

Introduction

Postcode CB3 7DS is within Comberton Ward and South Cambridgeshire Local Authority District (LAD) or Unitary Authority (UA).

The Indices of Deprivation 2000 (with rank 1 being the most deprived ward in England) gave Comberton the rank of 8,336 out of a total of 8,414 English wards.

Comberton is classified as 'rural' according to the Countryside Agency's Ward Level Definition of Rural areas, 1998.

People Statistics

Resident Population

Comberton

In mid 1998, 2,300 people lived in Comberton of which 19 per cent were aged under 16, 62 per cent were aged between 16 and 59, and 19 per cent were aged 60 and over.

A total of 26 live births to mothers usually resident in Comberton and 12 deaths of residents of the ward were registered in 1998. These represented crude rates of 11 births and 5 deaths per thousand residents compared with 11 and 8 respectively across the whole of South Cambridgeshire.

South Cambridgeshire

The resident population of South Cambridgeshire, as measured in the 2001 Census, was 130,108 of which 50 per cent were male and 50 per cent were female.

In 2001, 20 per cent of the resident population were aged under 16, 60 per cent were aged between 16 and 59, and 20 per cent were aged 60 and over. The mean average age was 39. This compared with an average age of 39 within England and Wales.

The ethnic structure of South Cambridgeshire is shown in the table below. Figures for England are shown for comparison purposes.

Health

Comberton

In May 1998, 2 per cent of the resident population of Comberton received Disability Living