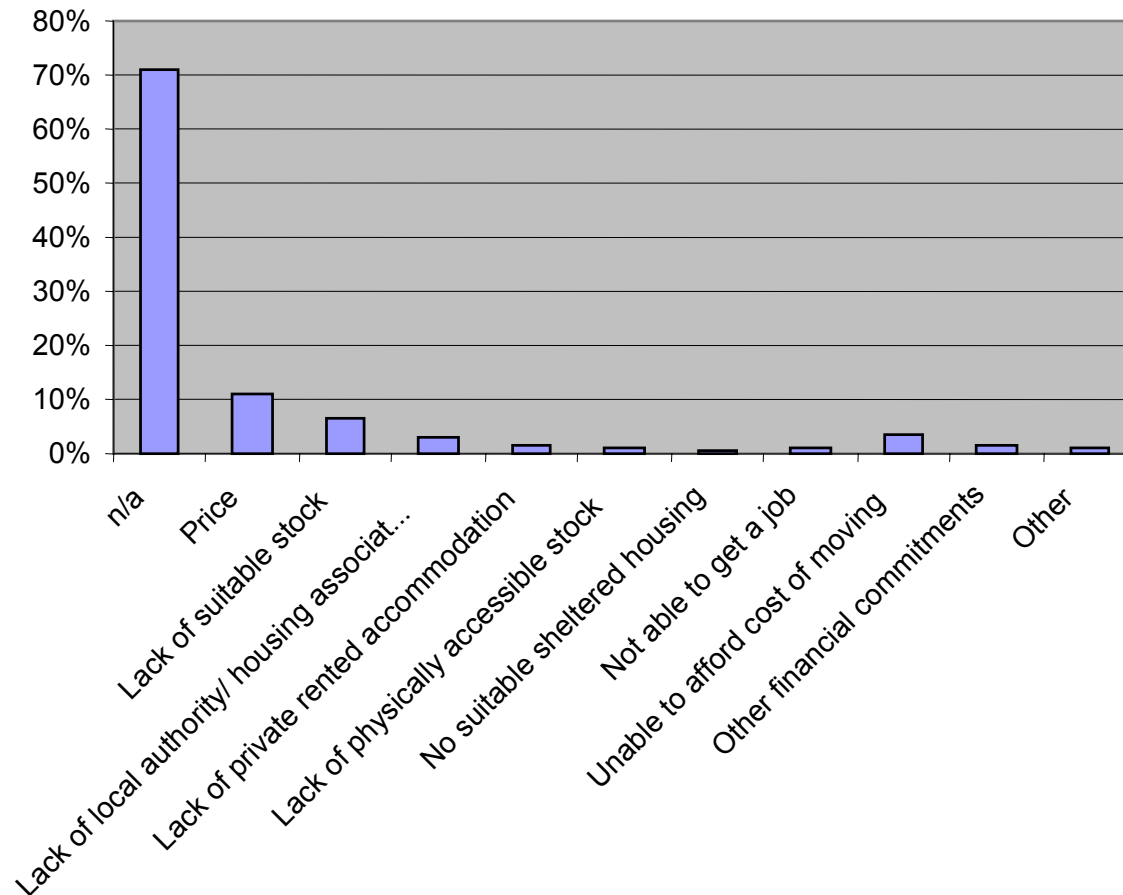
Number of bedrooms by sex (Q11 and Q6)



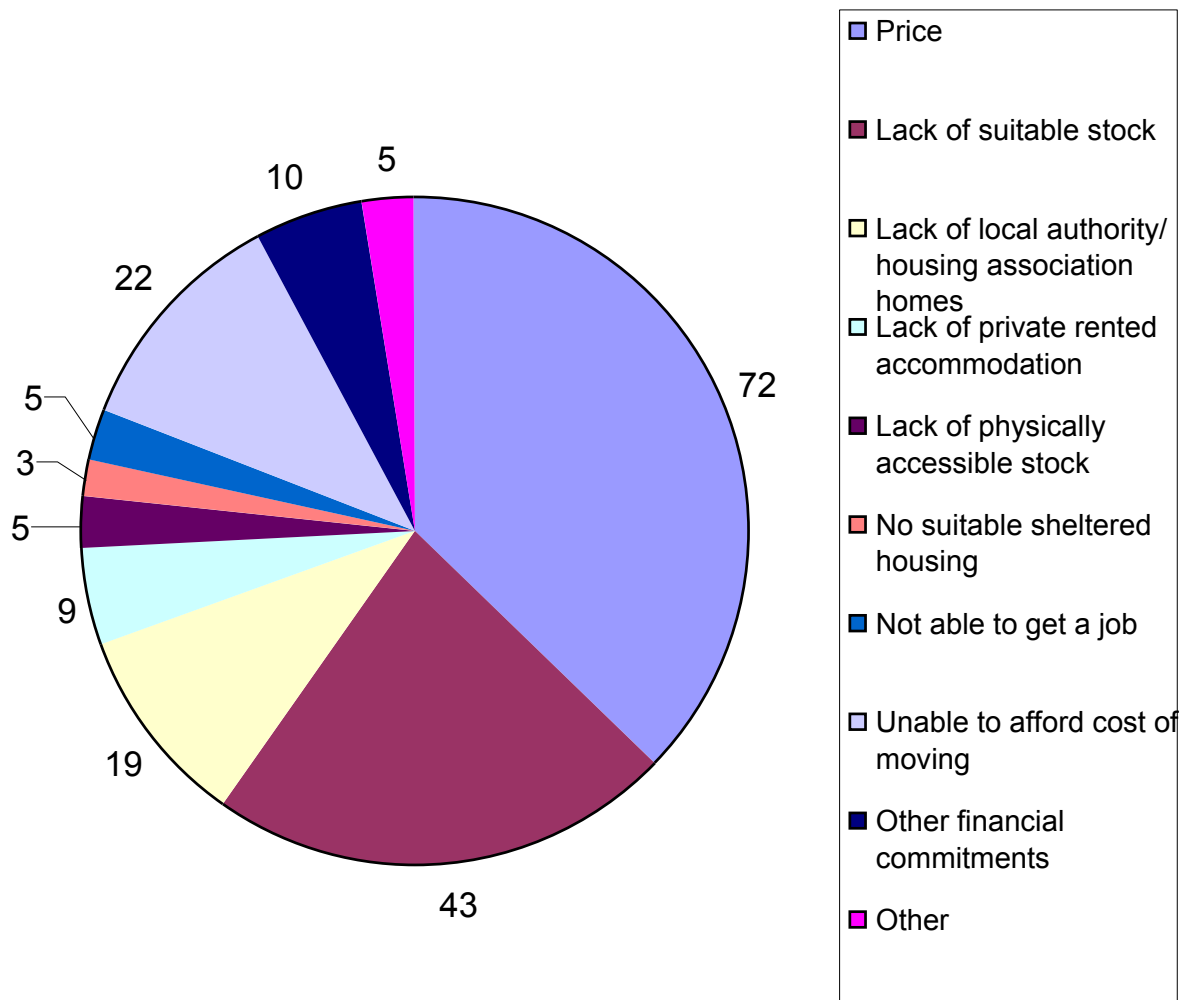

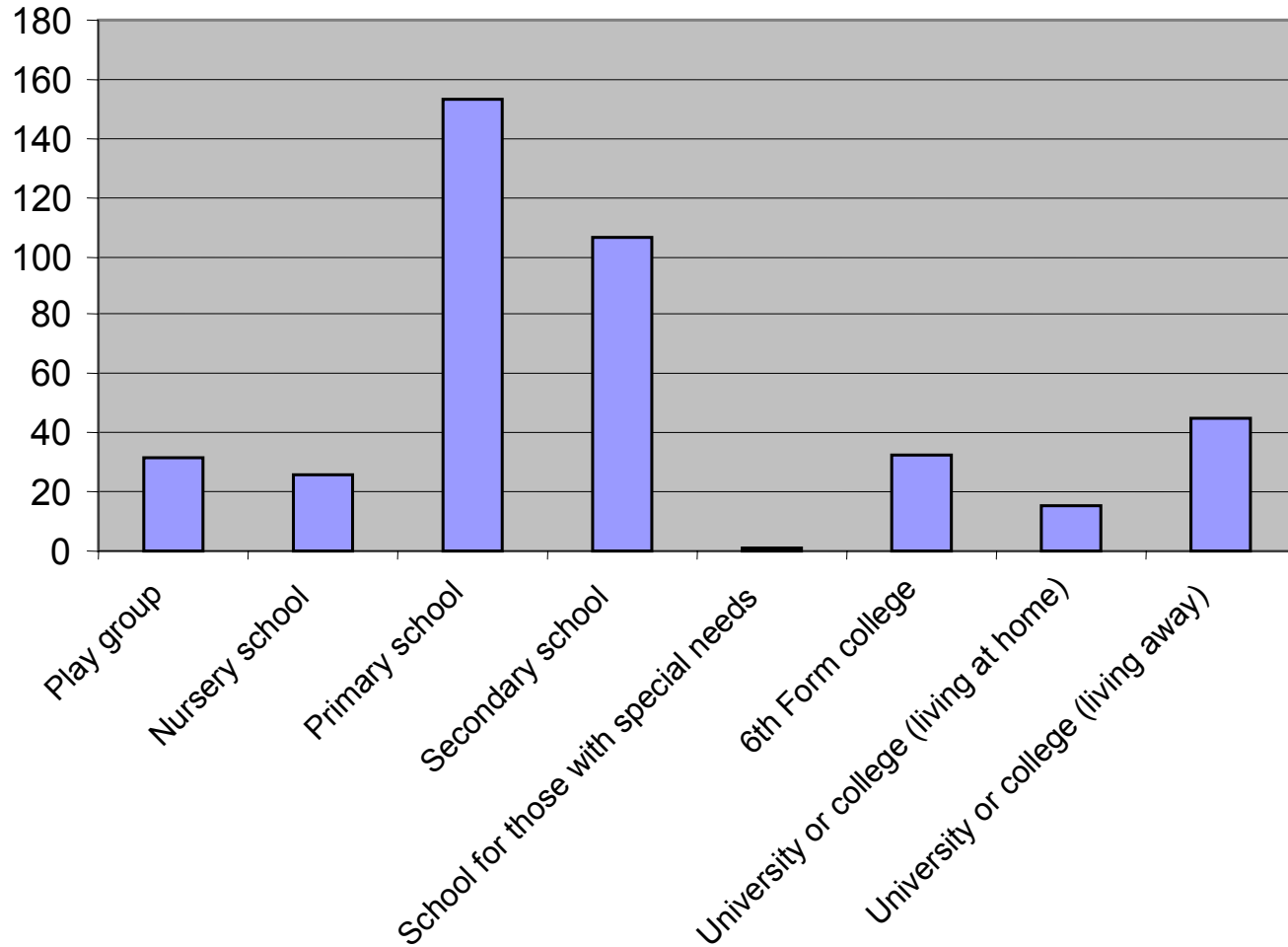

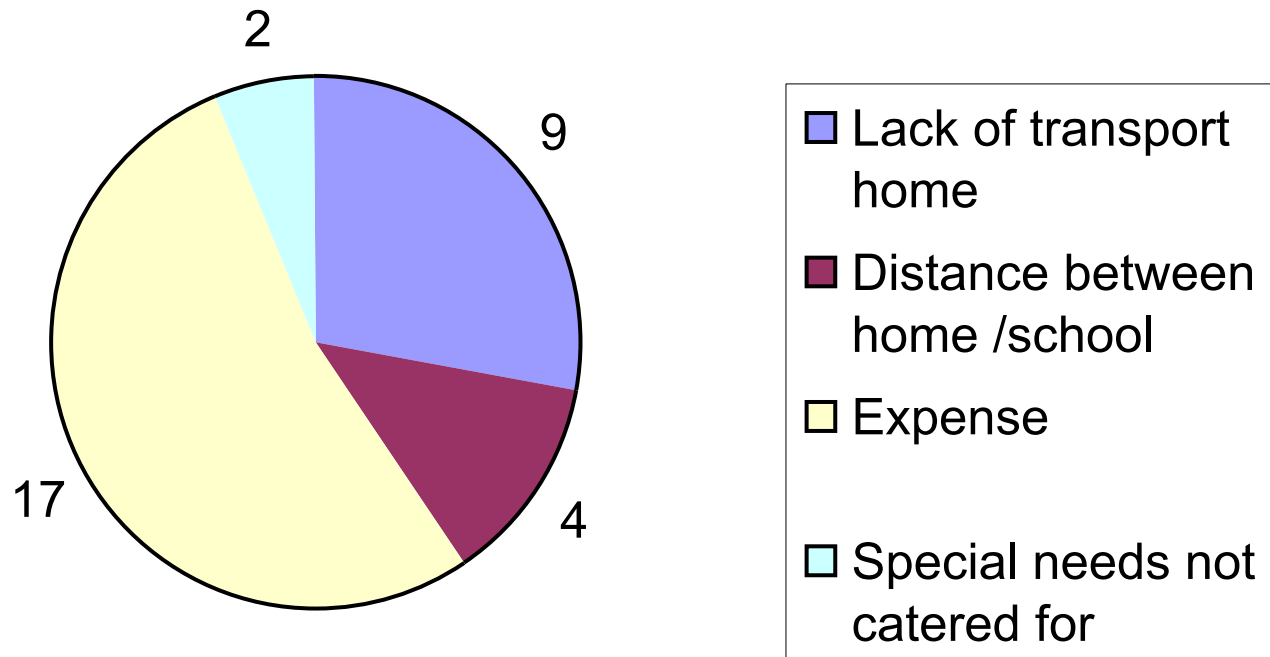

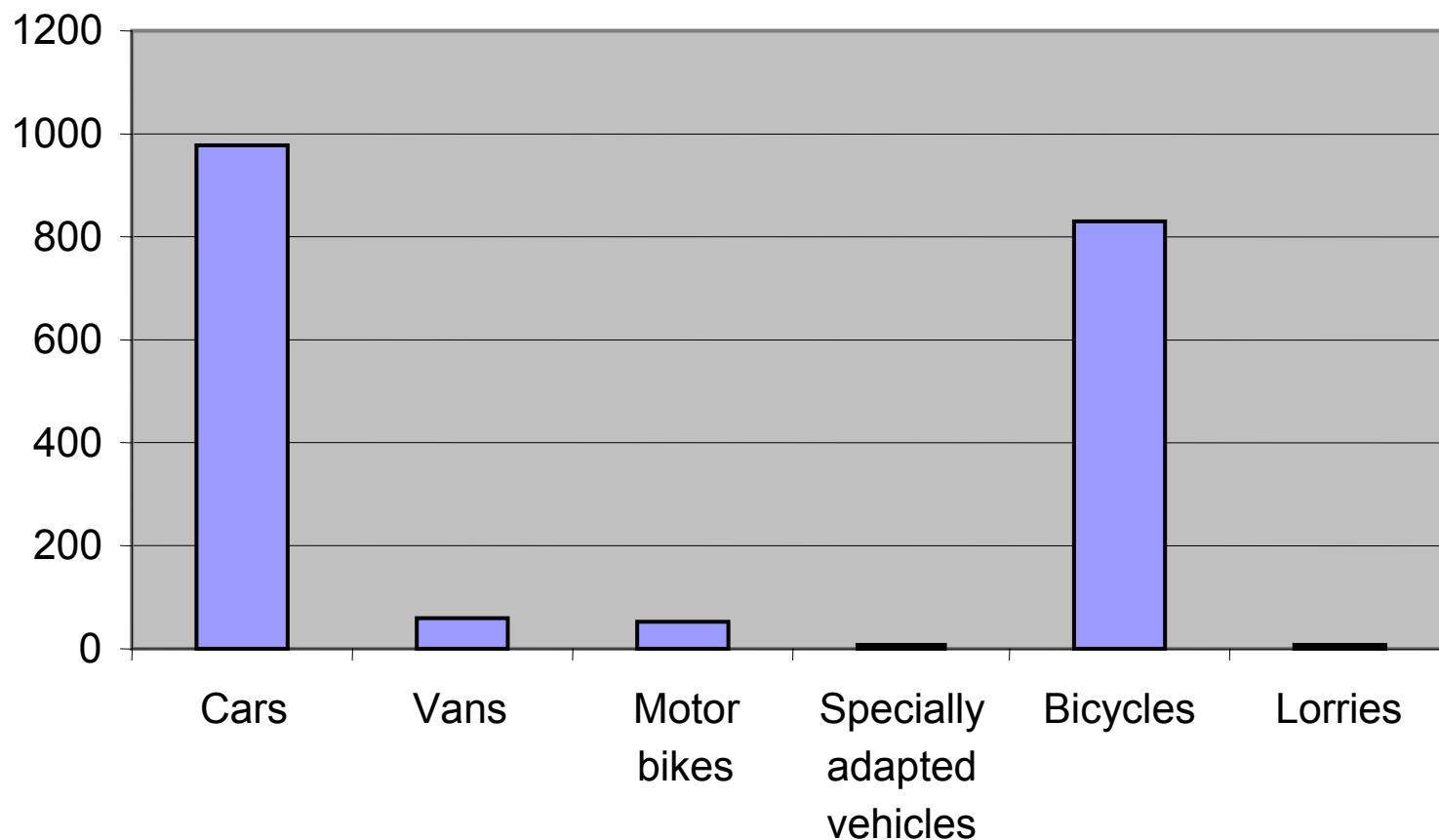

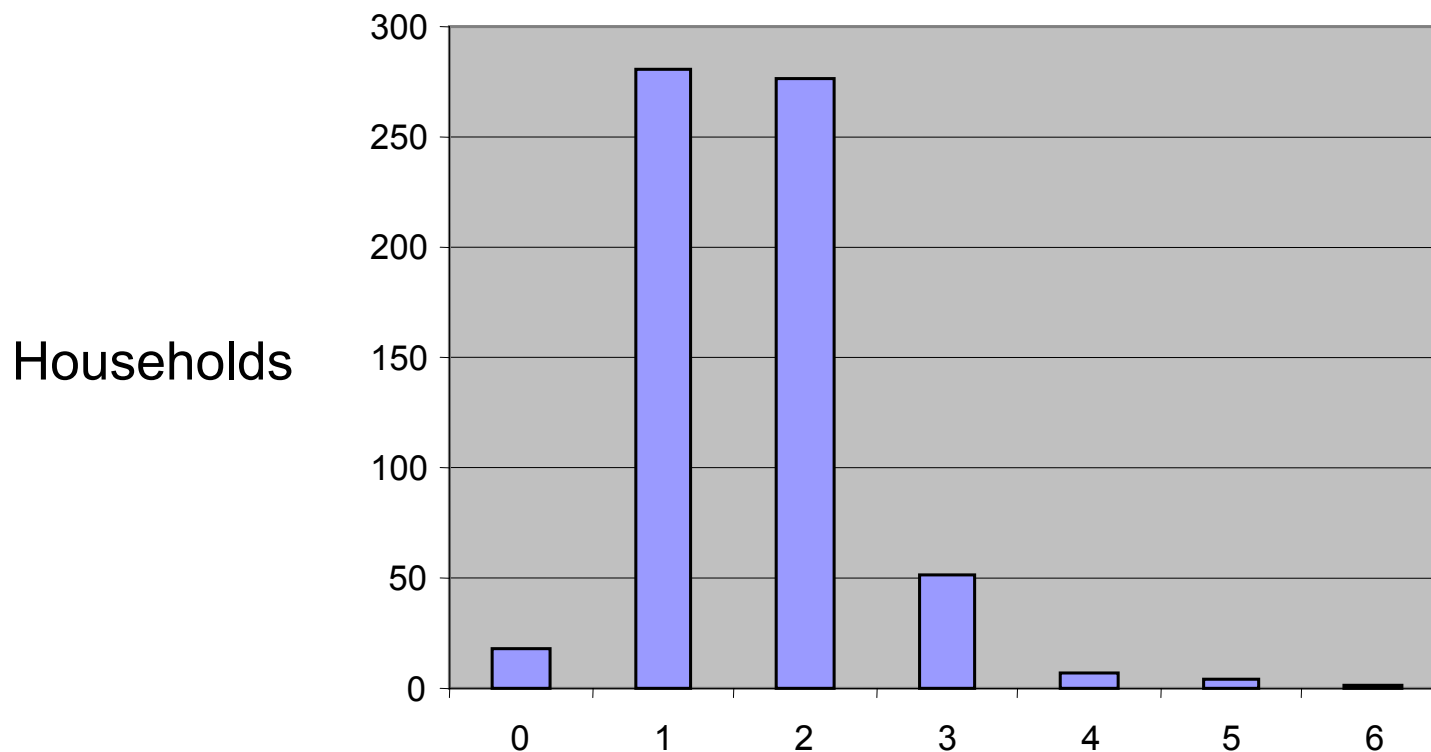

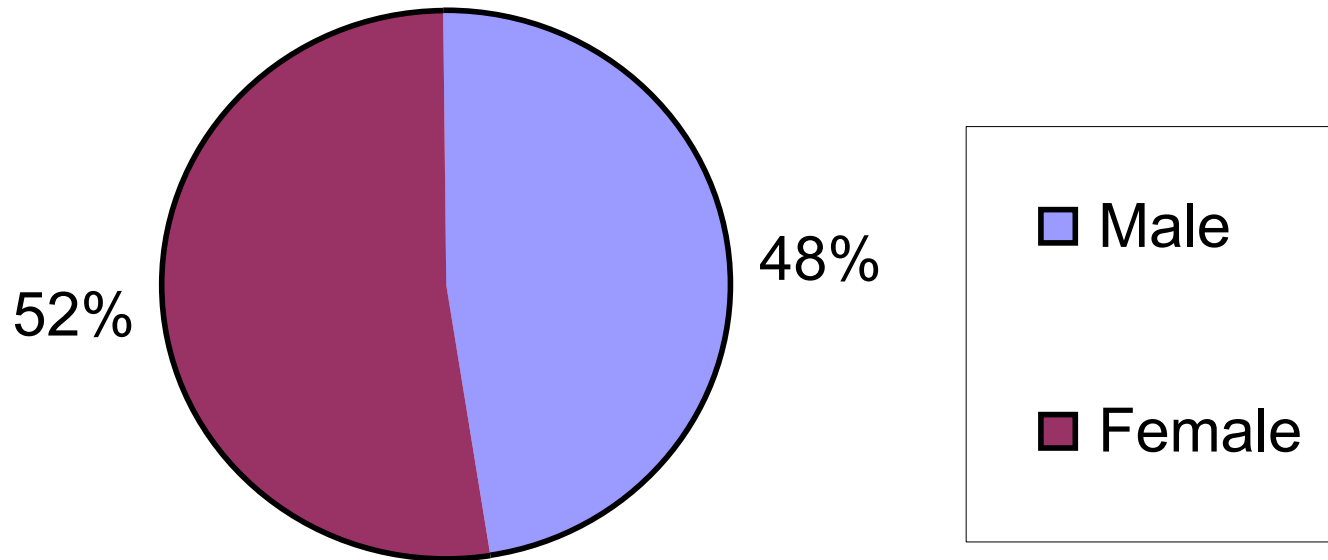

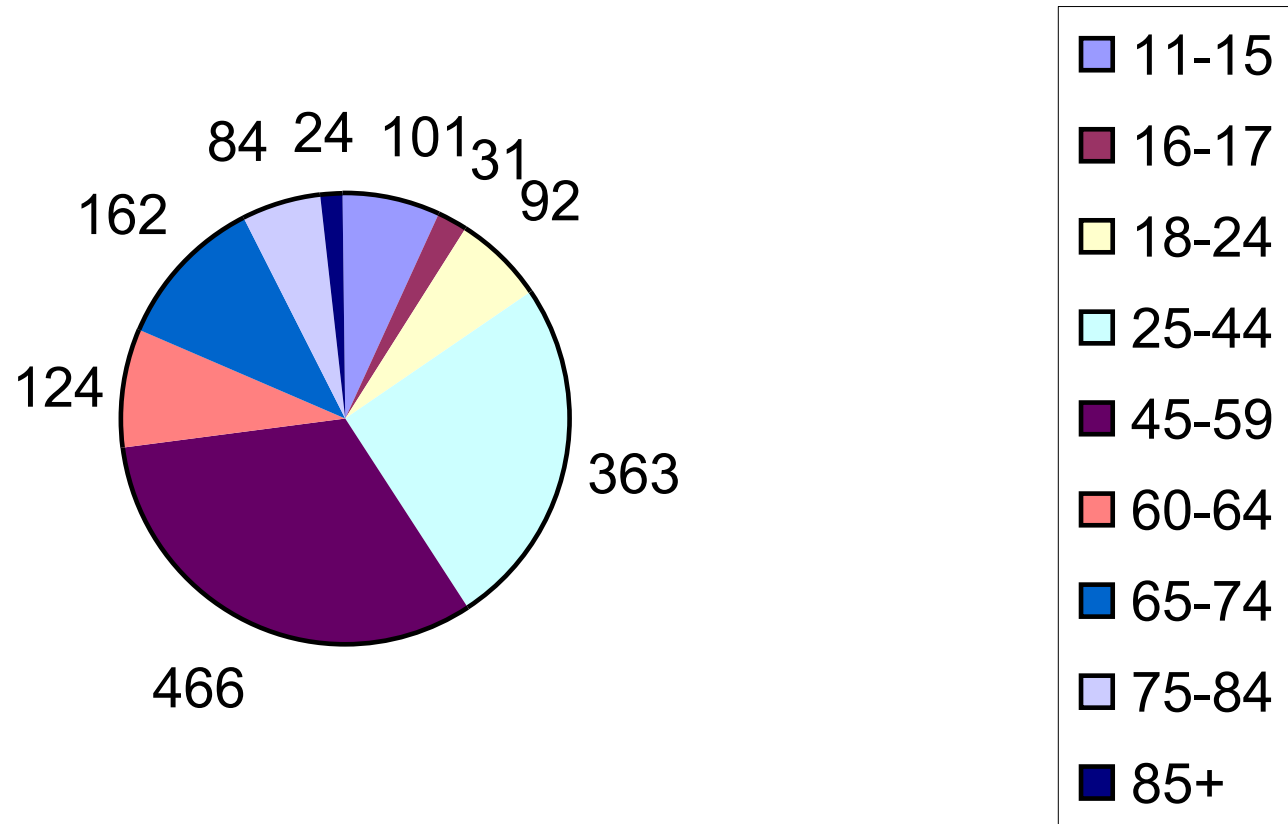

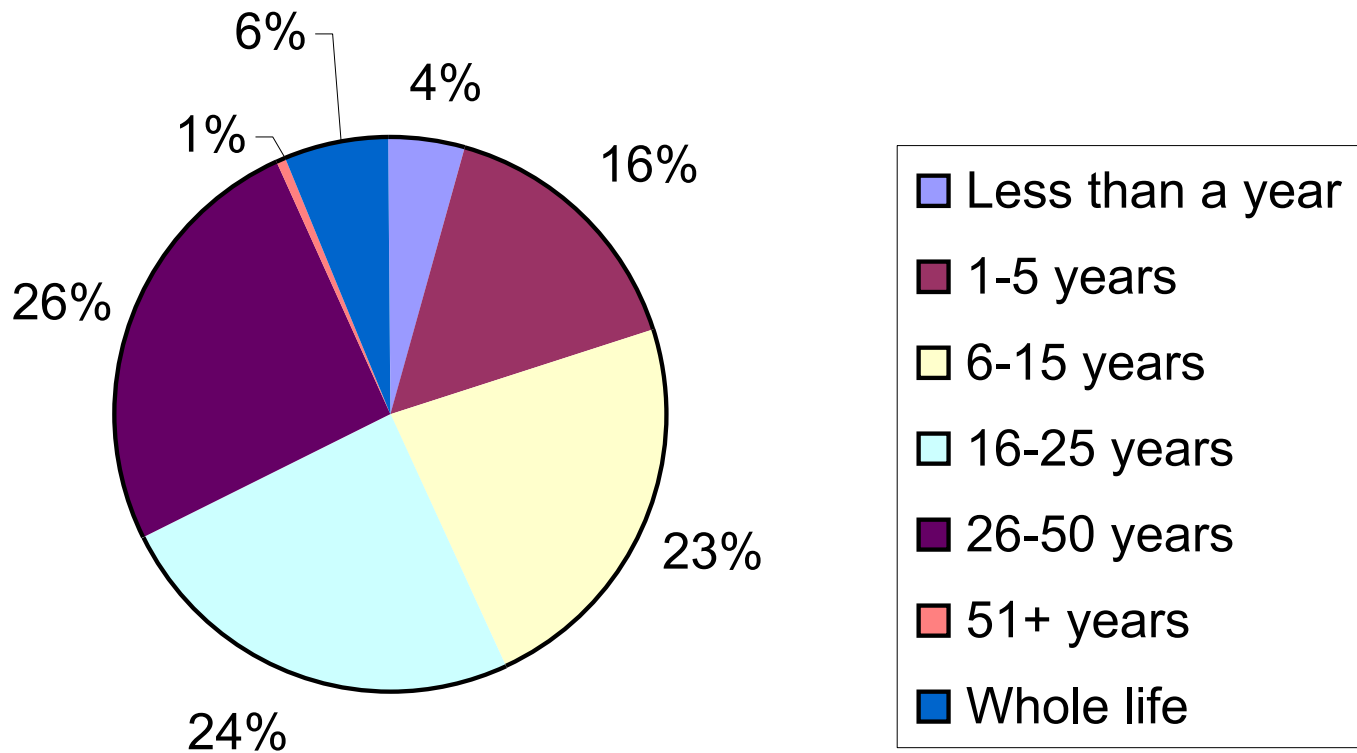

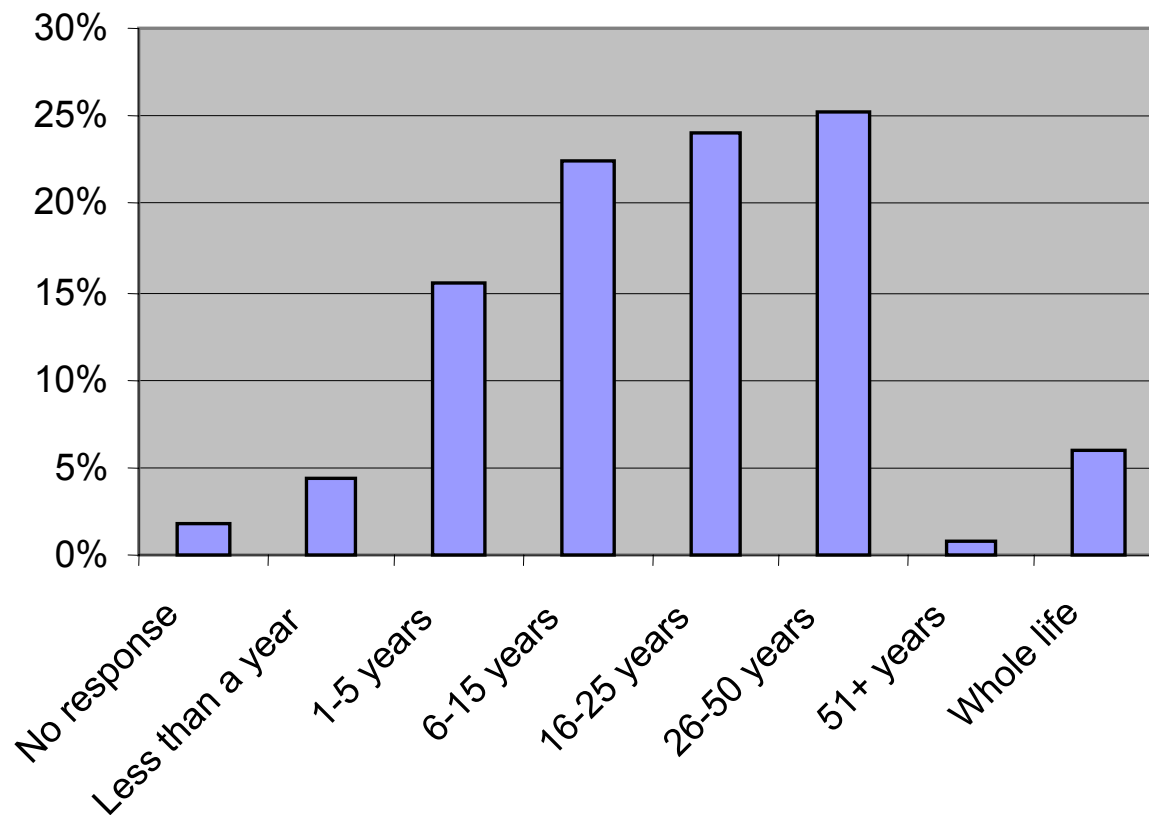

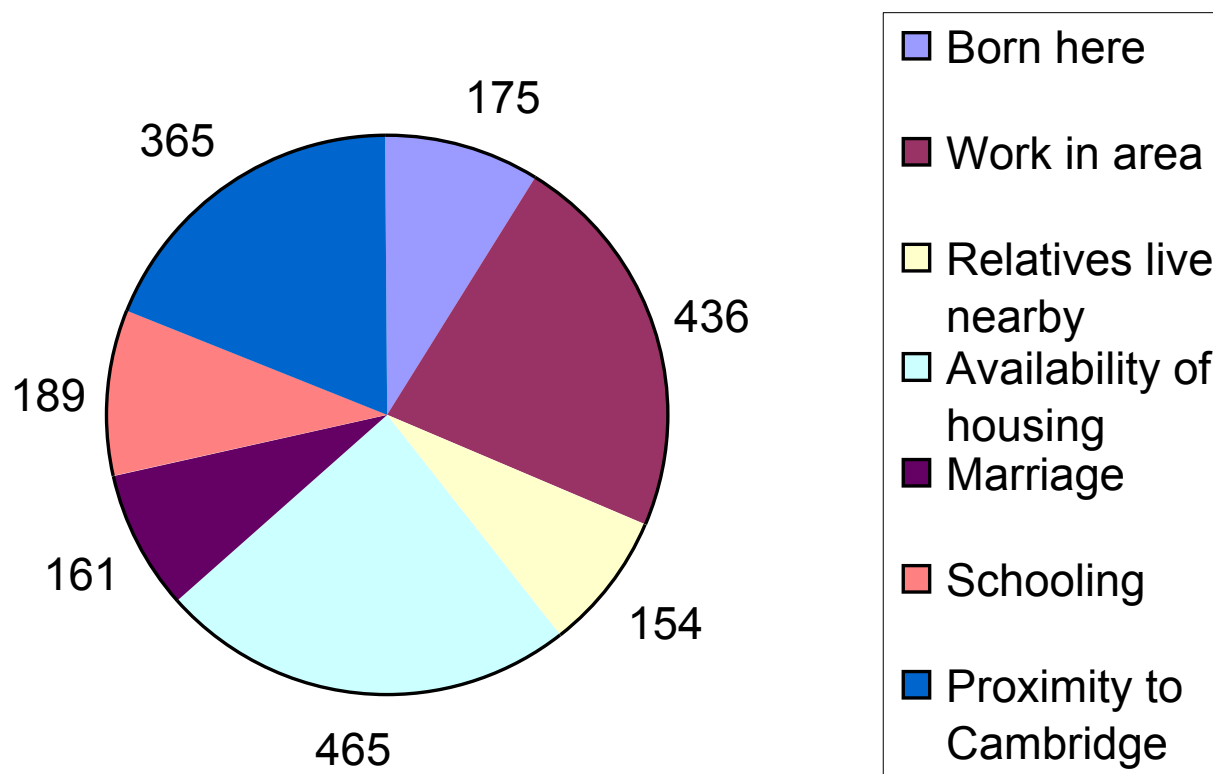
Q14: Where did you live immediately prior to coming to Comberton? (N=1418)



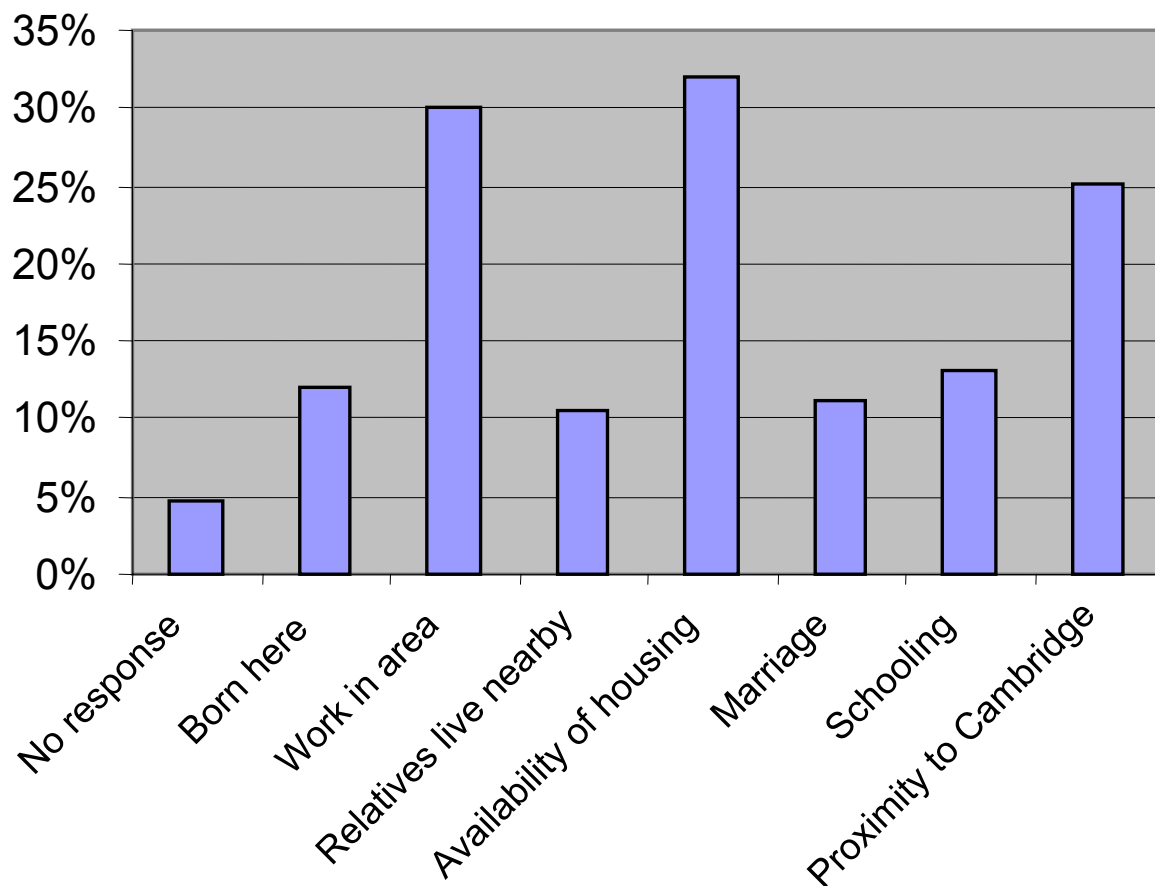

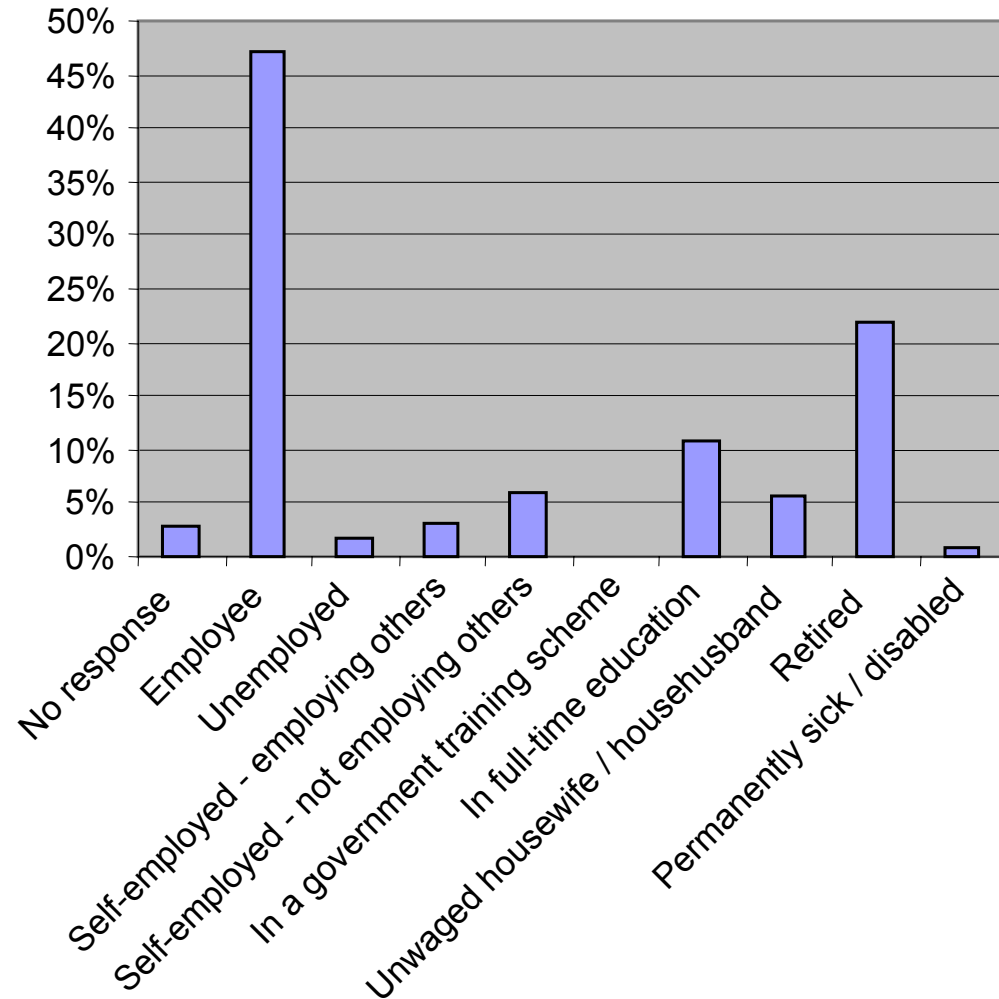

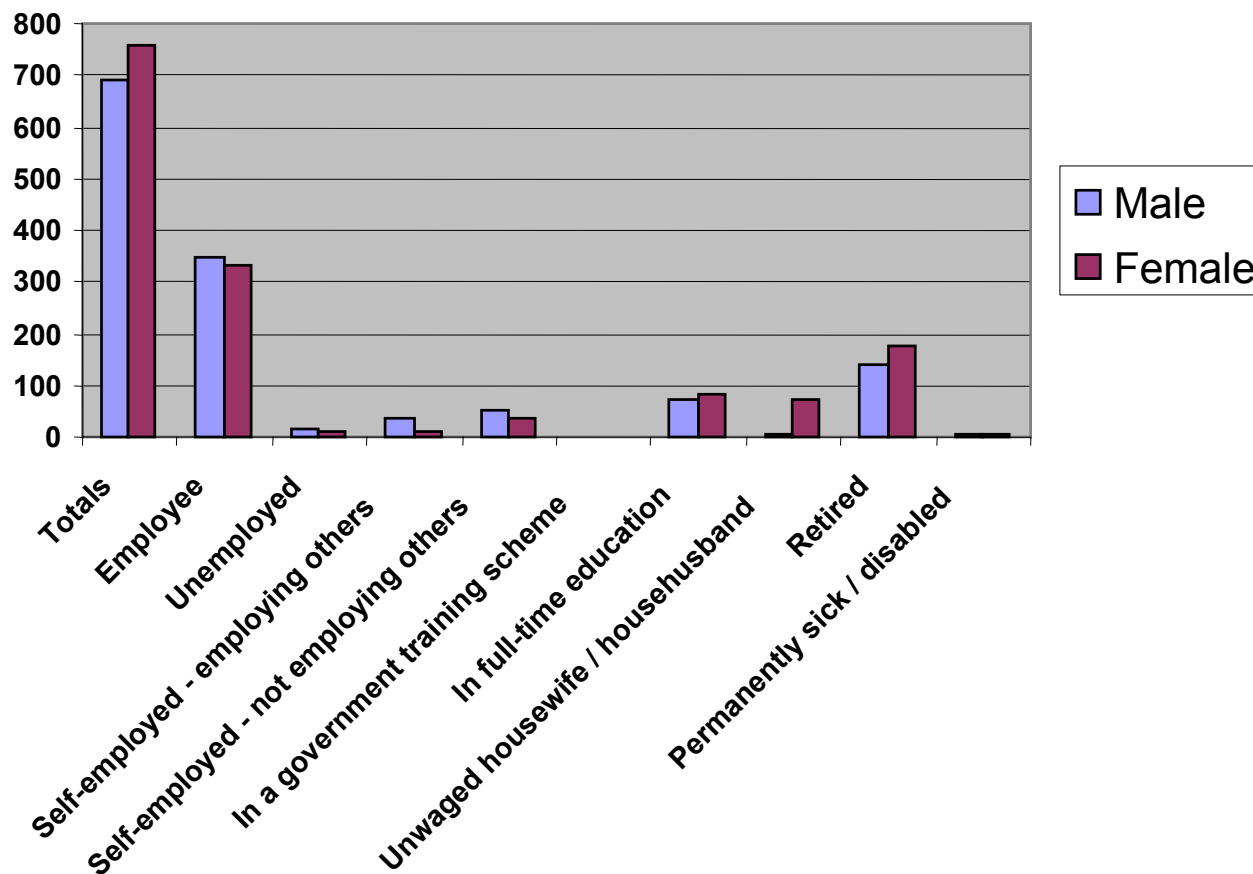

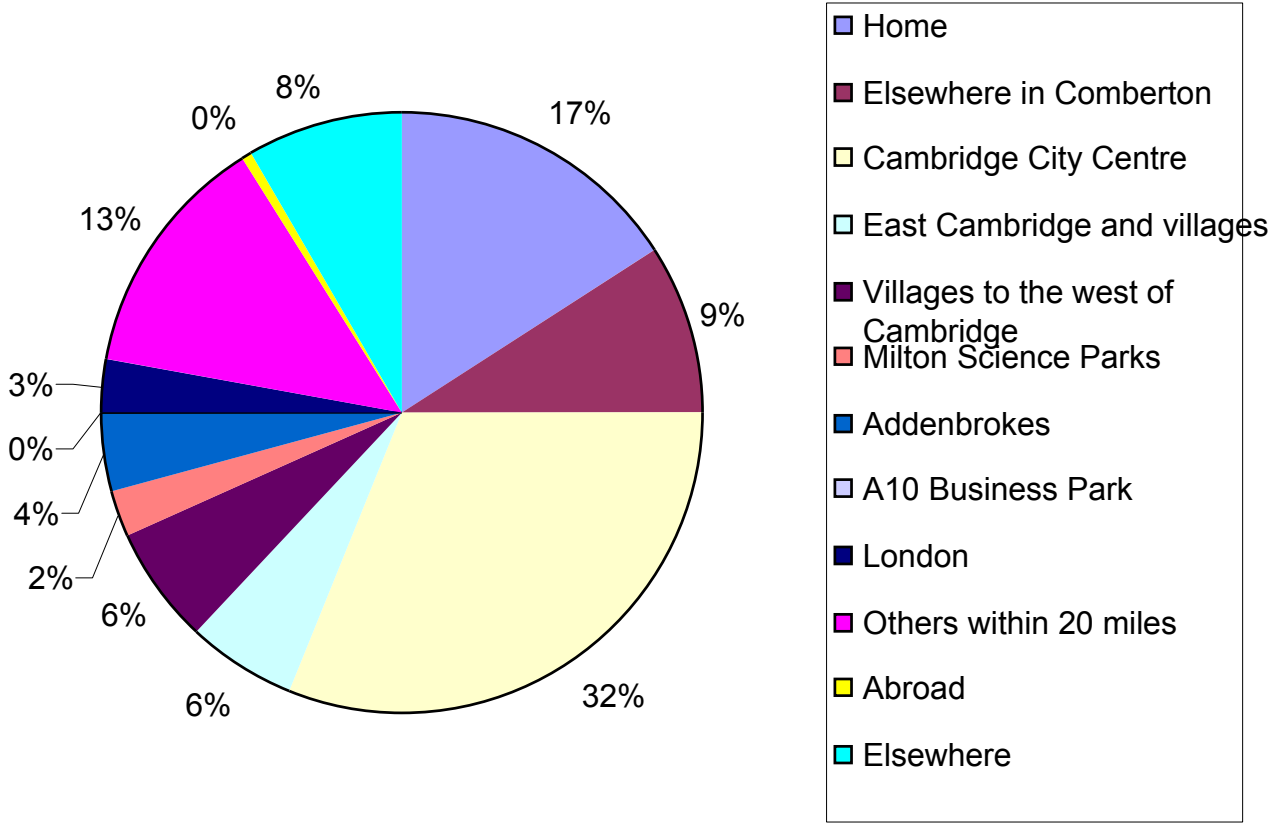

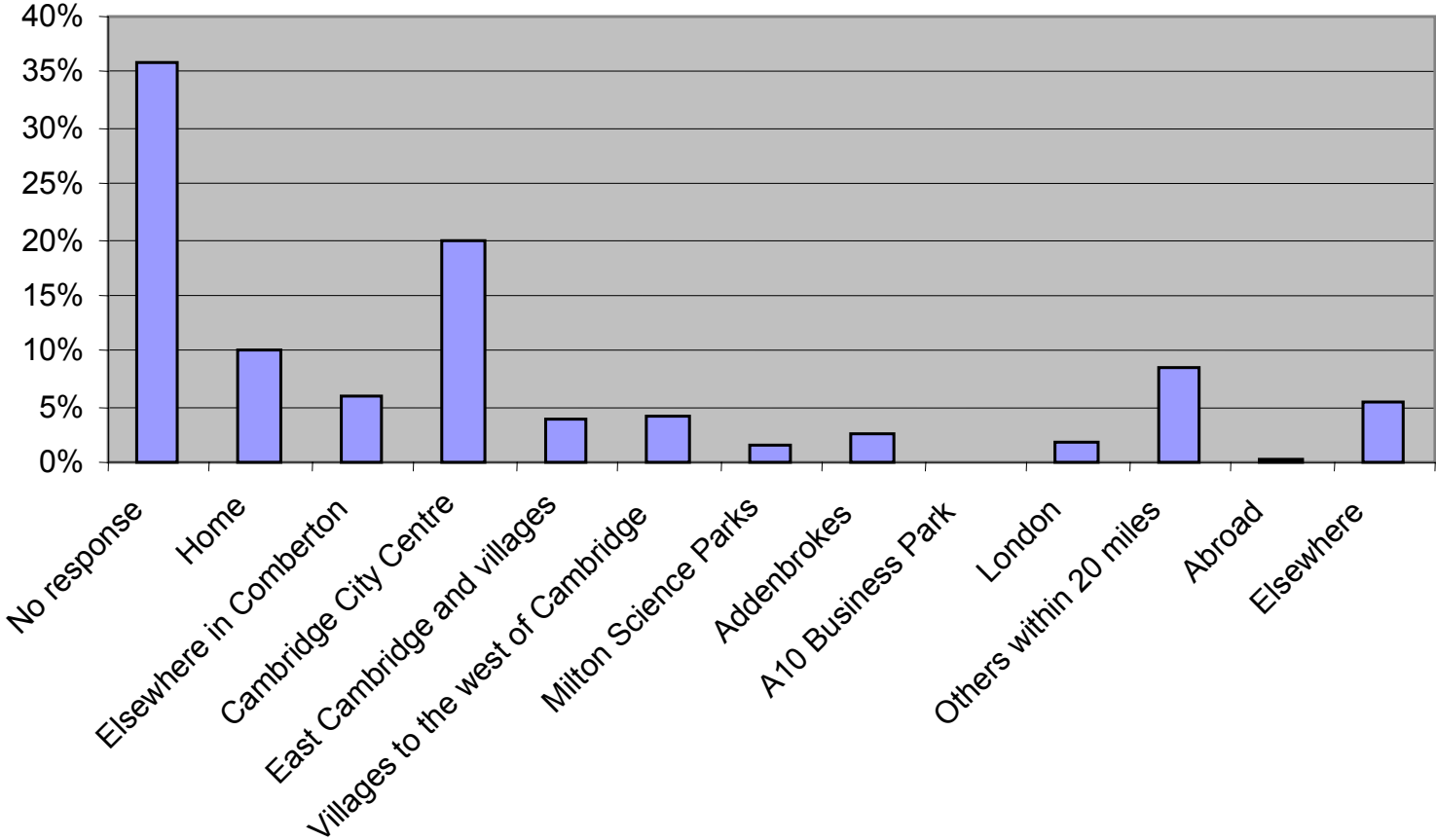

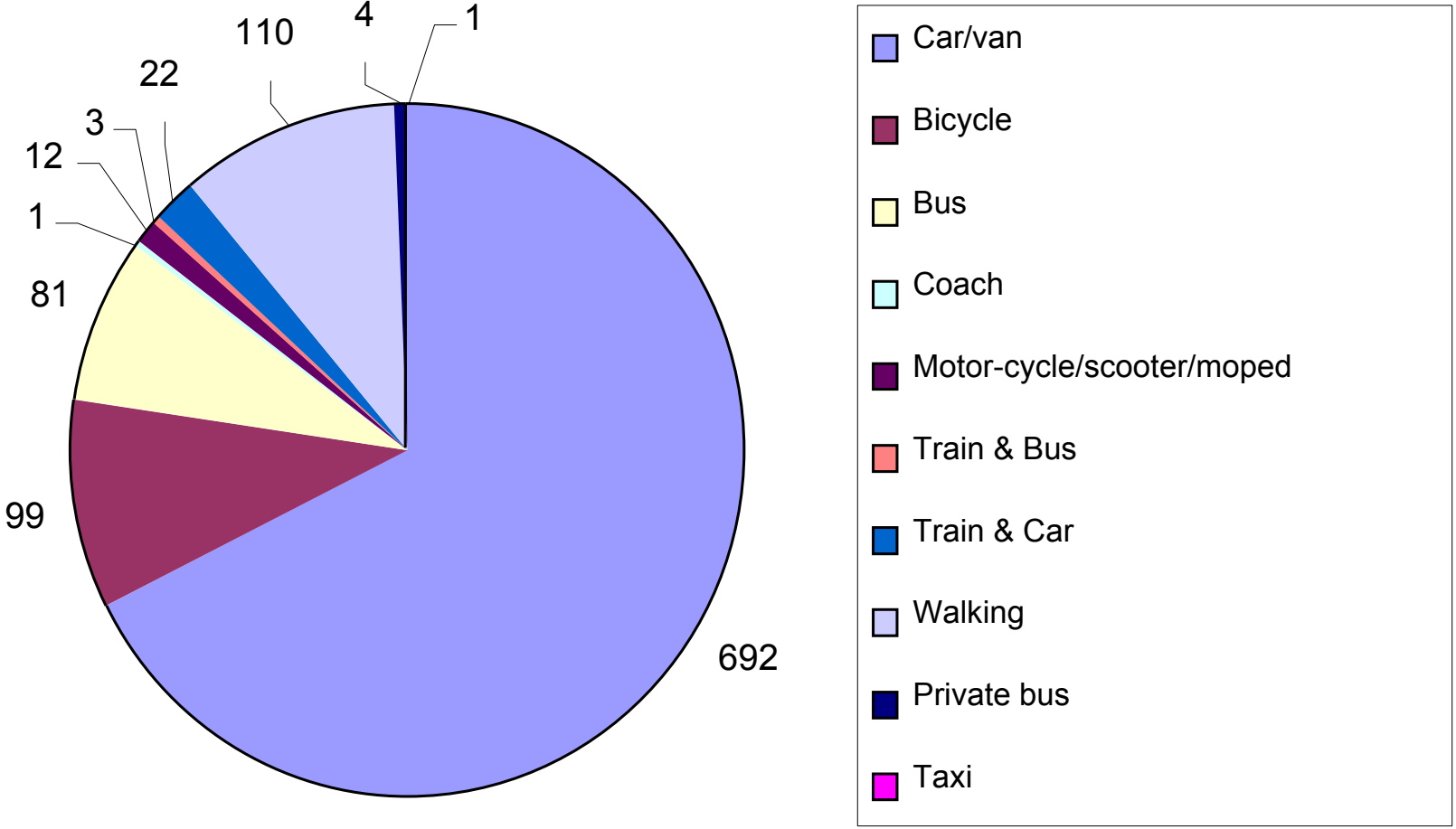
Q20: If you have daytime access to a motor vehicle, what do you use it for? (N=1275)



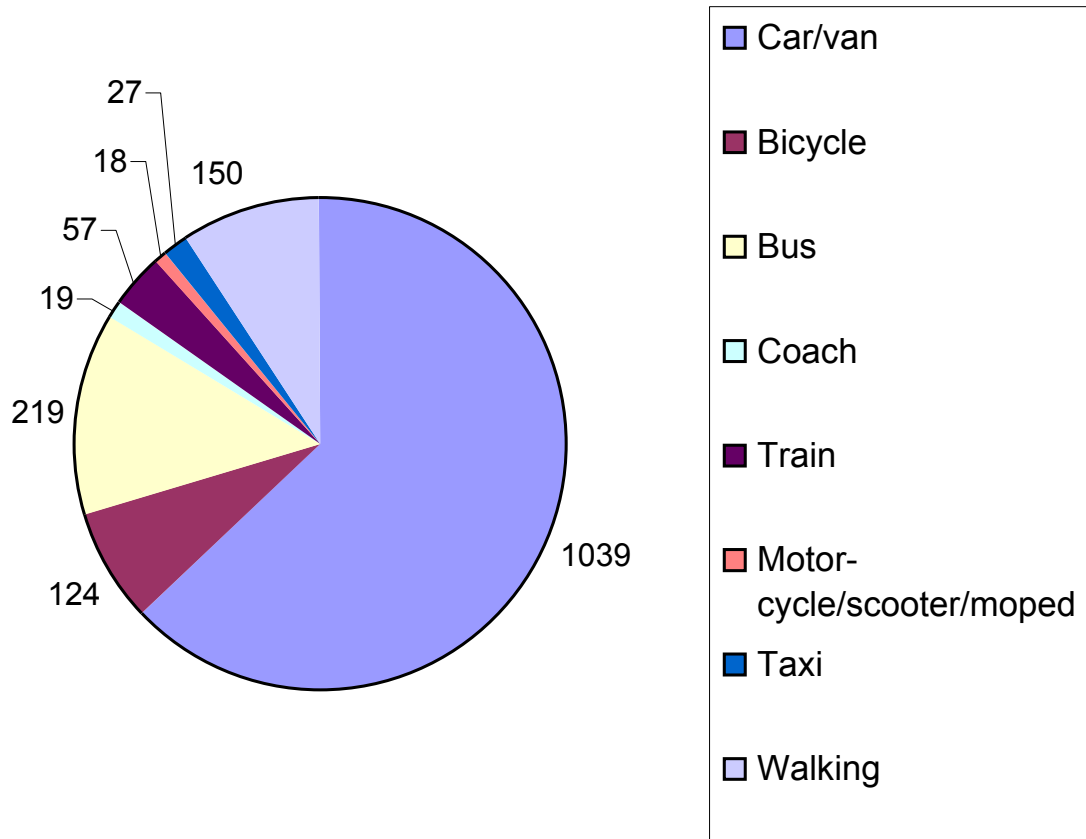

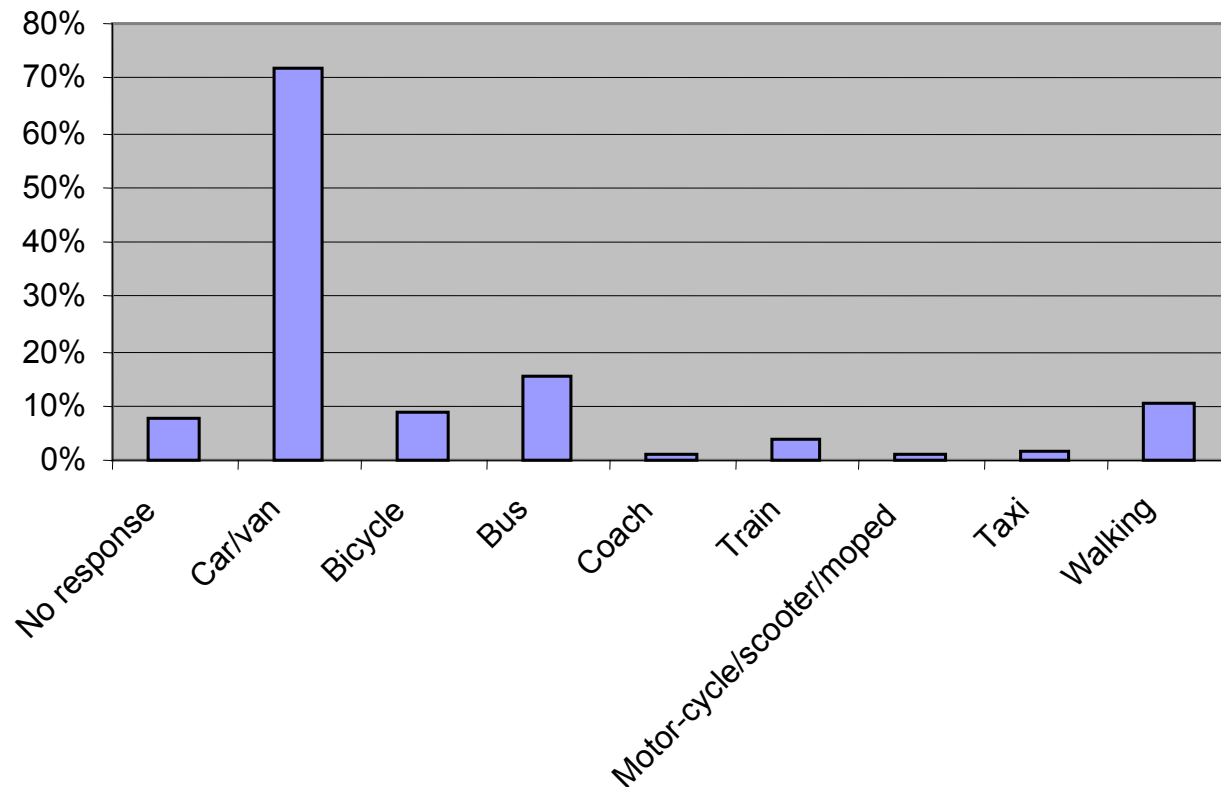
Q21: If appropriate, what is your main means of transport to work, training or study? (N=1025)



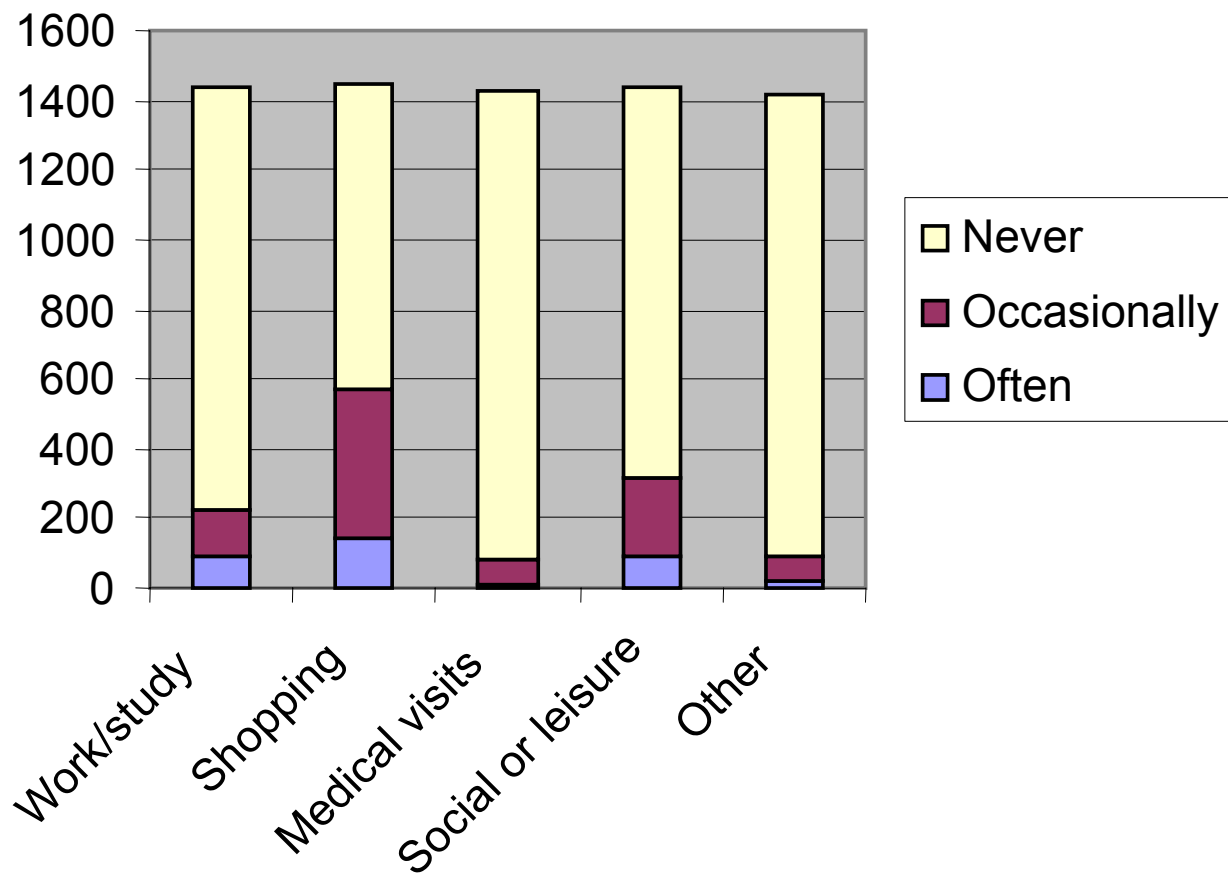

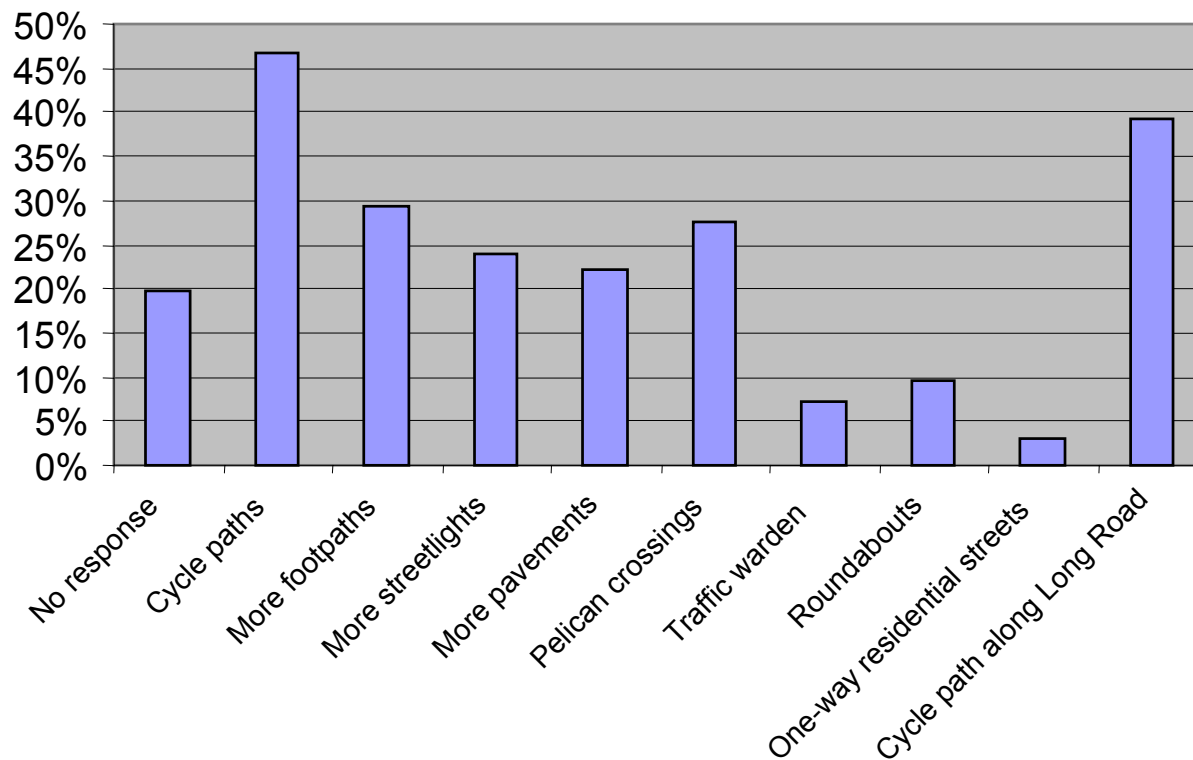

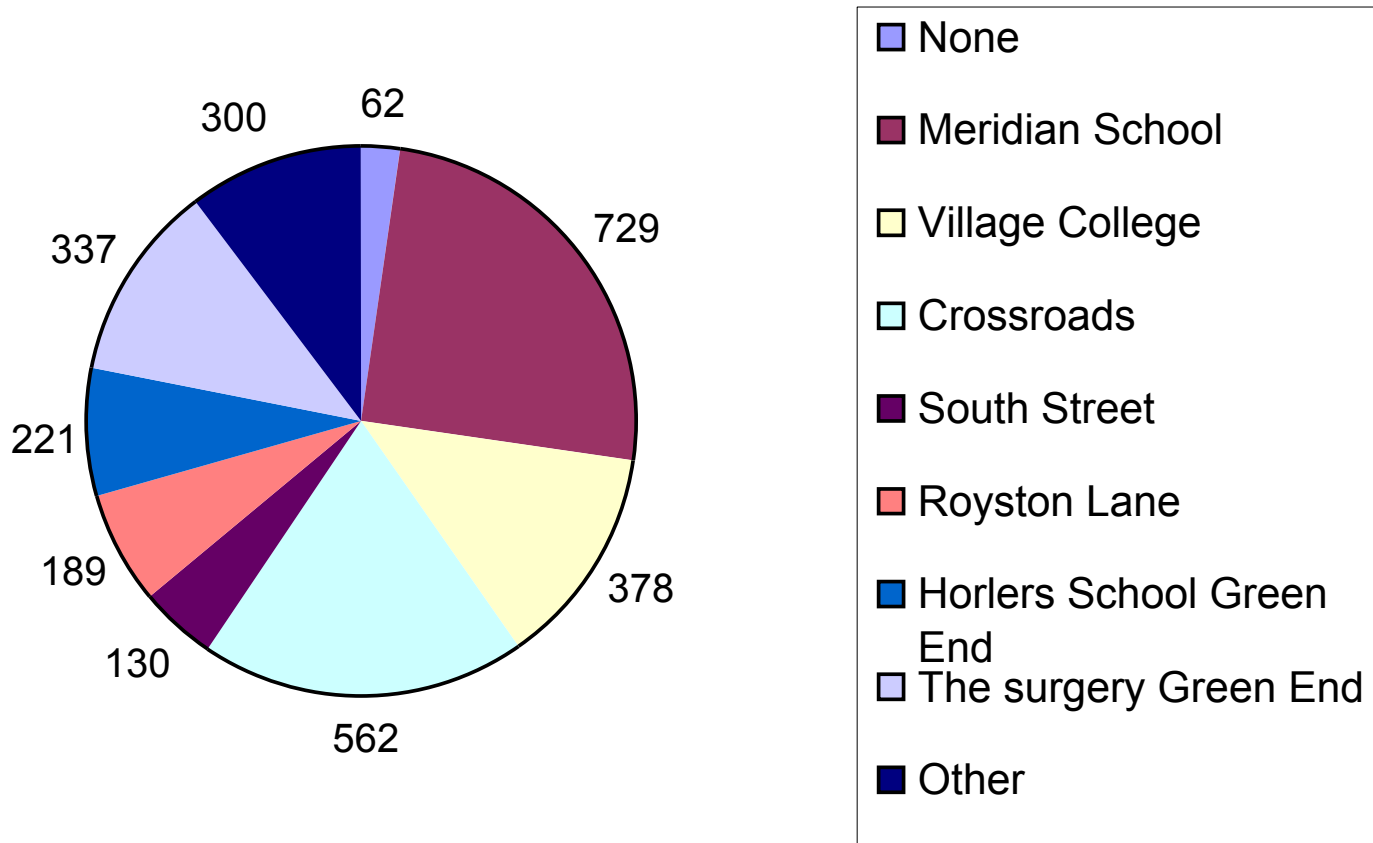
Q27: Would you like to see any of the following roads measures in Comberton? (N=1165)

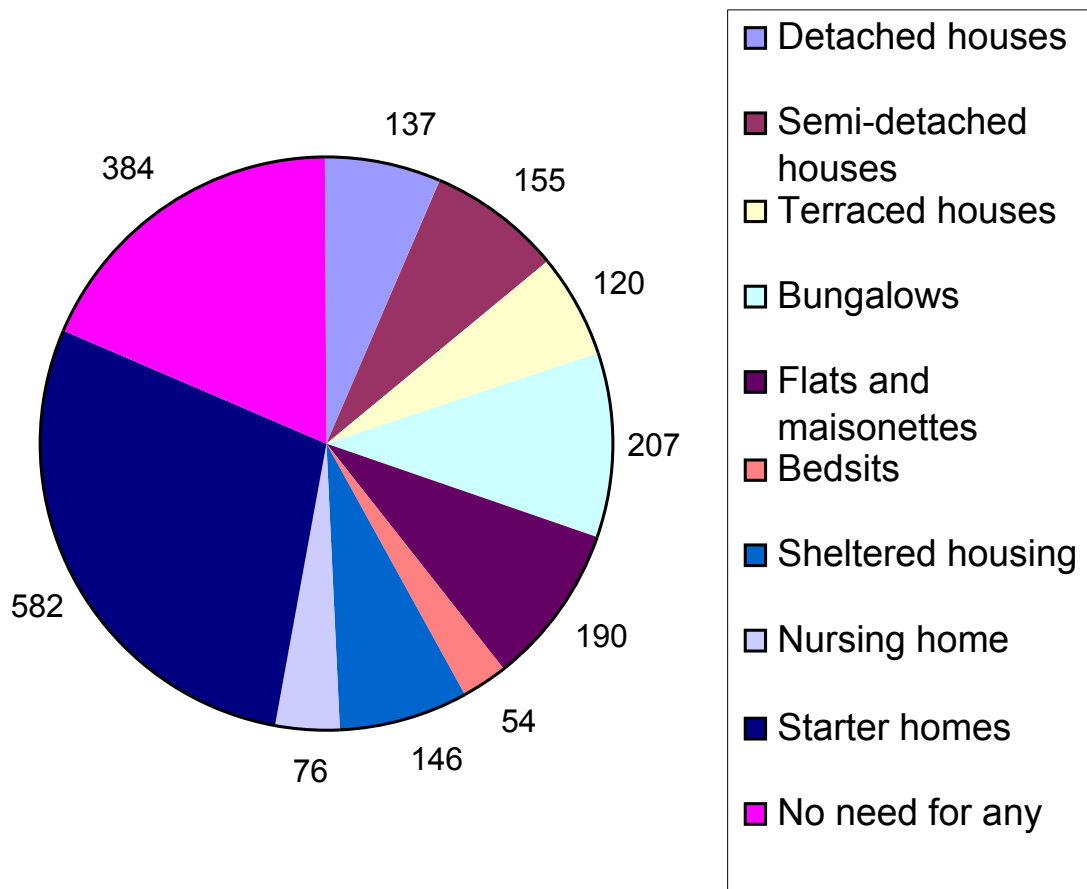

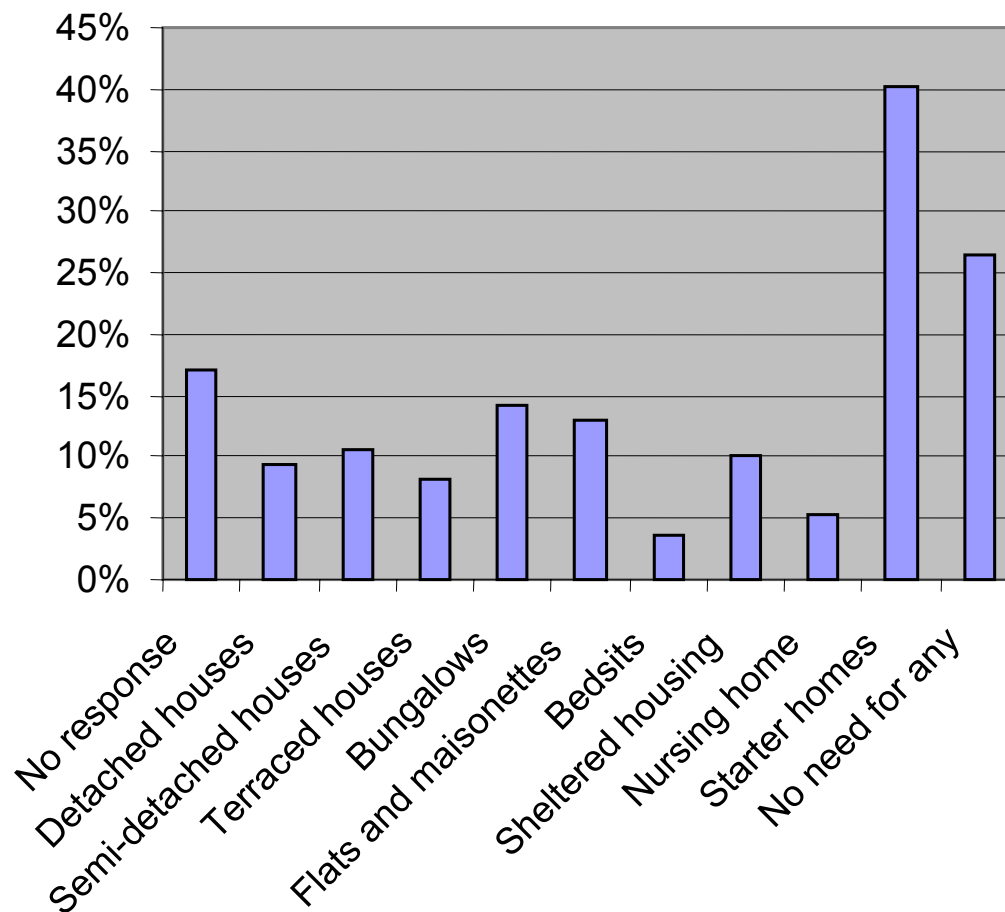

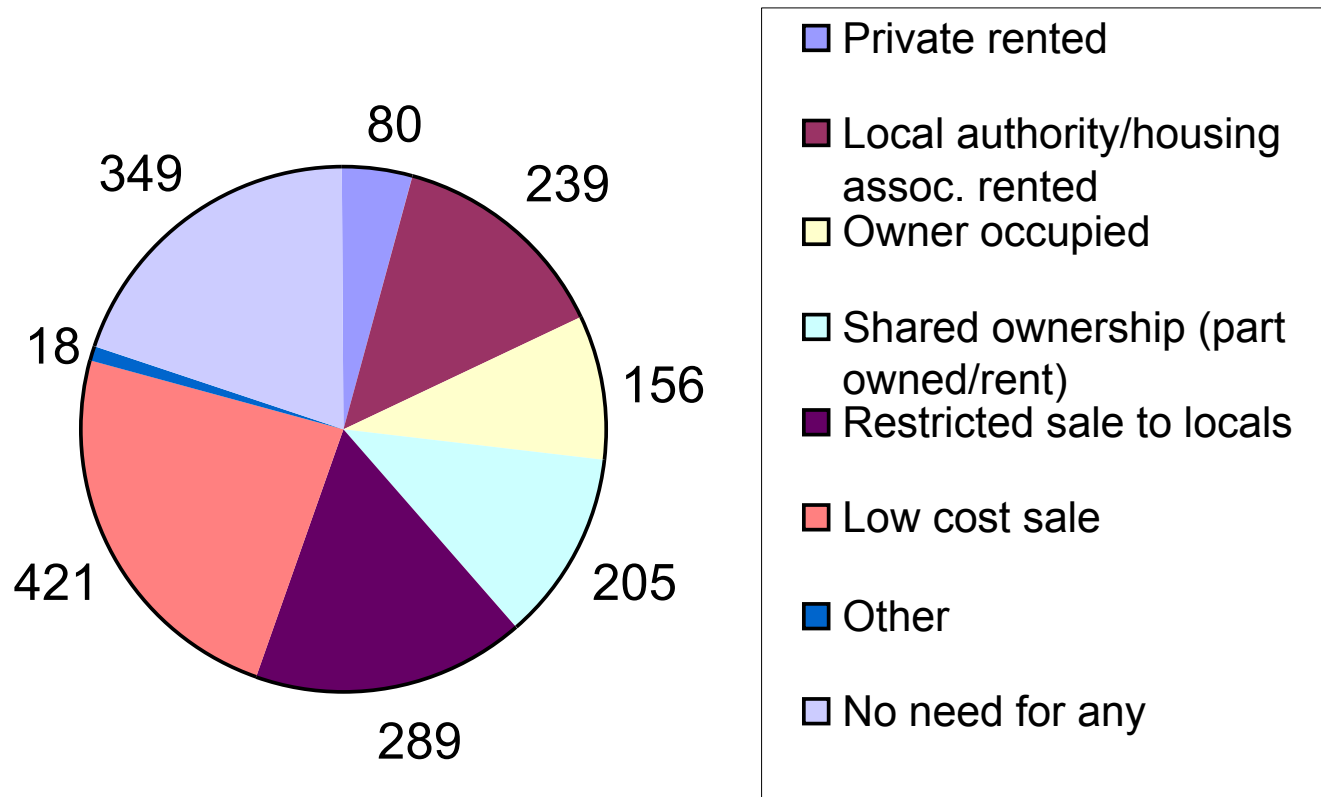
Q30: What type of new homes are needed in Comberton? (N=1201)



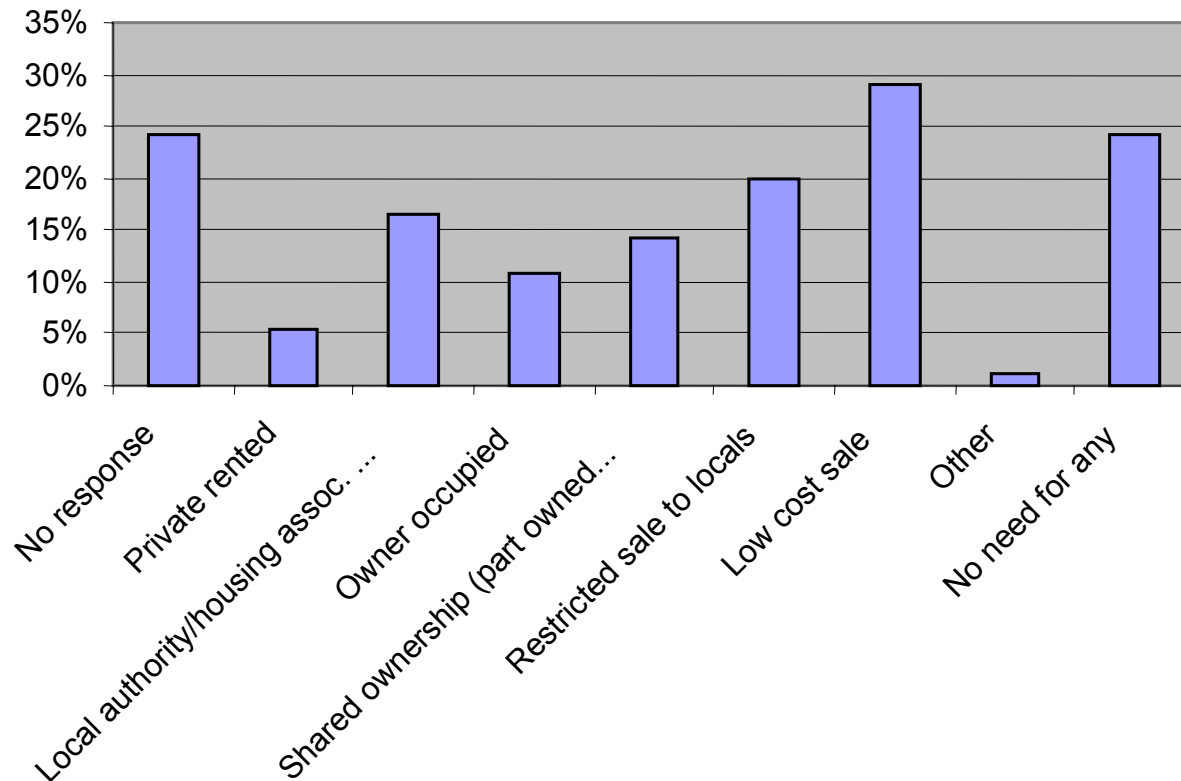

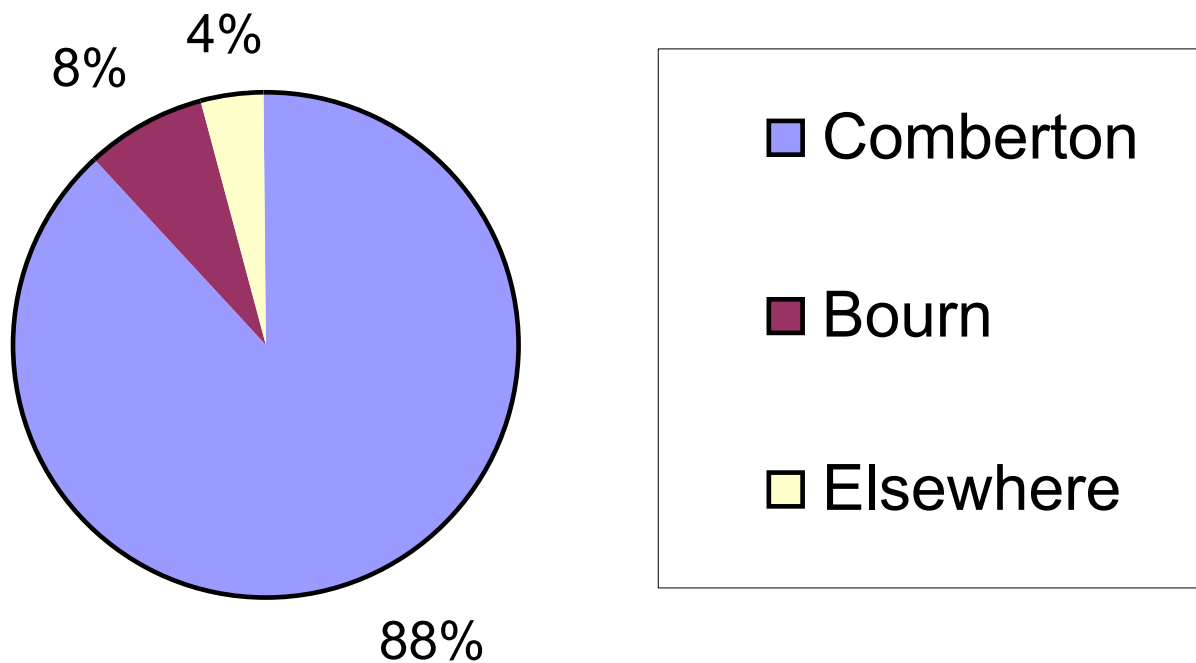
Q31: Is there a need for more accommodation of the following type in Comberton? (N=1101)



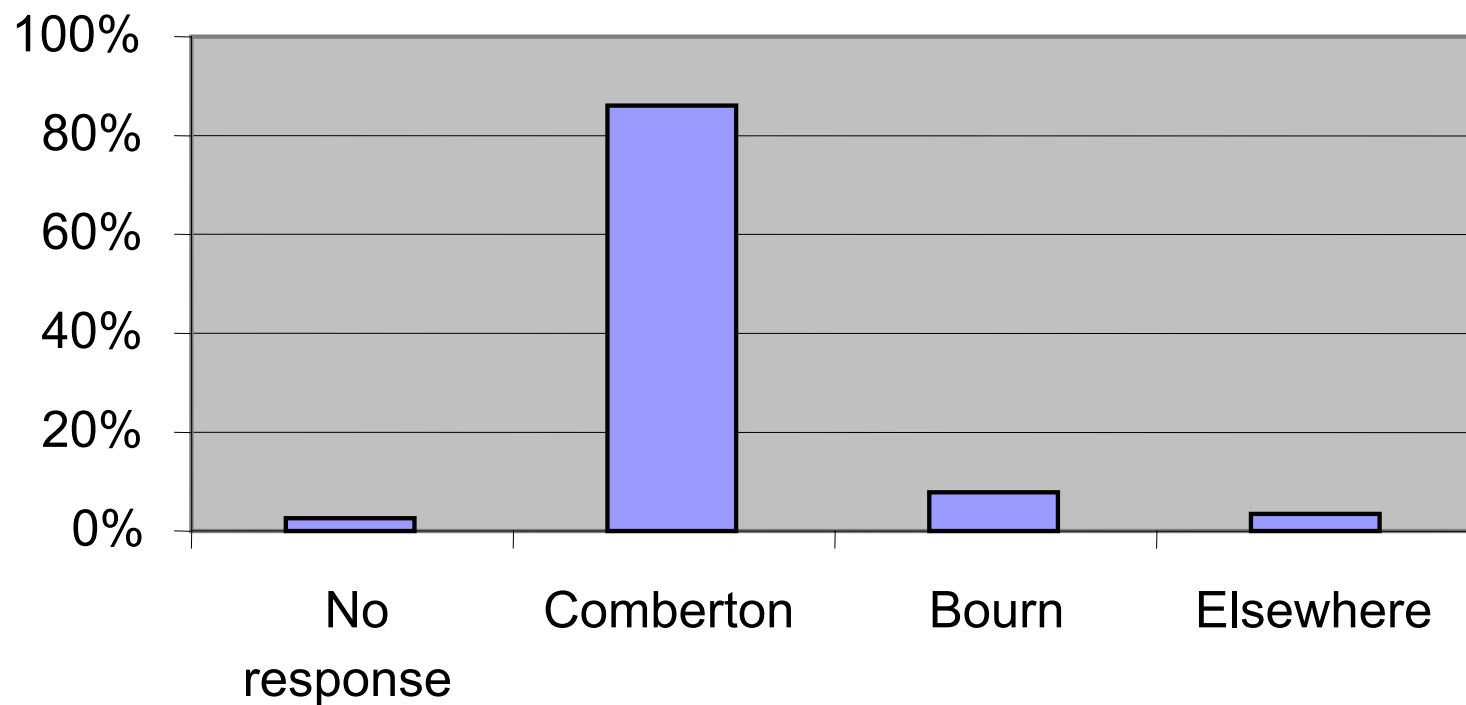

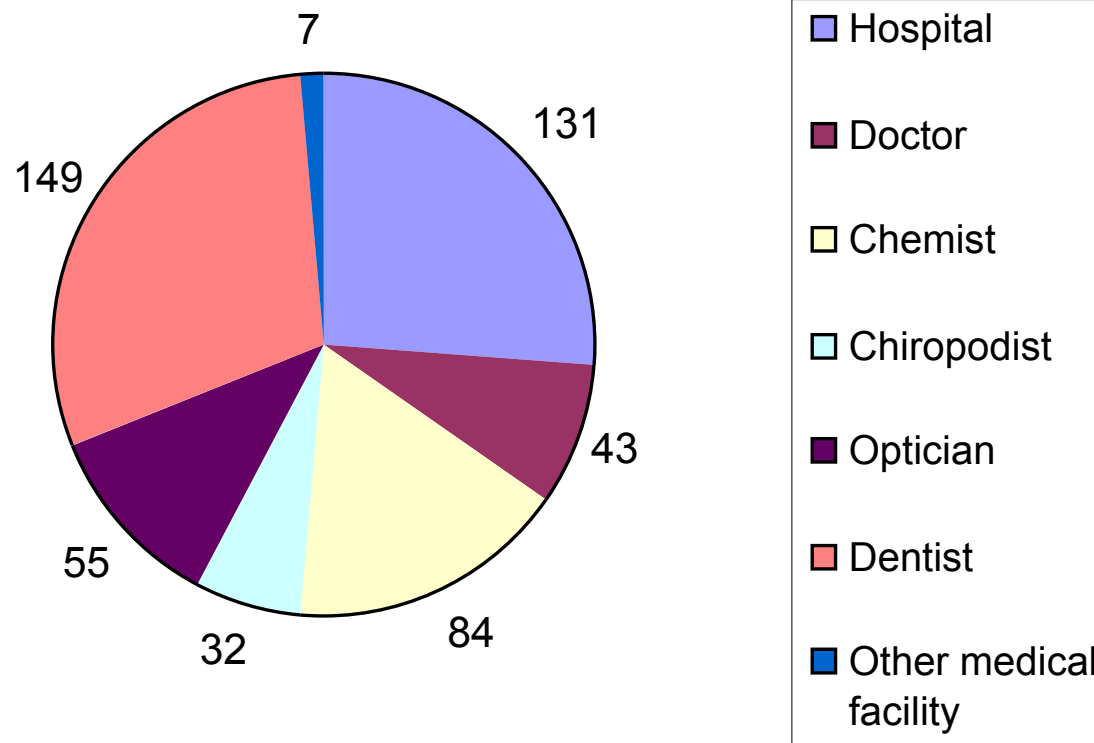

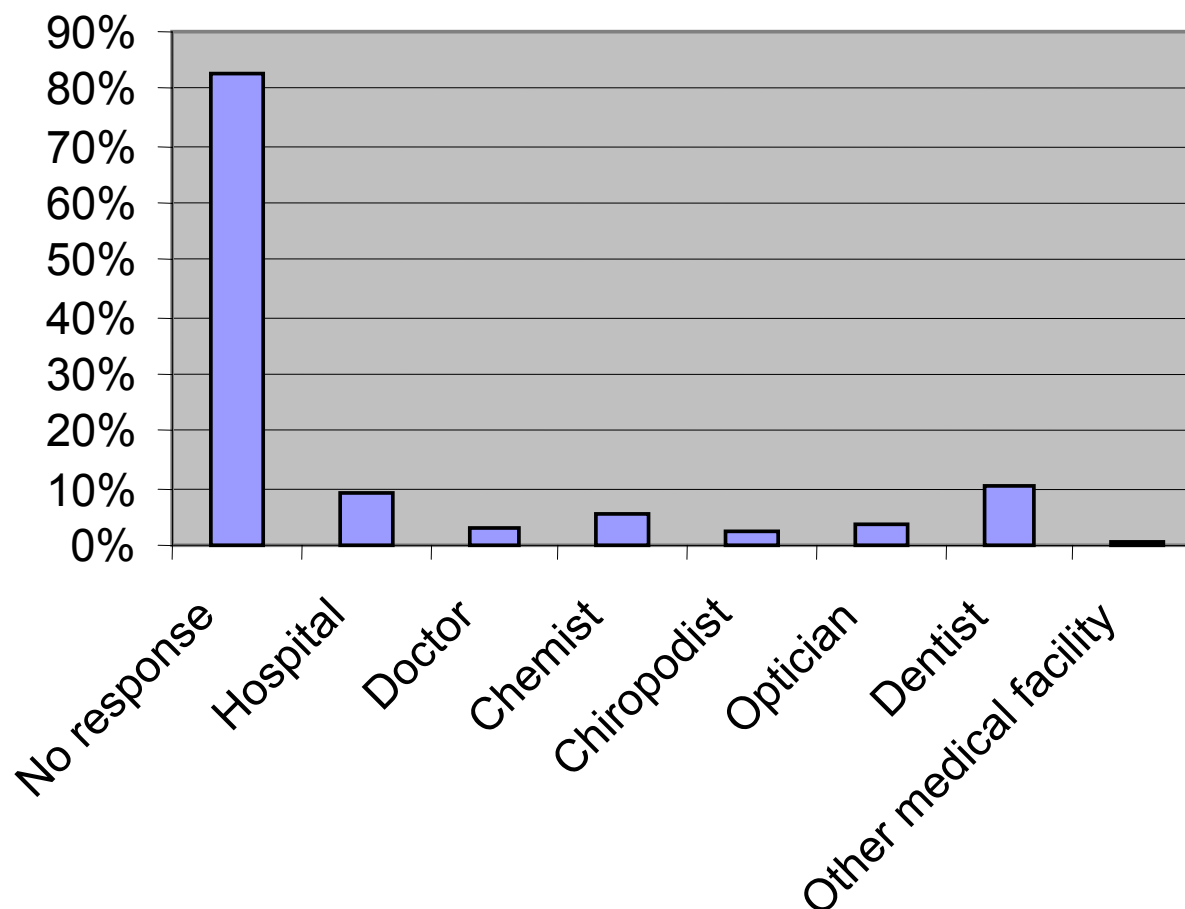

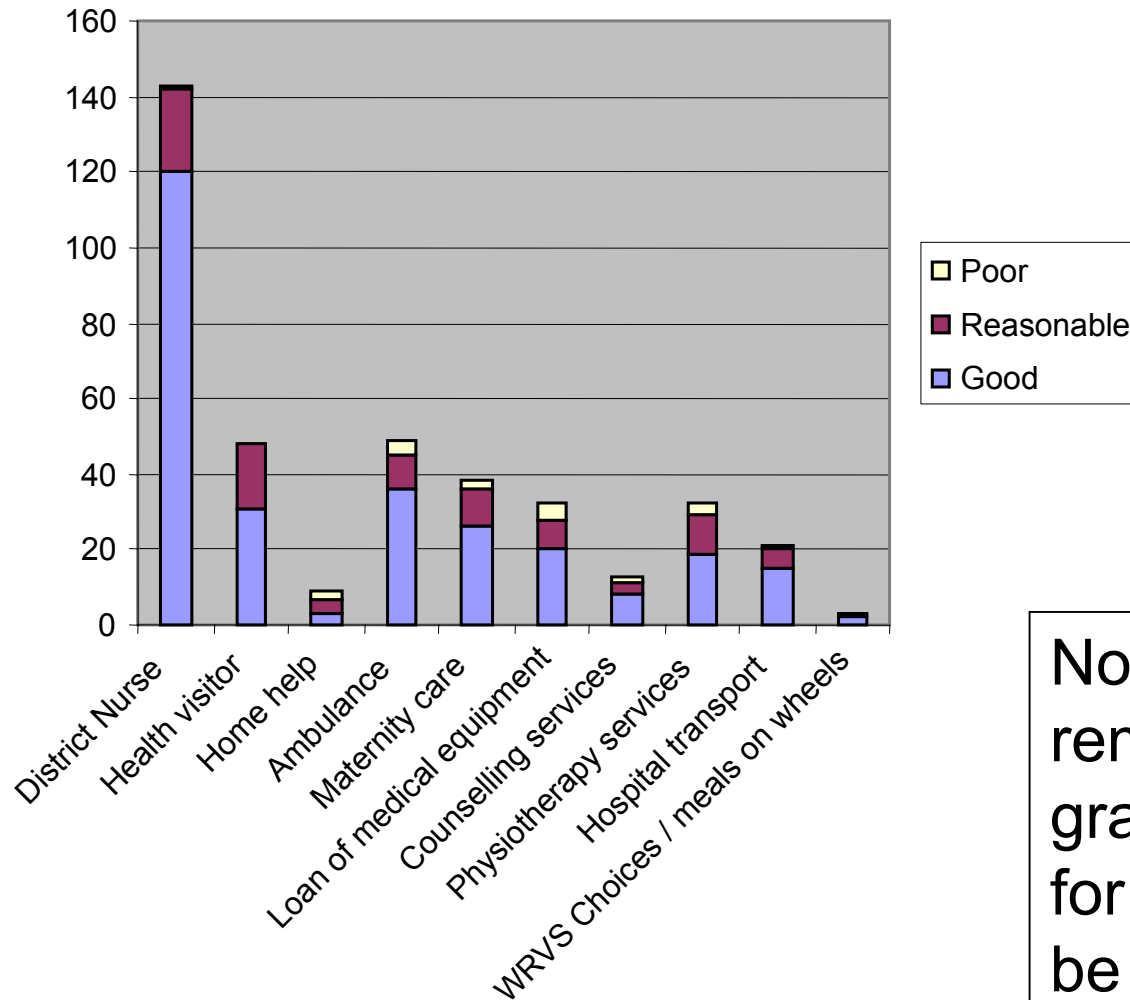

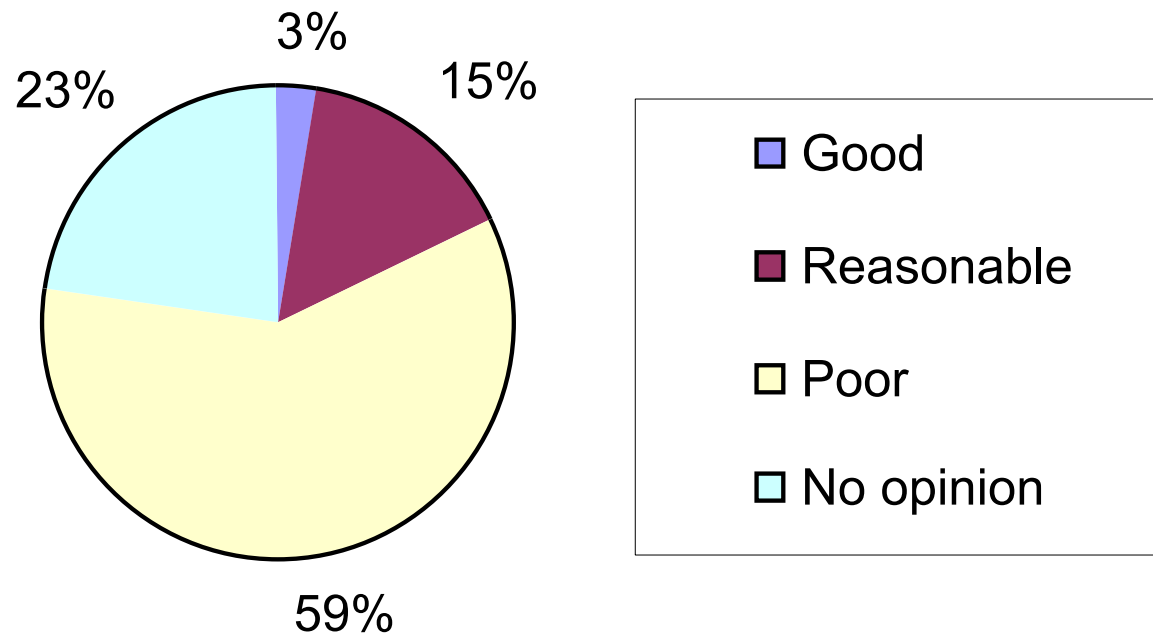

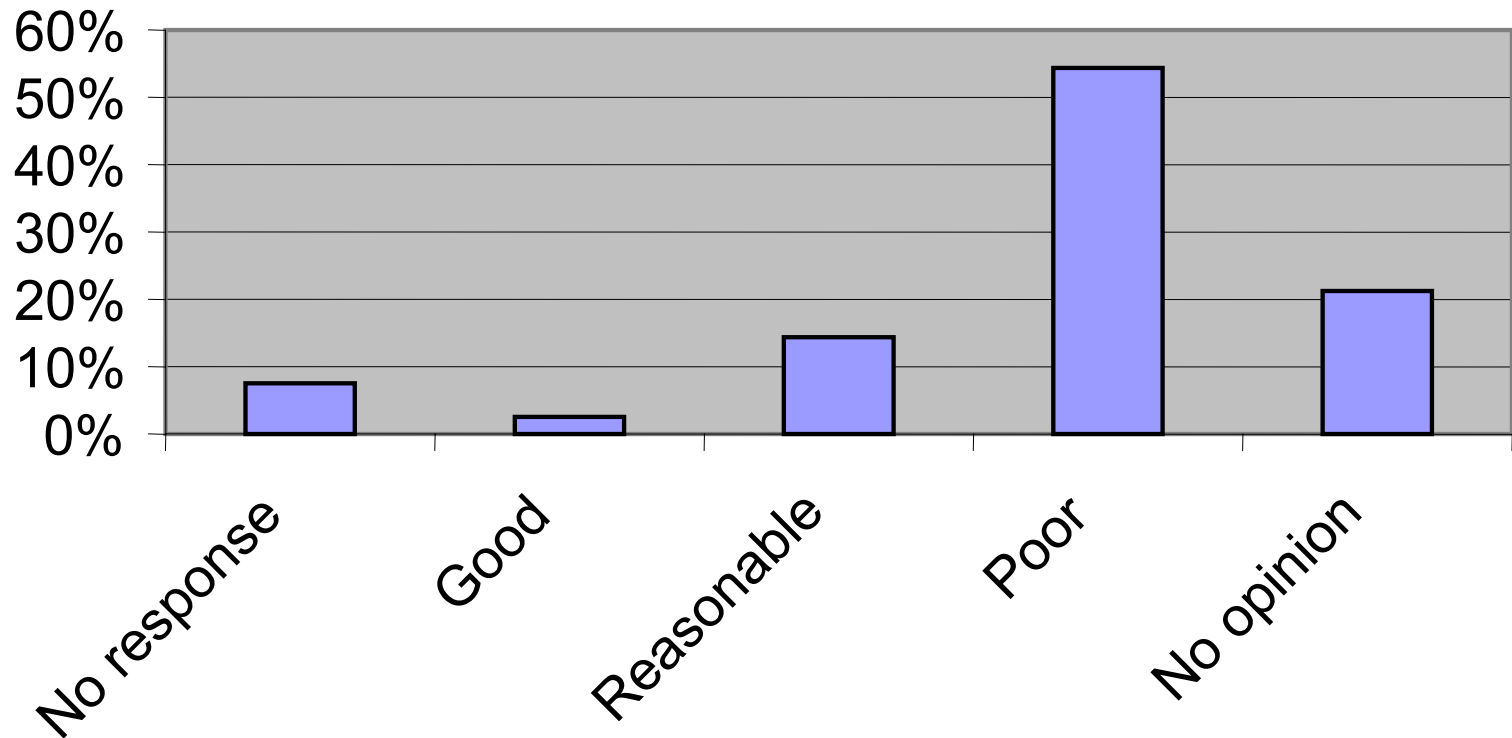

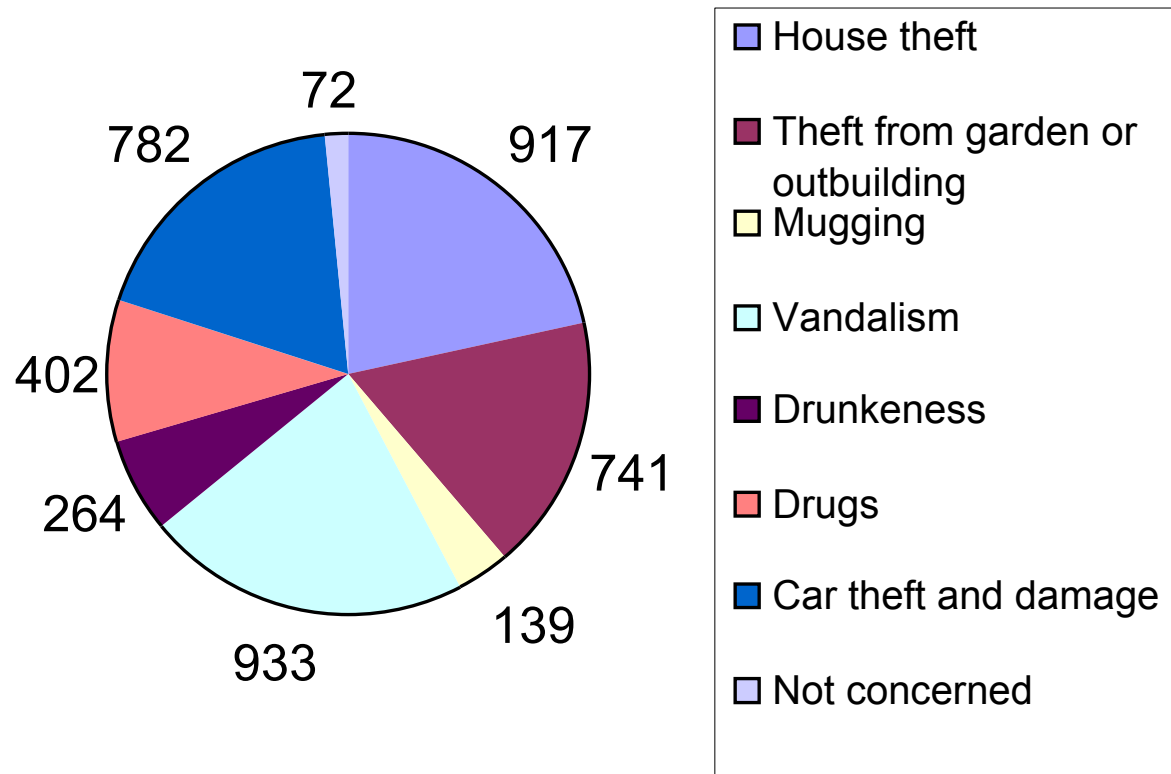

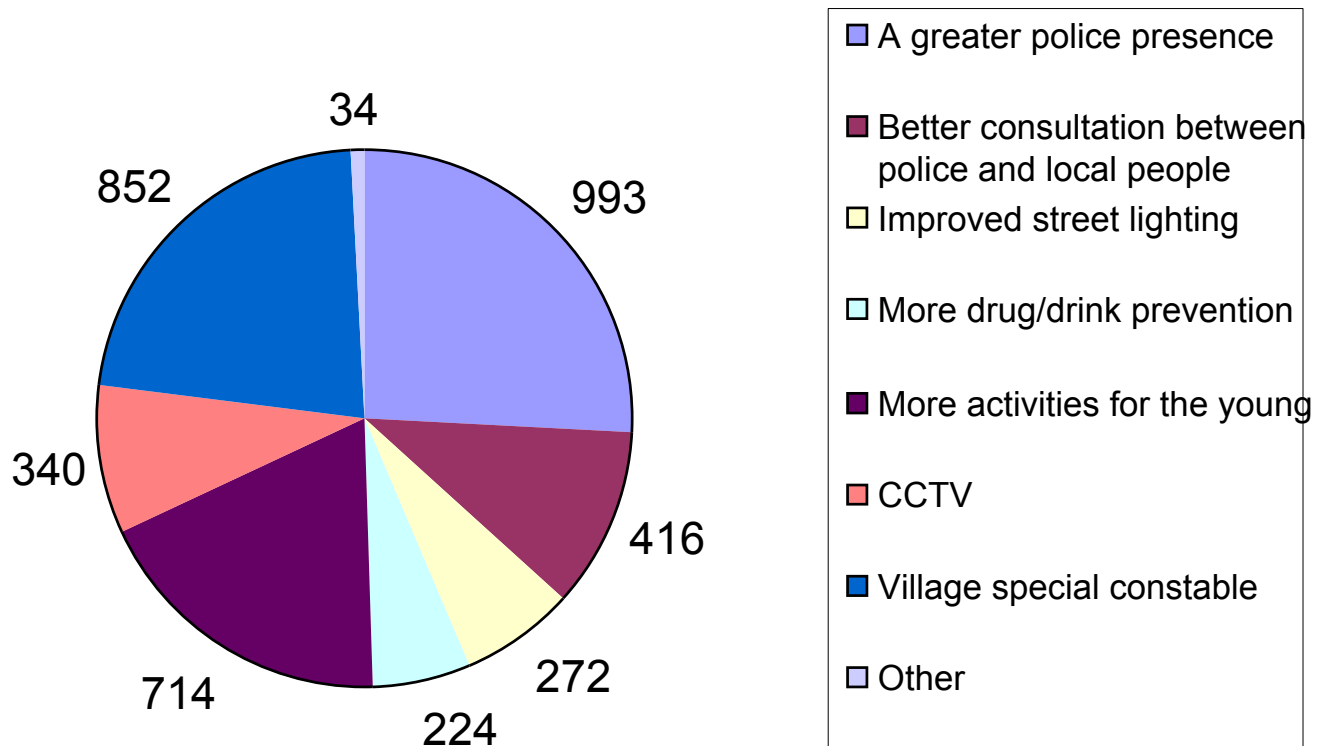
Q37: Which, if any of the following crimes and anti-social behaviour concern you in Comberton? (N=1317)



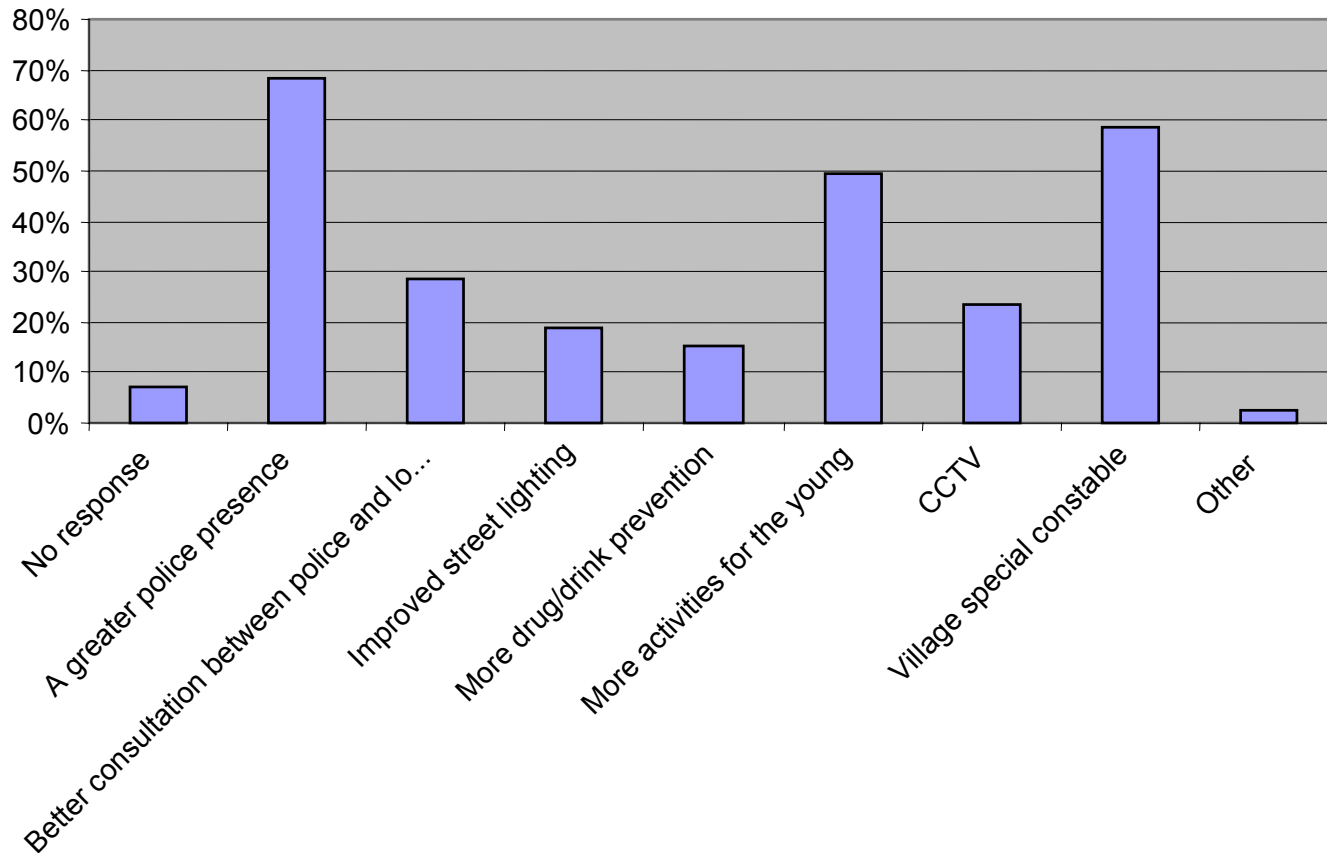

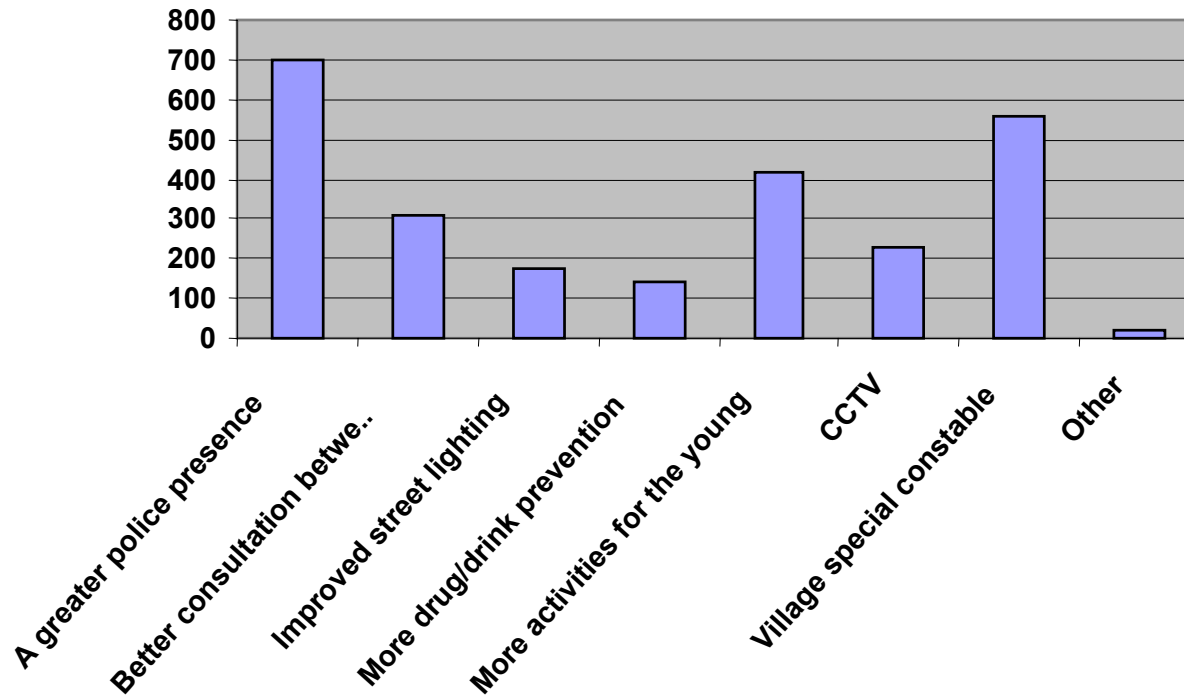
Q38: Do you think that any of the following measures are needed in order to reduce crime? (N=1305)

Q39 Measures to Reduce Crime 1 - Police

- Local policeman (with local home) (7 respondents)
- Improved response to crime and 999 calls (4)
- General increase in policing levels (2)

- More active investigation of crime, rather than logging the crime, then ignoring it (2)
- Investigation and prosecution of even minor vandalism (2)
- Recognition that the village may have to pay for decrease in crime levels (2)
- Targeted patrols (e.g. recreation ground for drugs) (1)

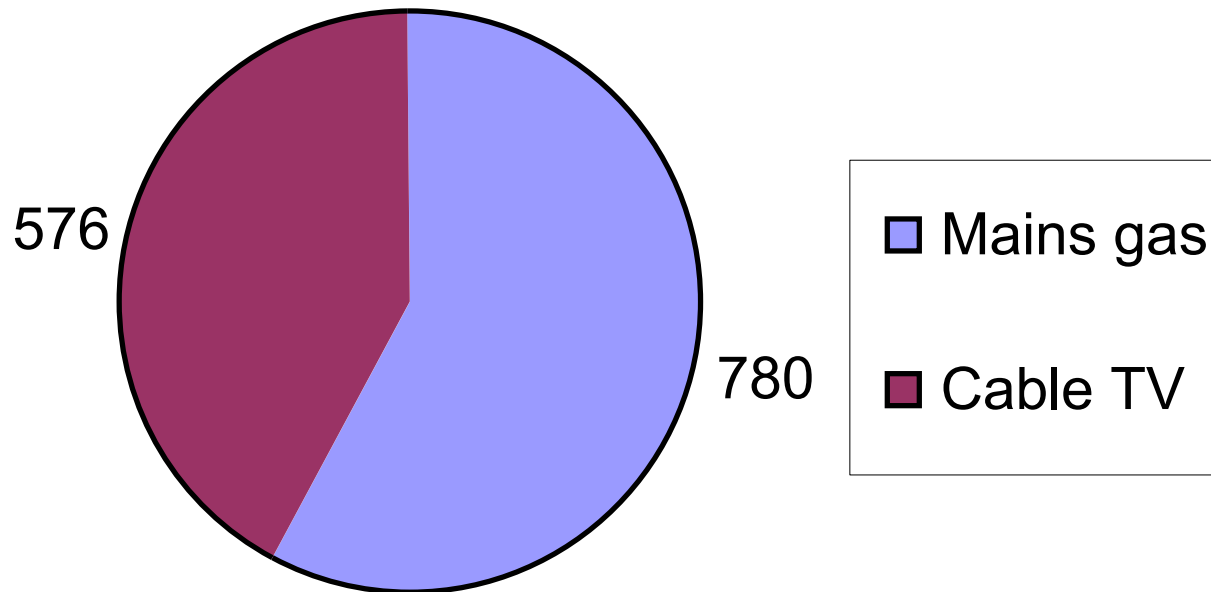

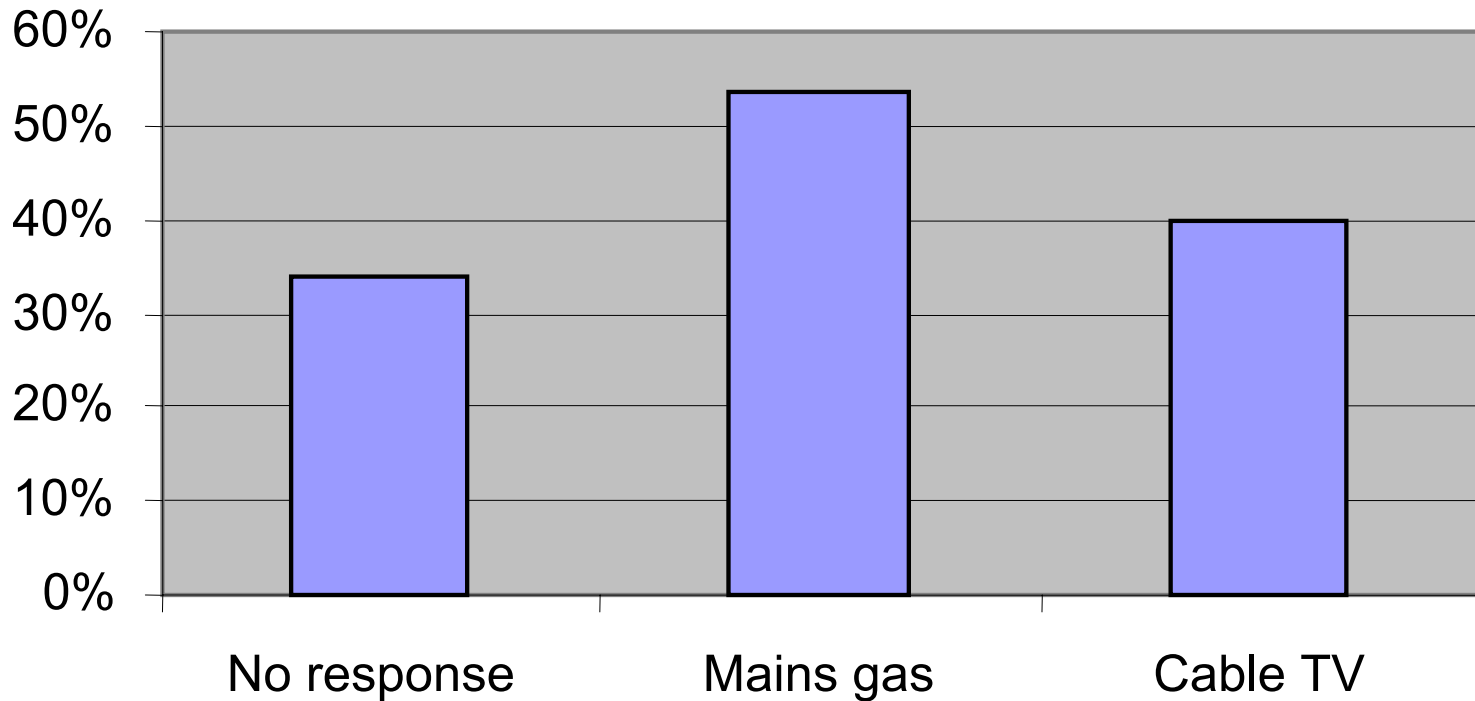

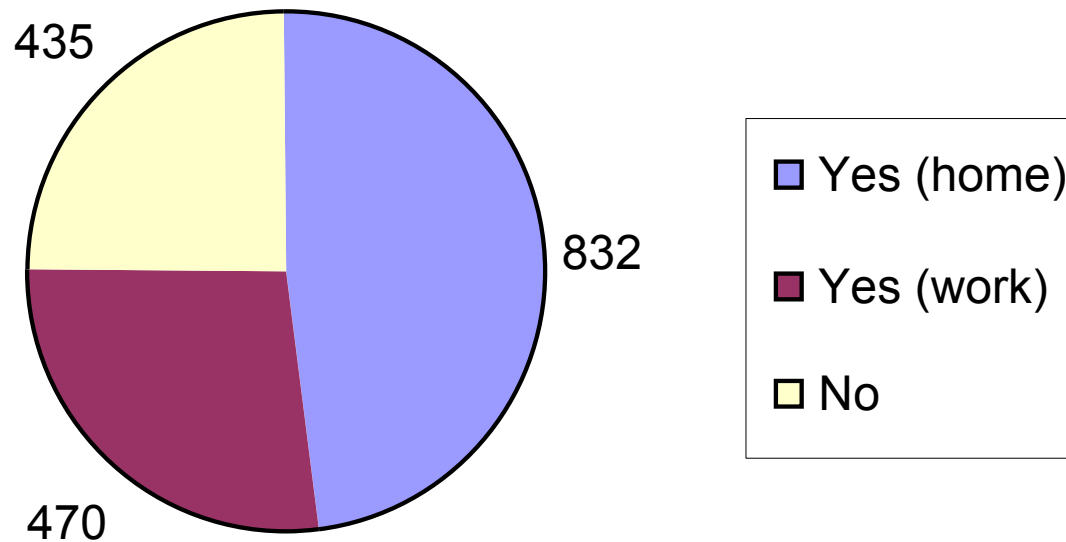

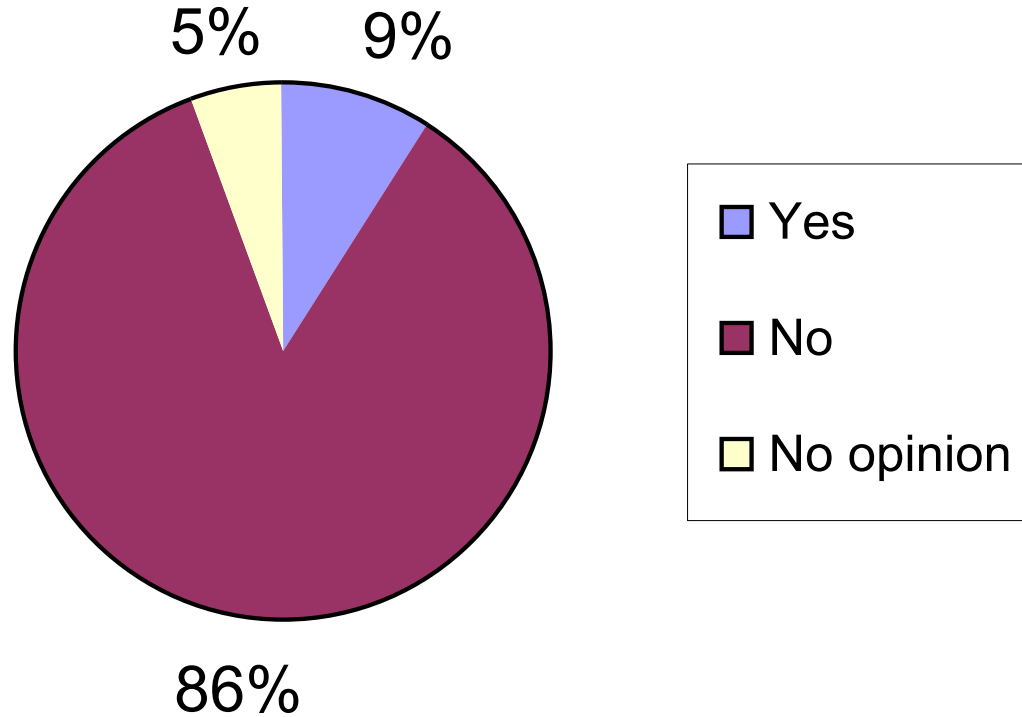

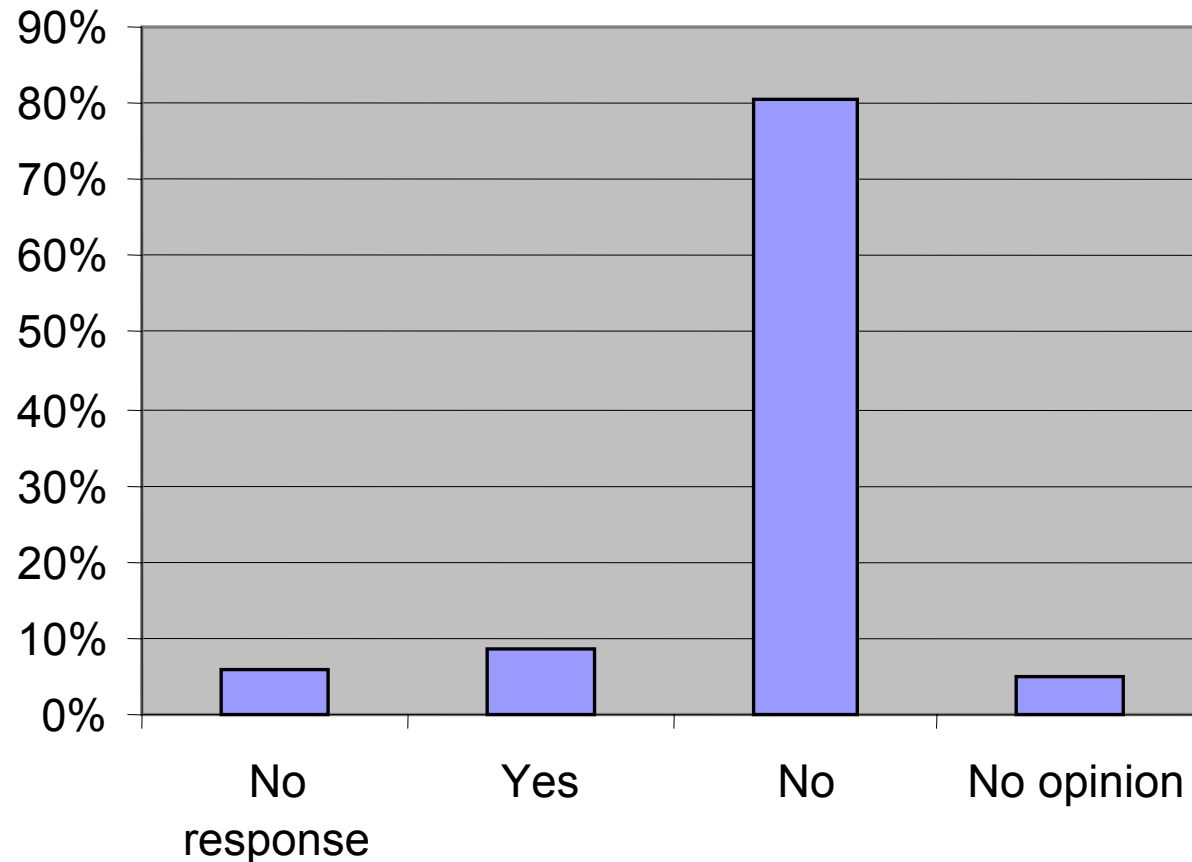

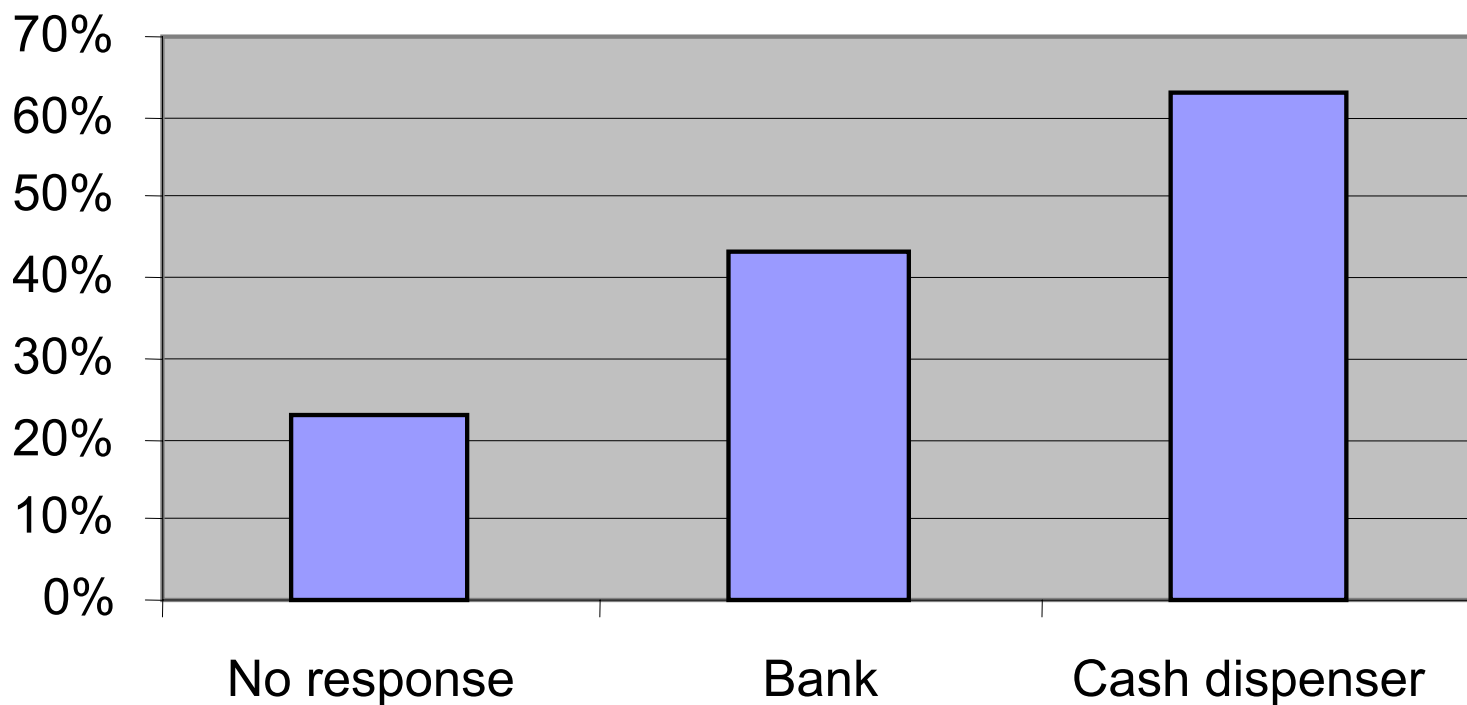

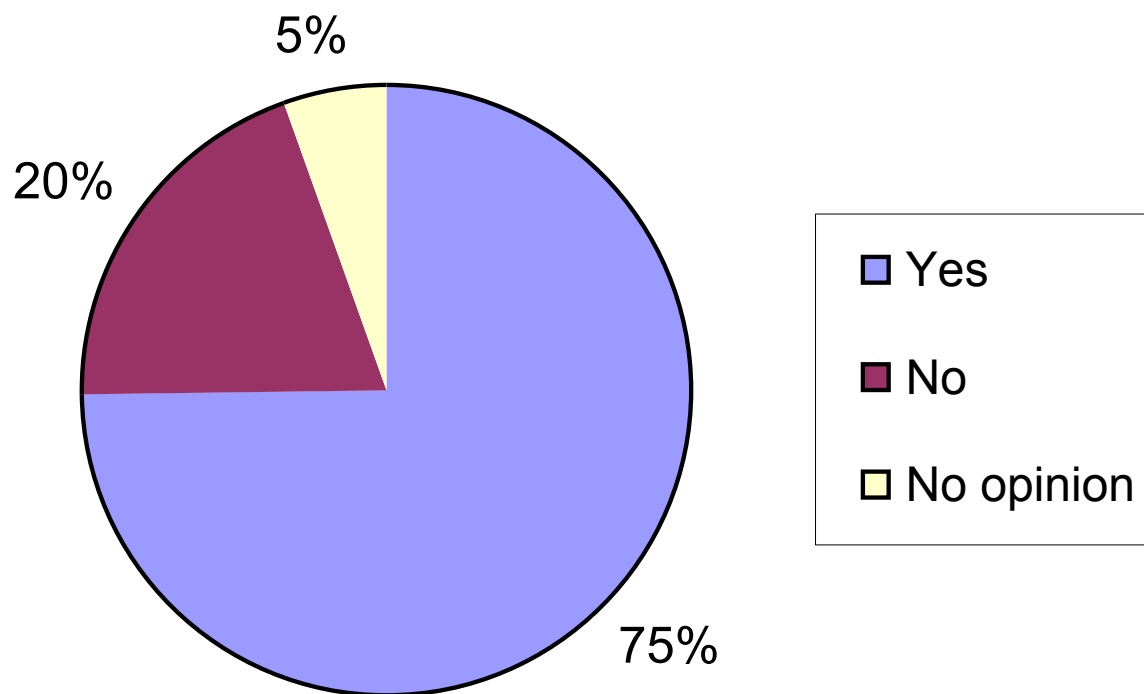

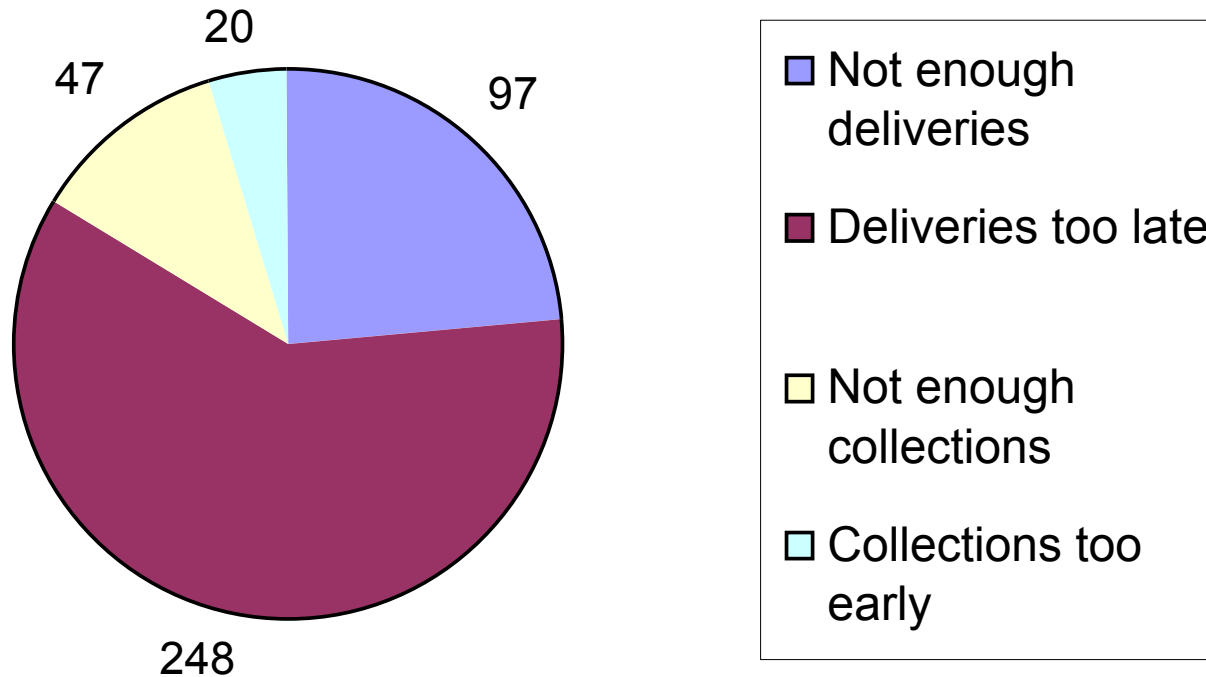

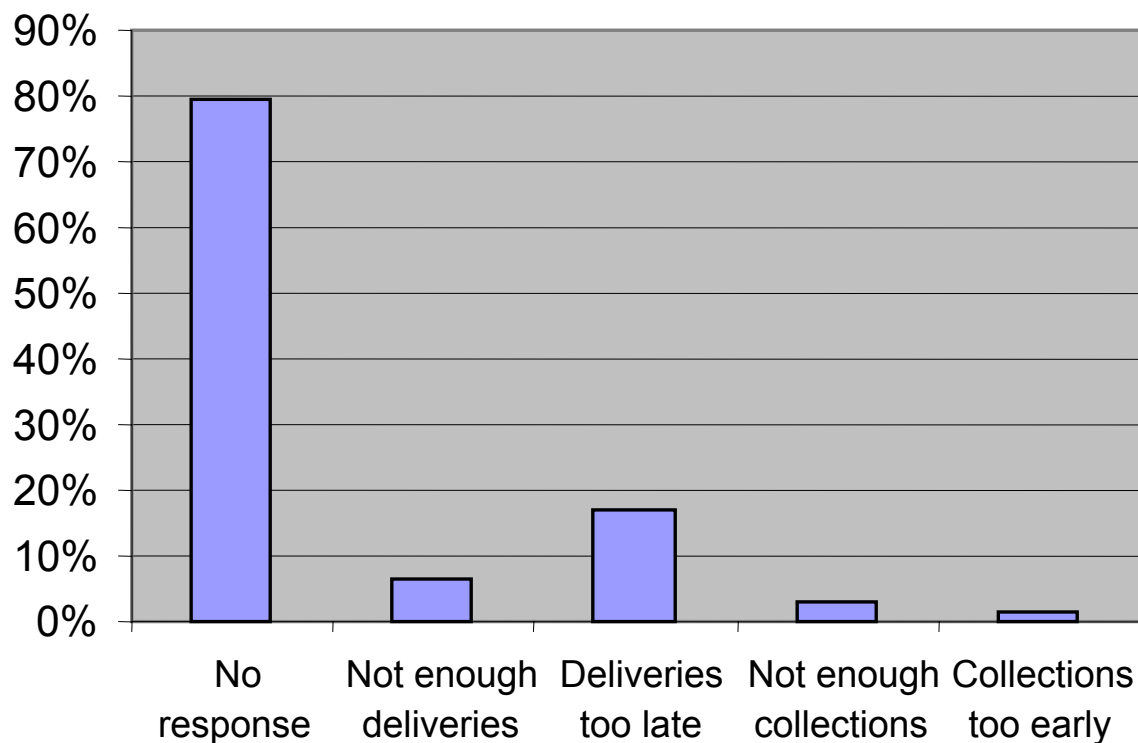

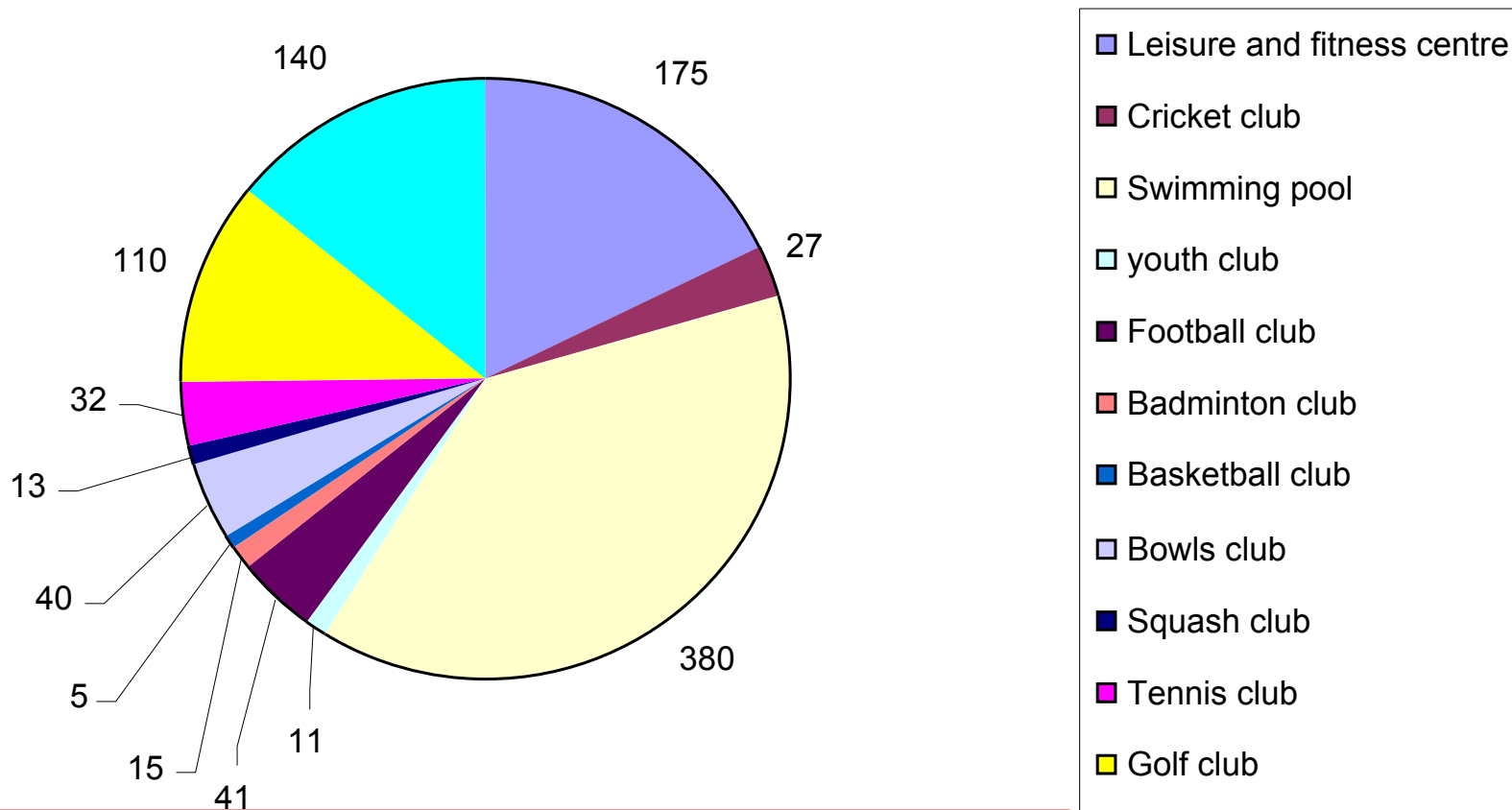

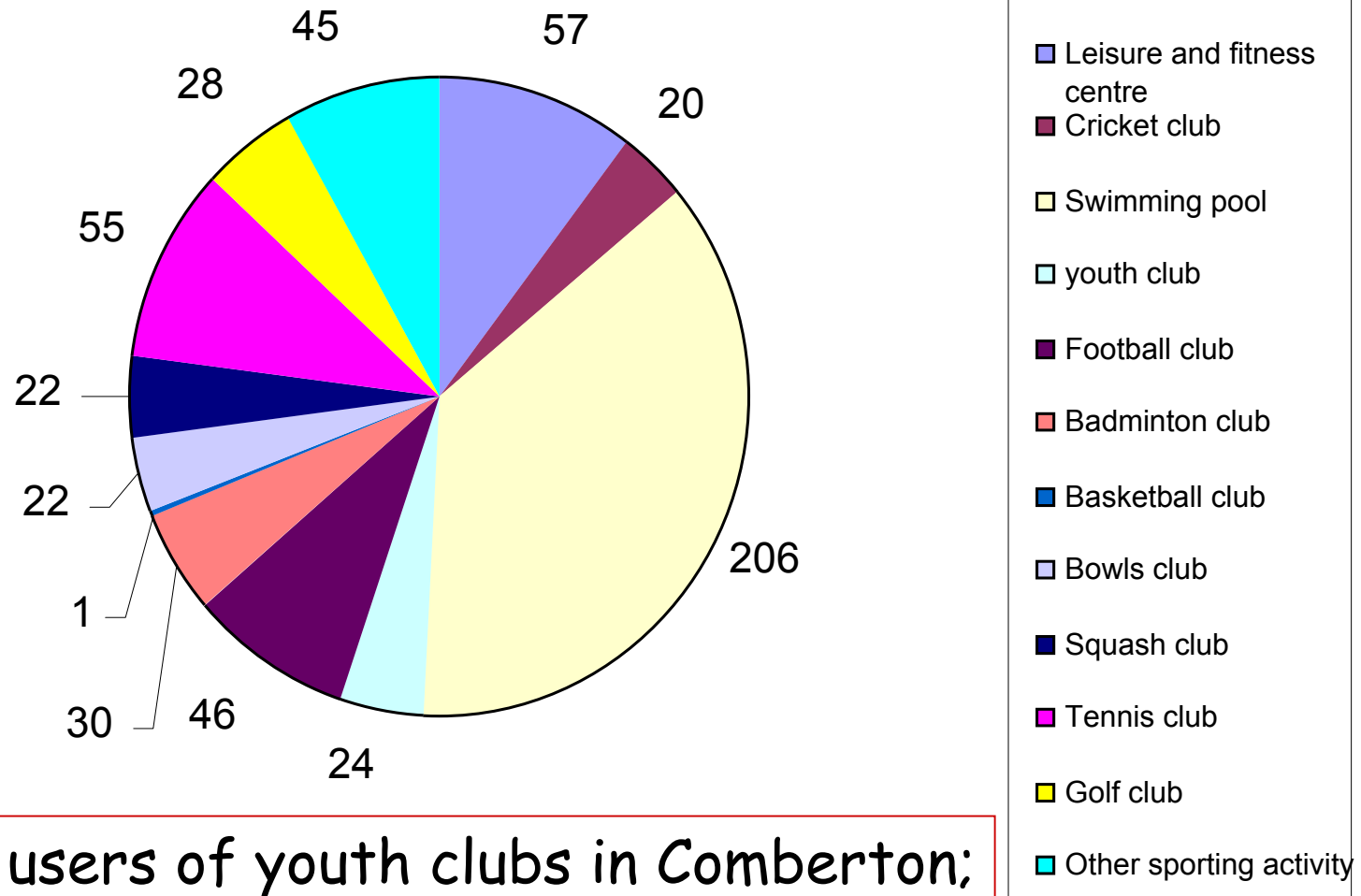


Q48: Which sports clubs/activities do you attend outside Comberton? (N=665)

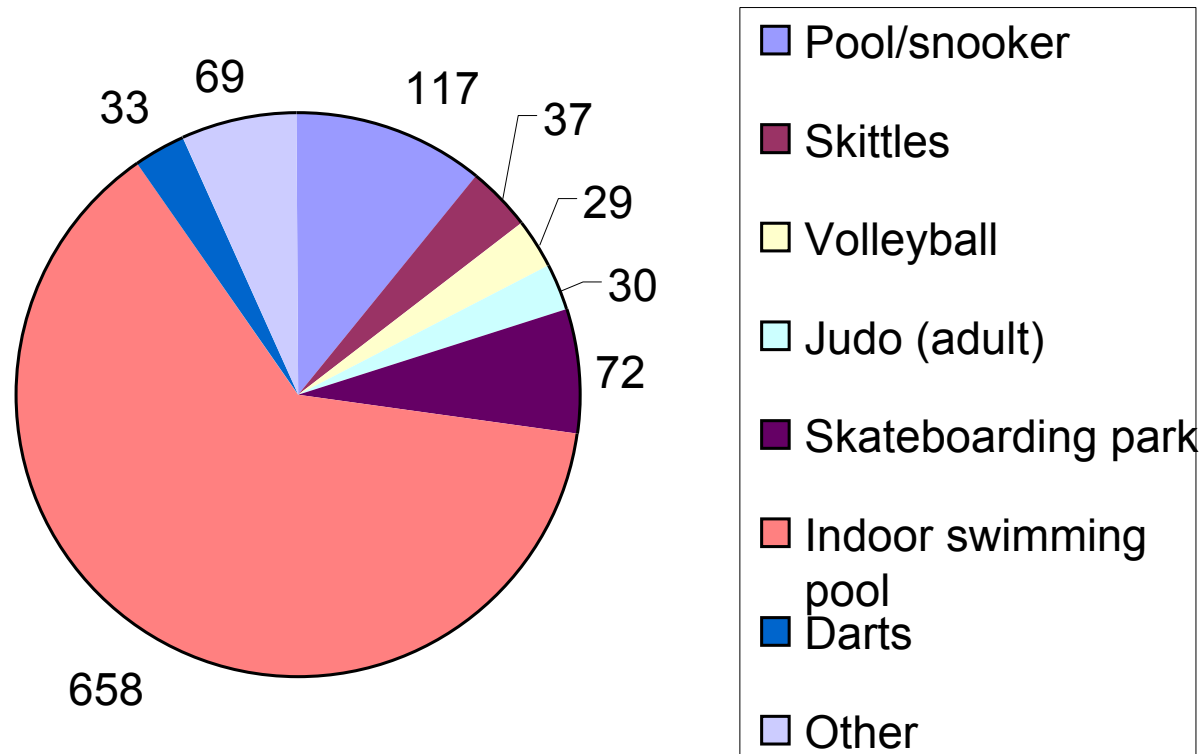

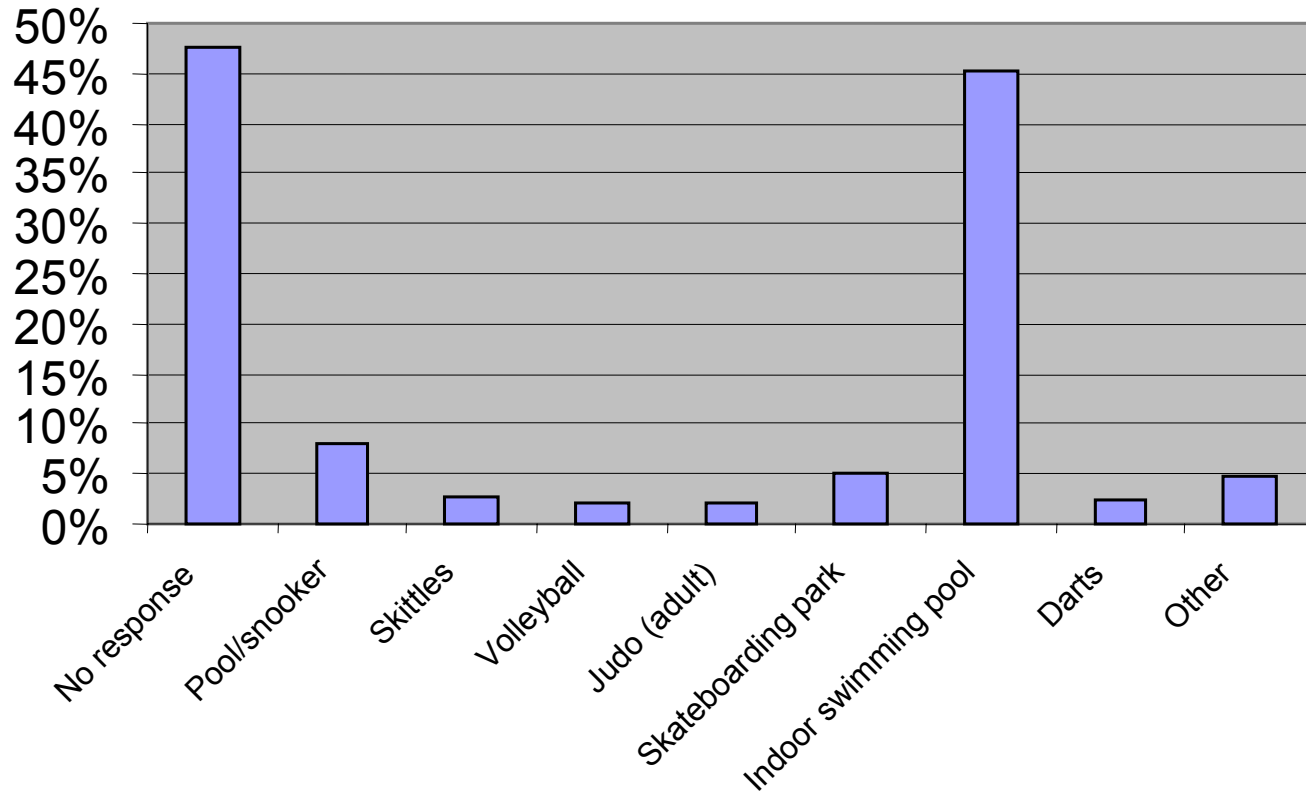

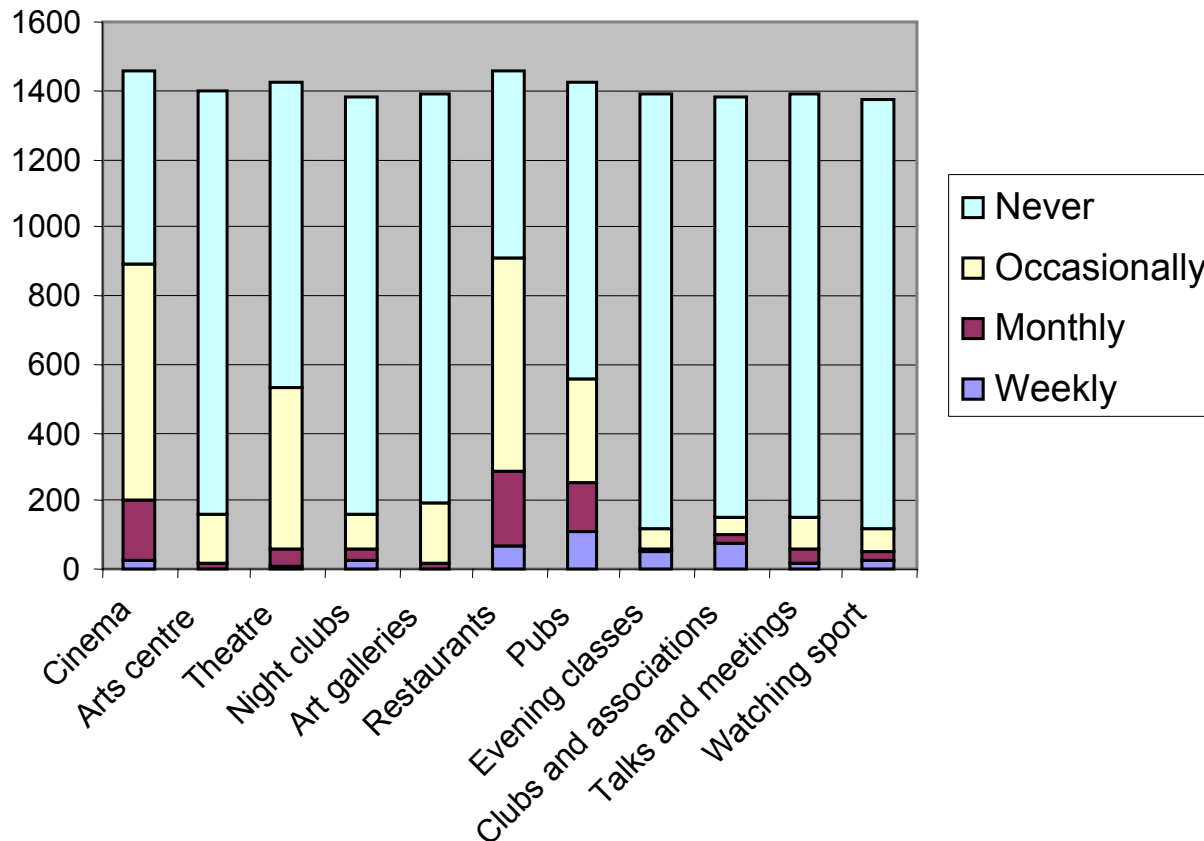

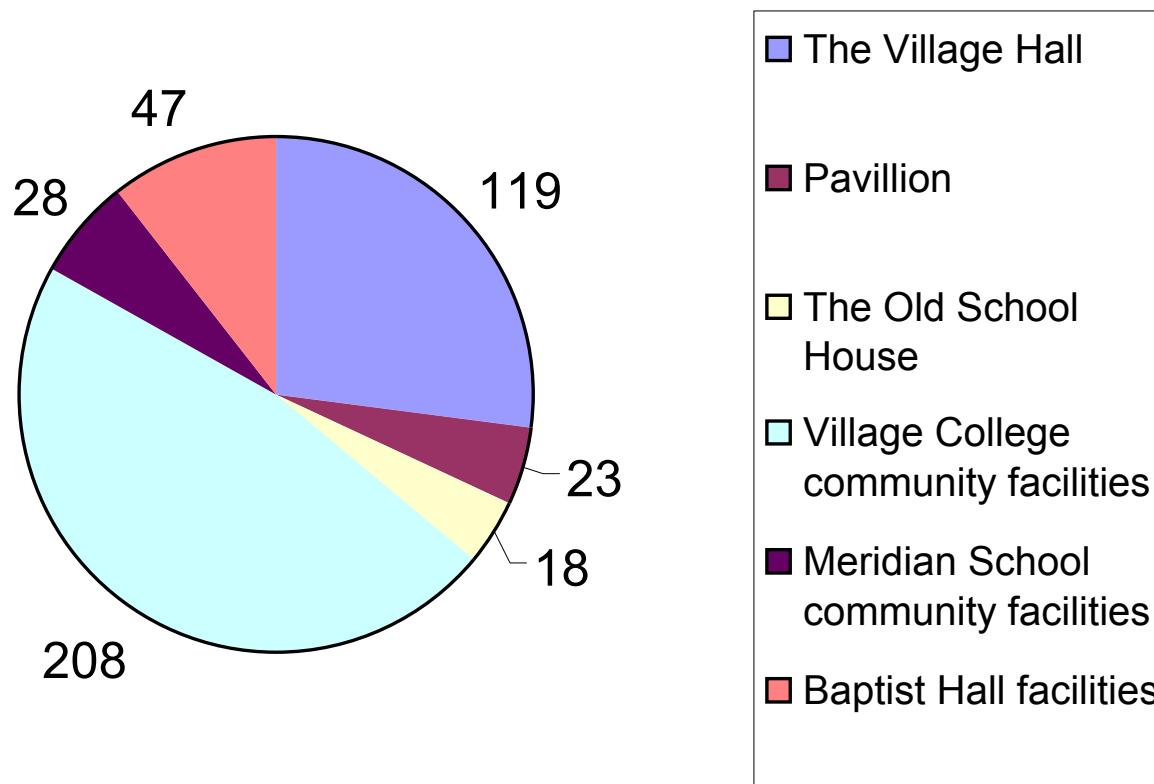

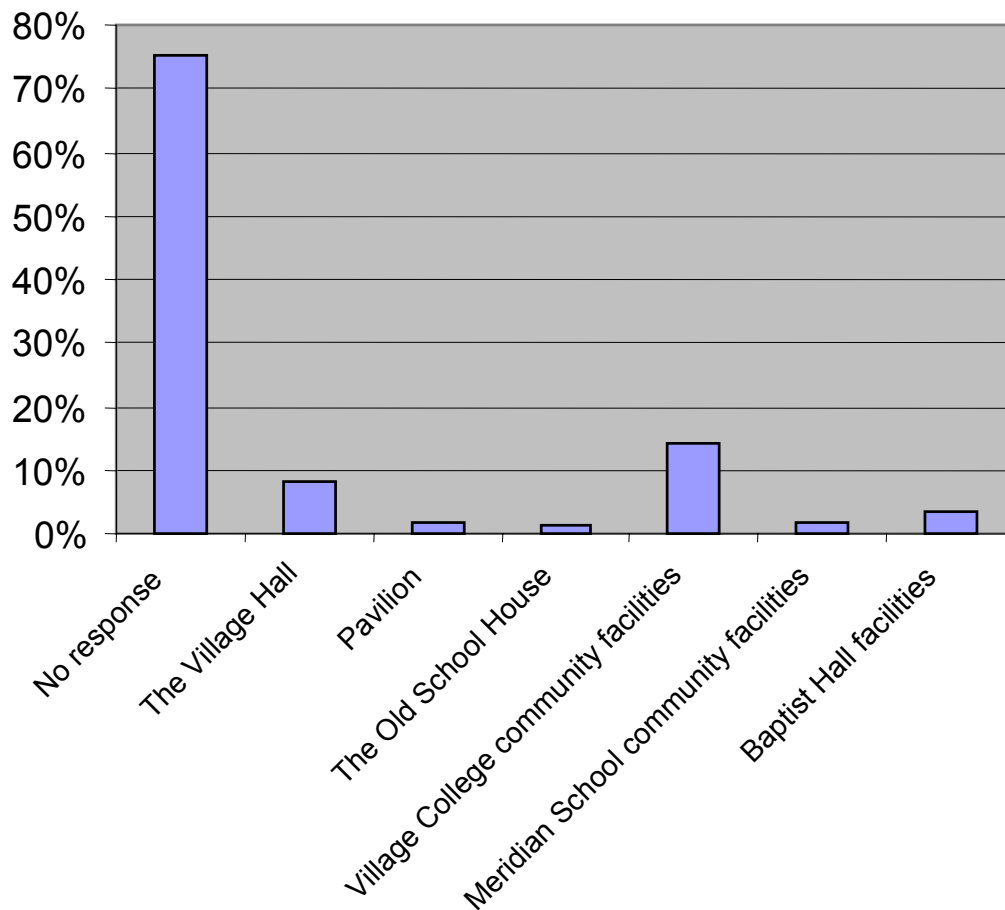

Q55: Do you use the following at least once a month? (N=361)



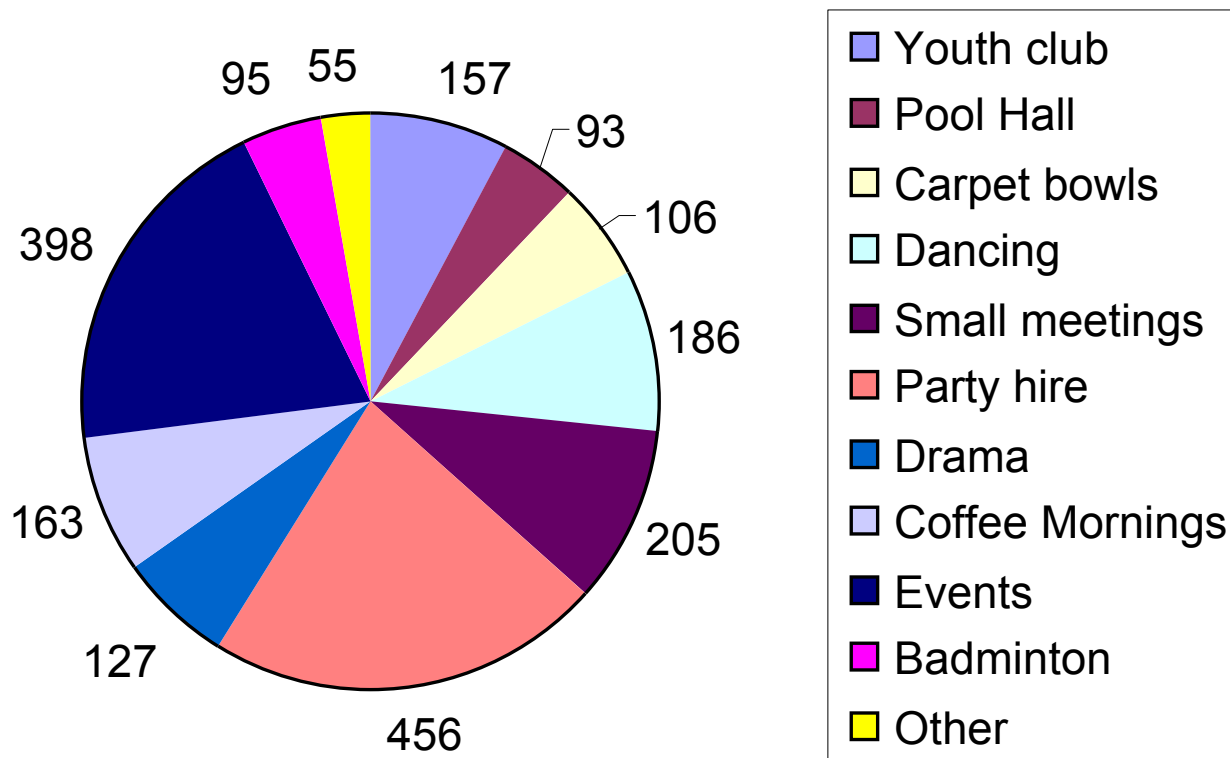

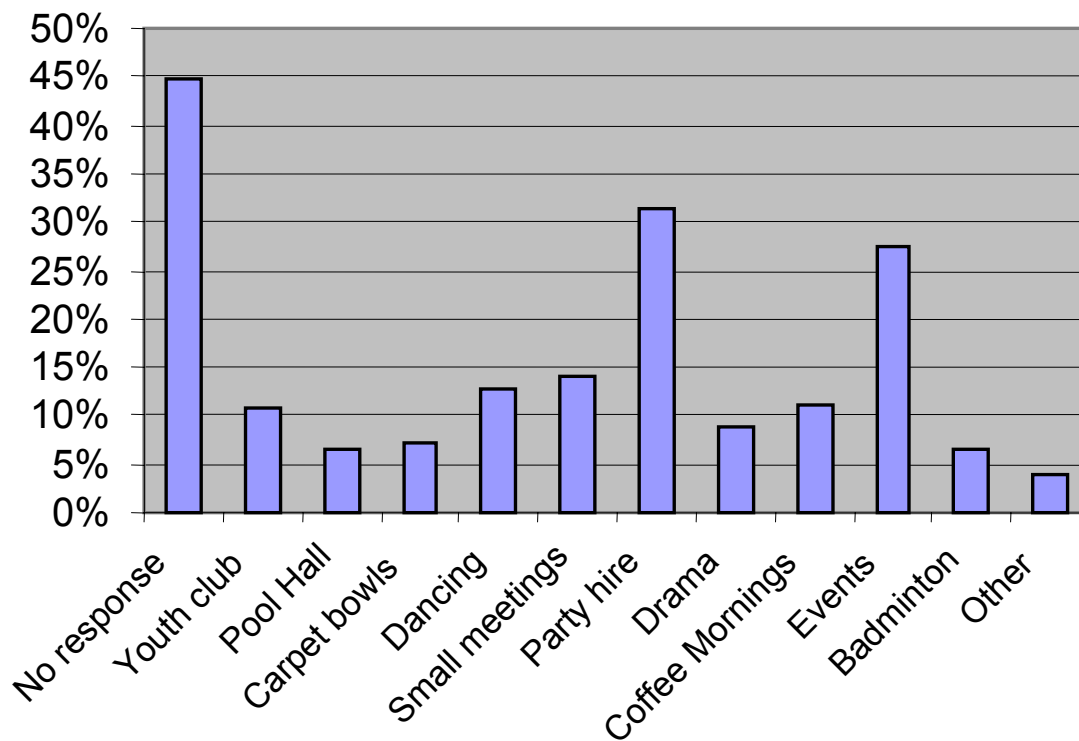

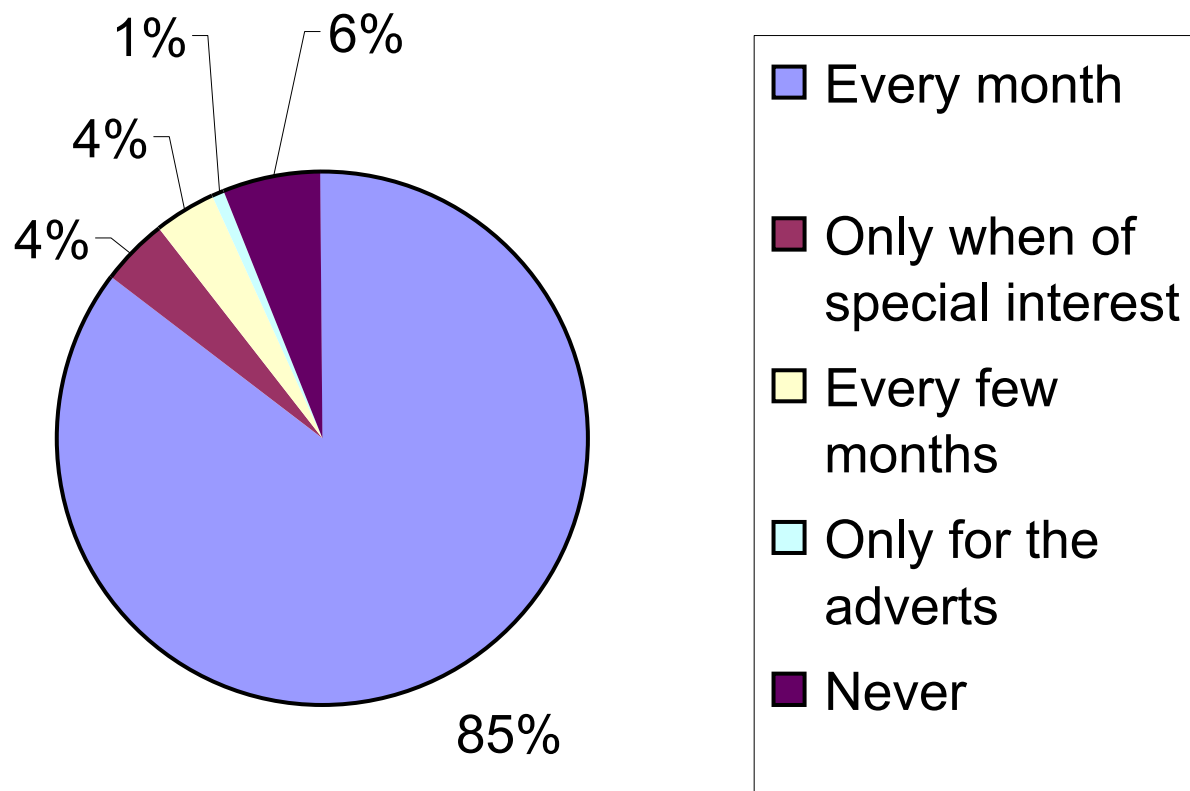

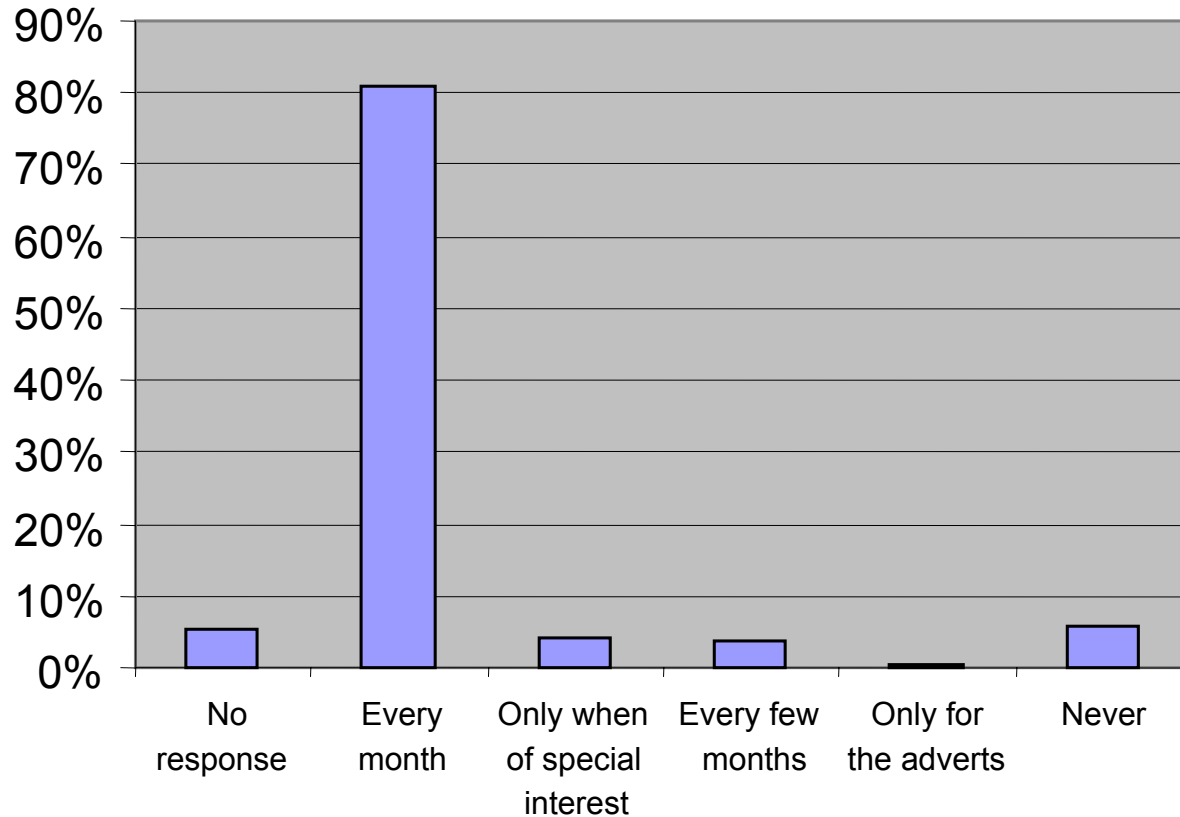

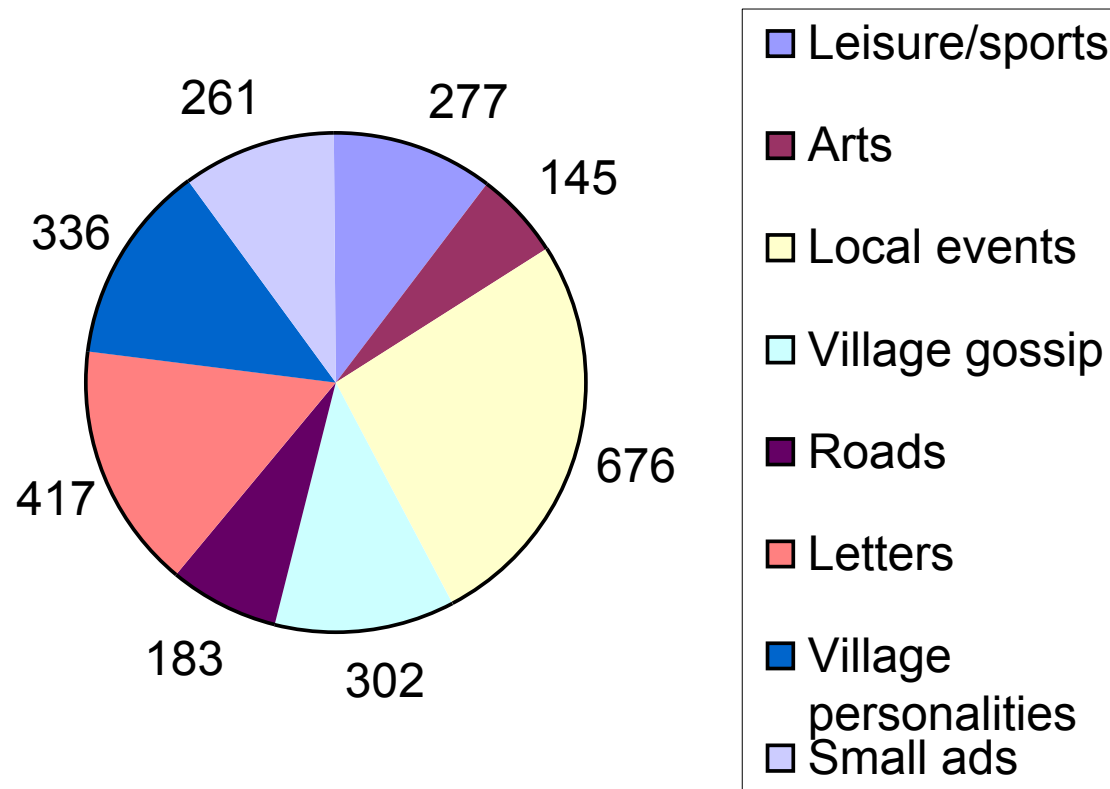
Q58: How often do you read Contact? (N=1371)



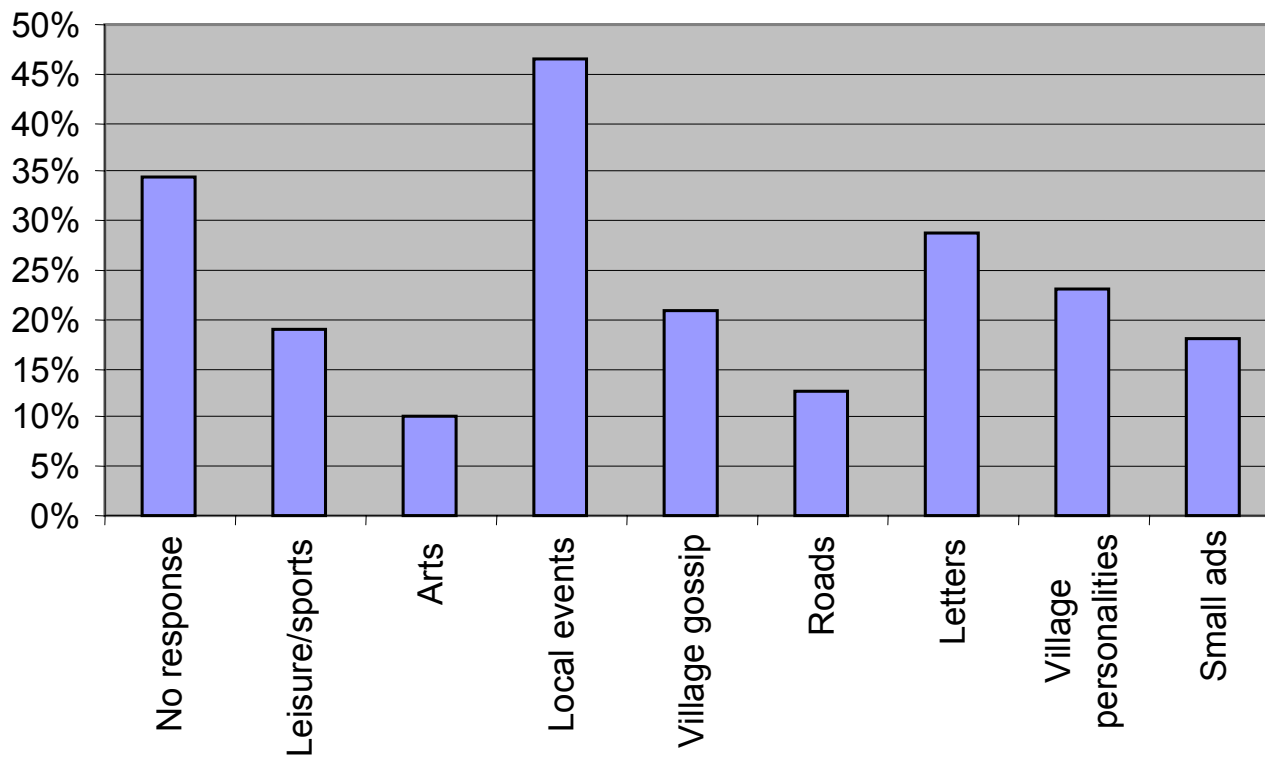

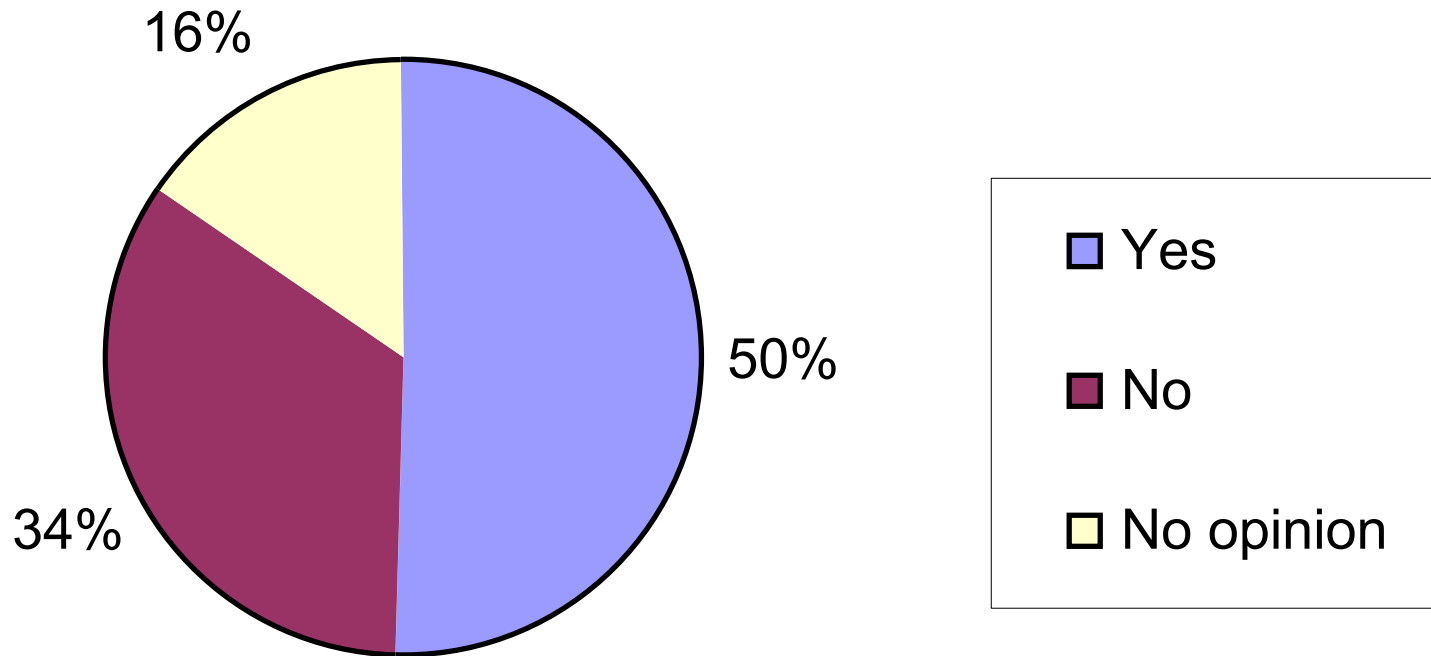
Q59: Do you think Contact should include more items on: (N=949)



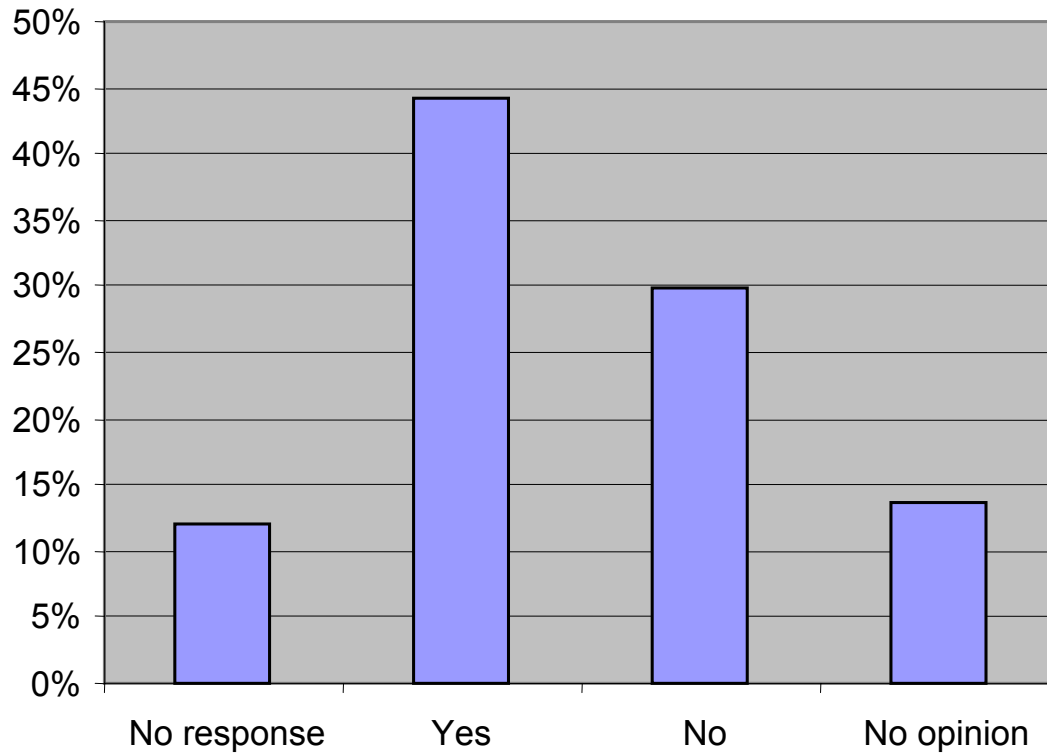

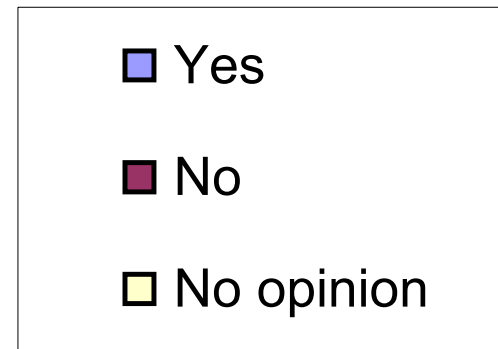

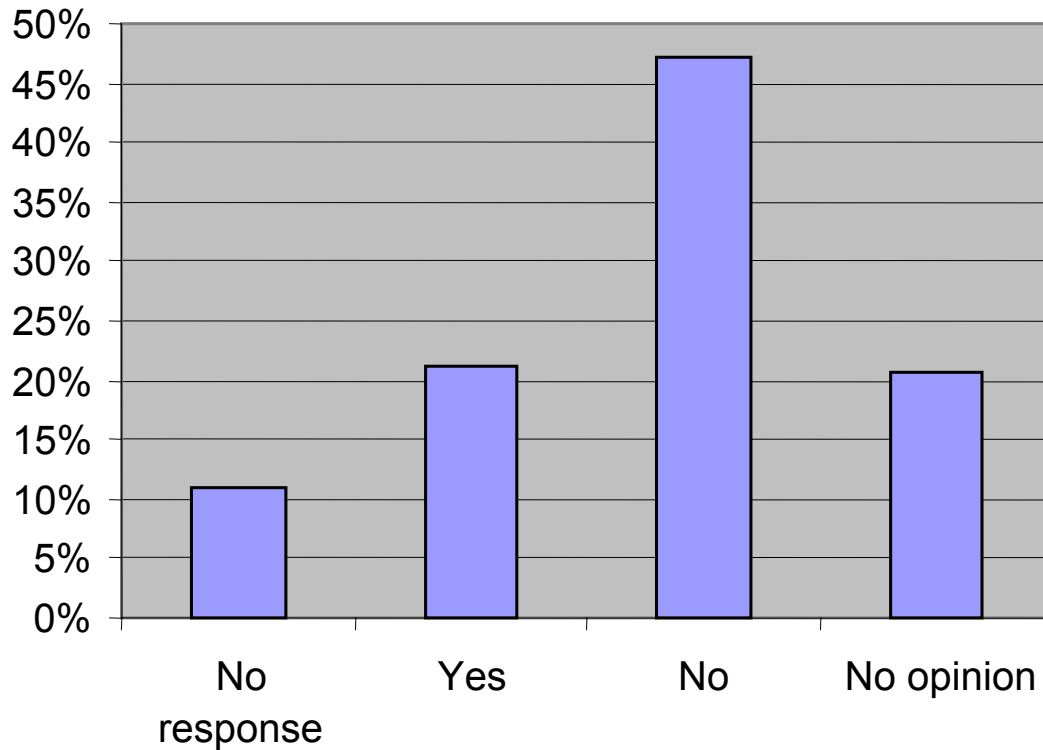

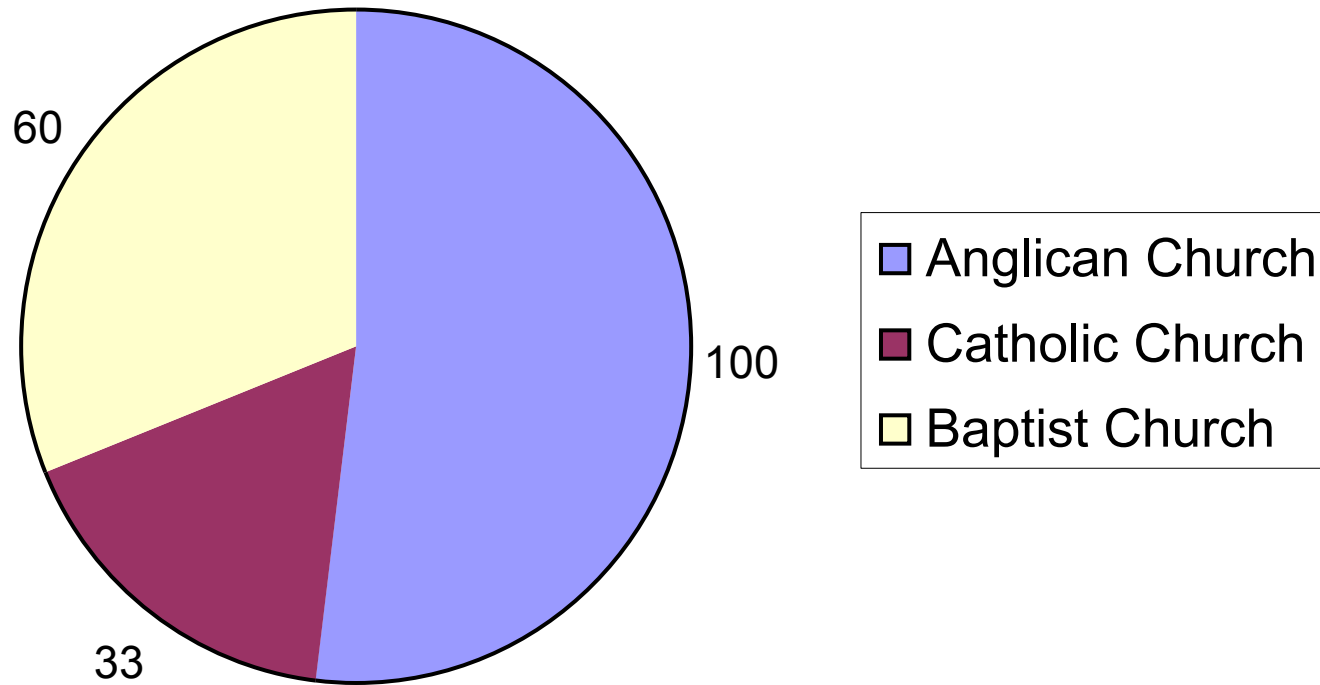
Q61: Do you think that sufficient publicity is given to planning applications which affect Comberton? (N=1290)



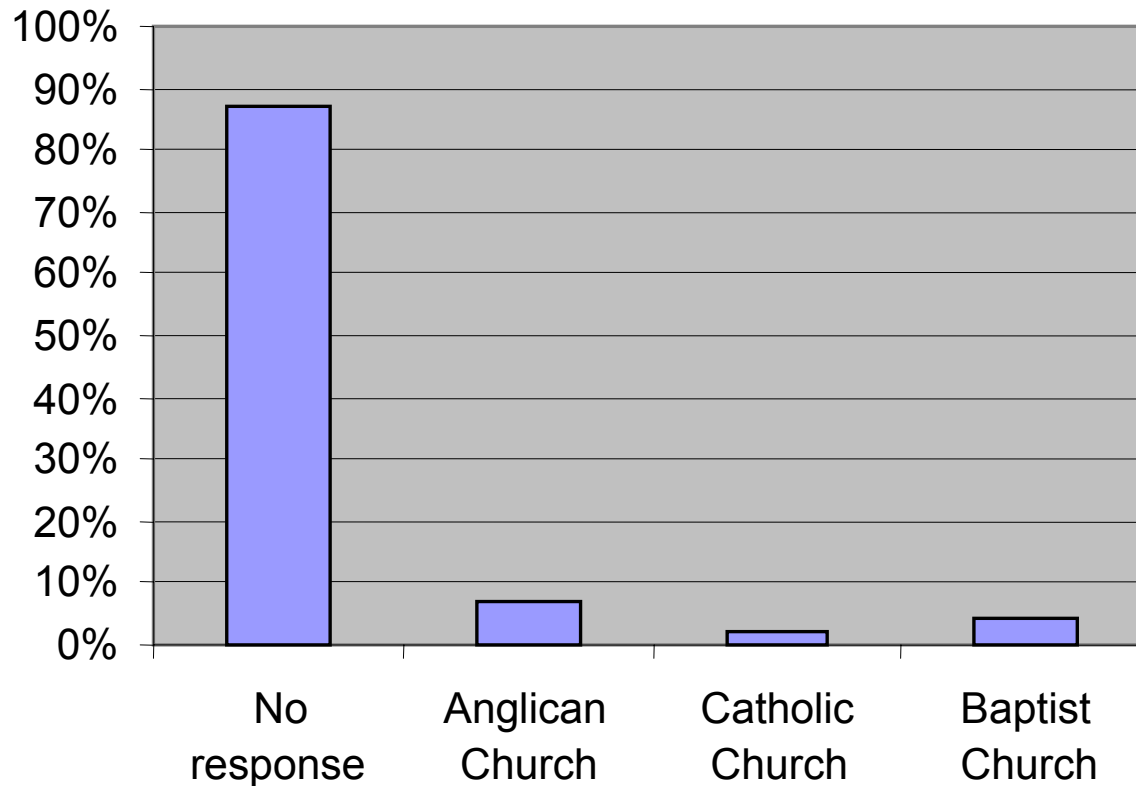

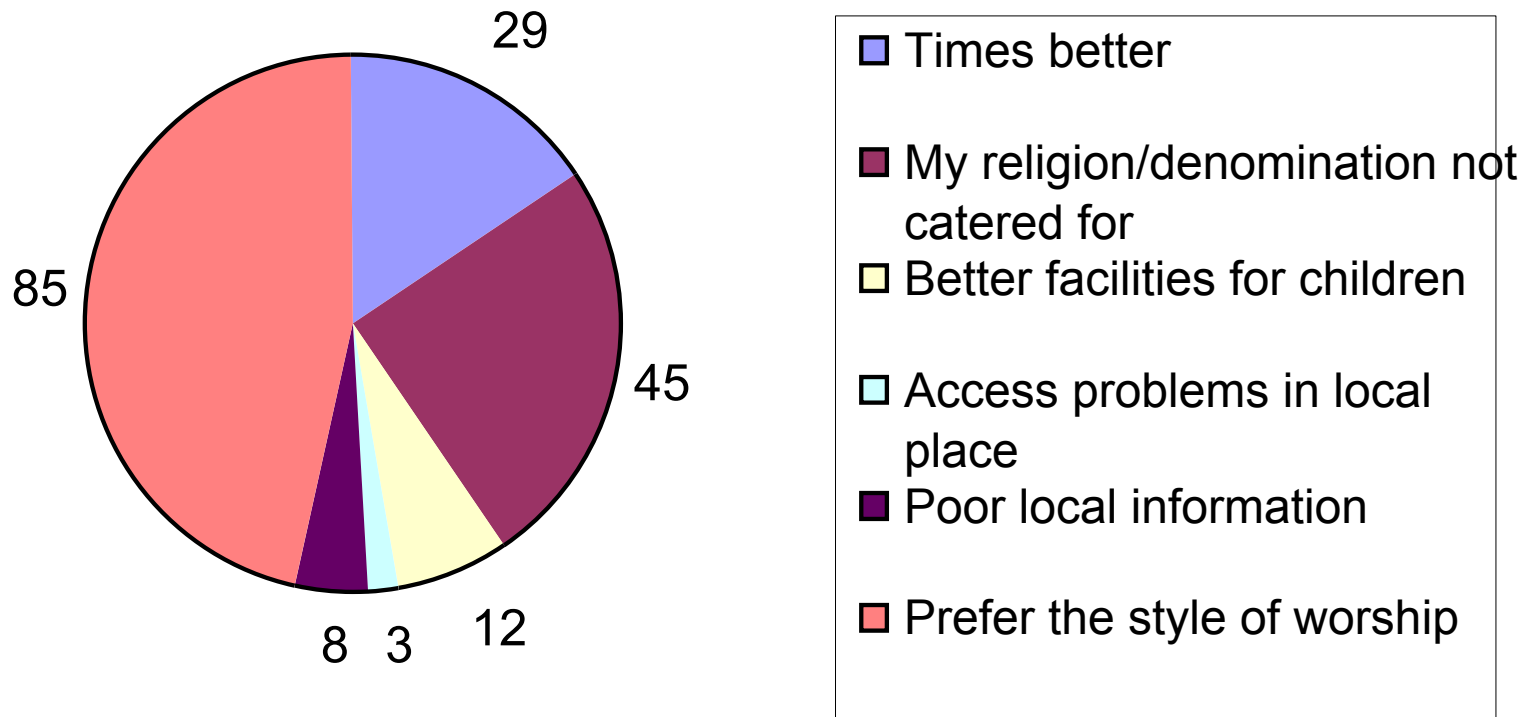
**Q62: Do you regularly attend any of the following places of worship in Comberton?

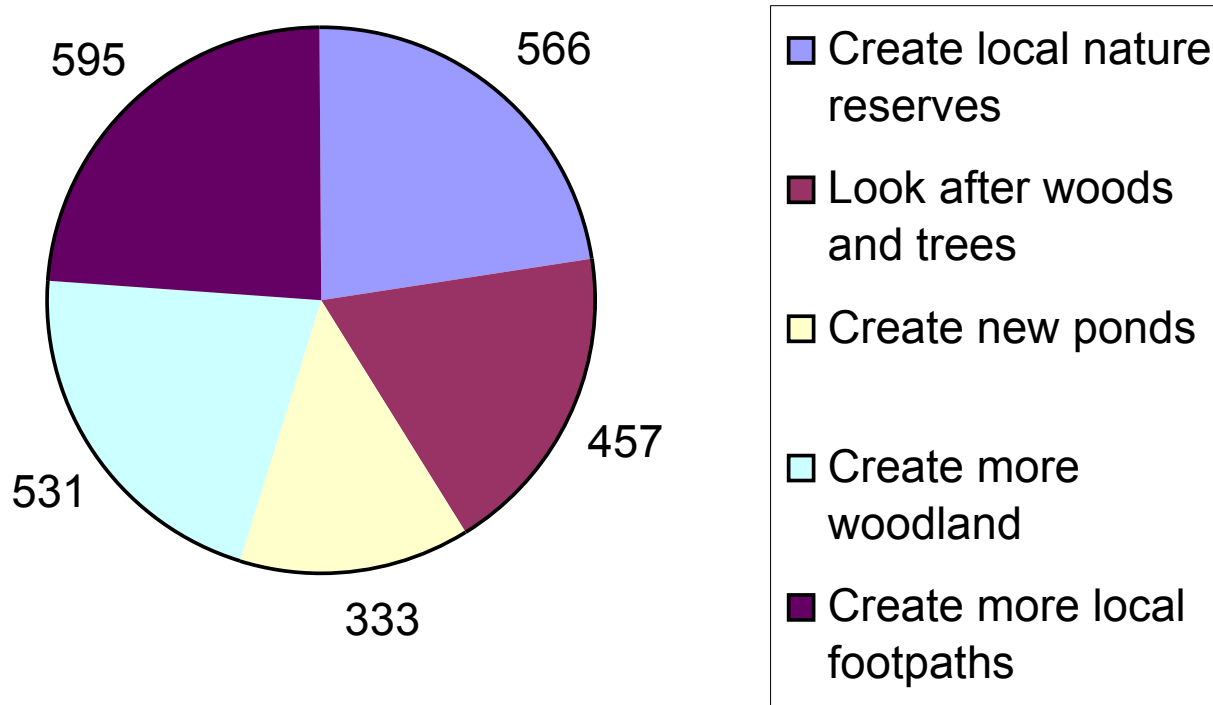
Q62: Do you attend any of the following places of worship in Comberton?



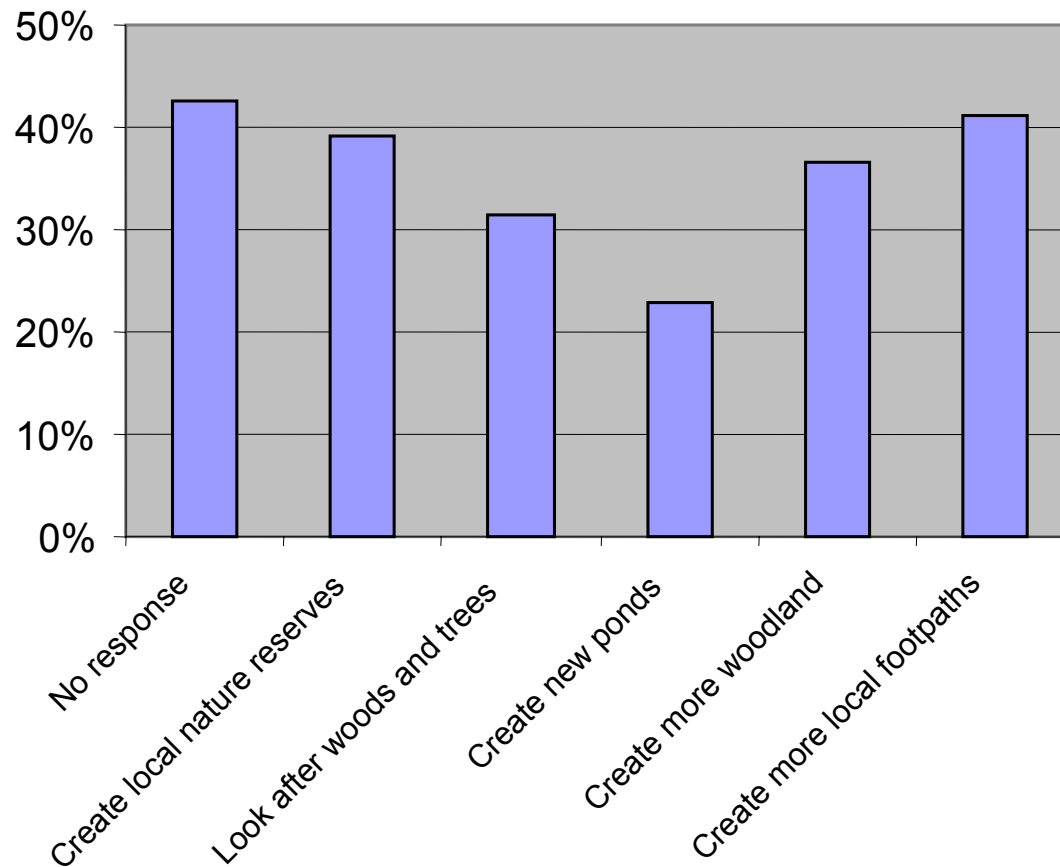
Q63: If you attend places of worship outside Comberton, is it because: (N=141)



Q64: Would you be willing to support the following initiatives if they were taken in Comberton? (N=834)



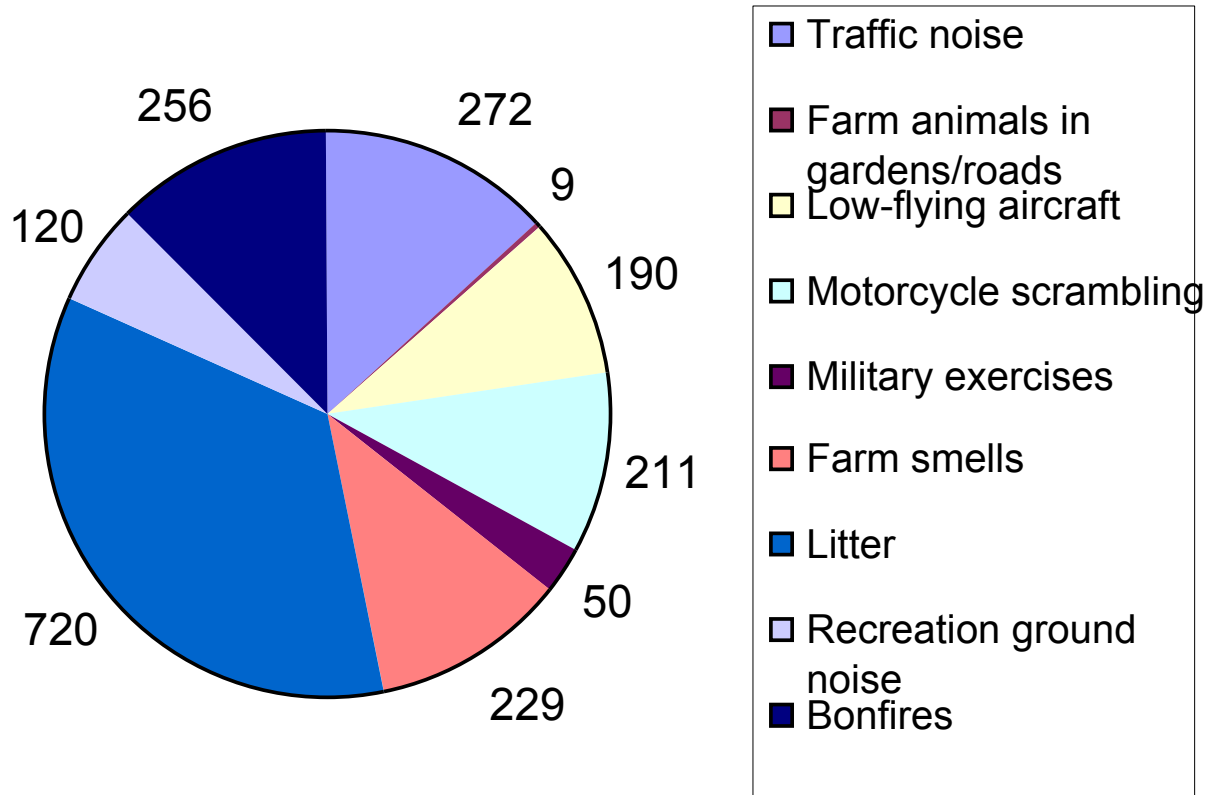

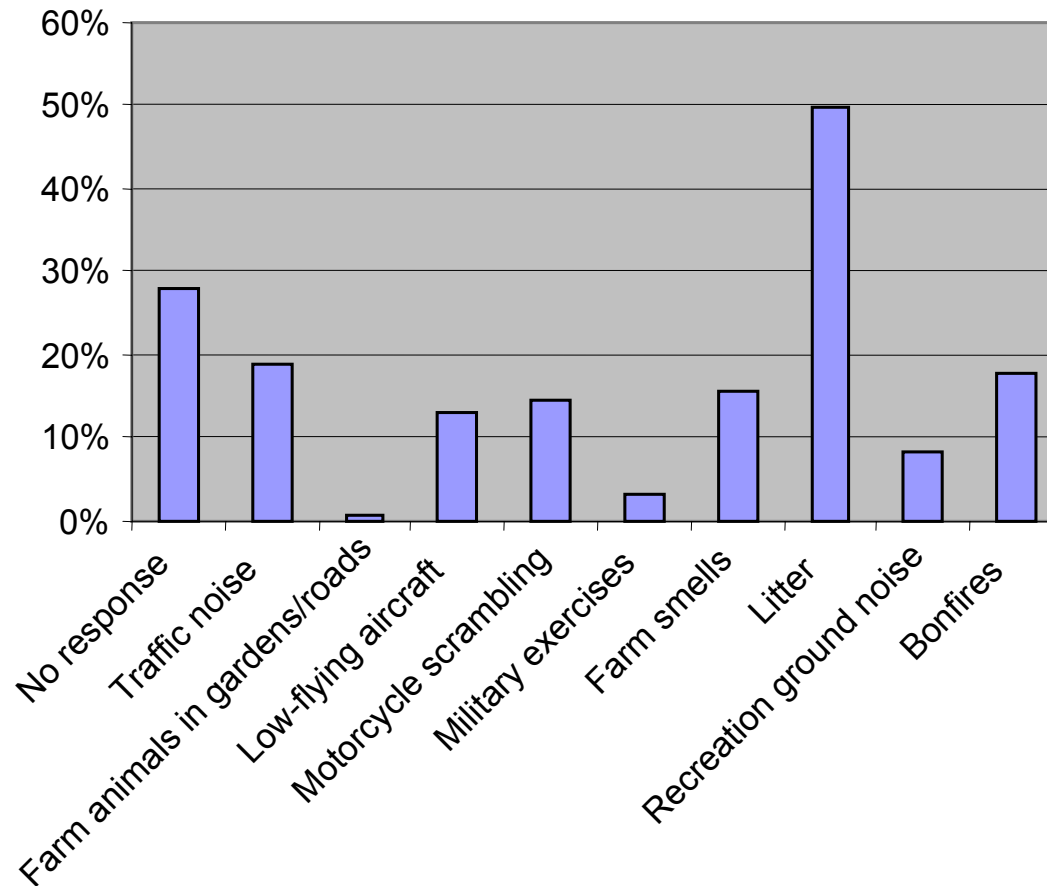
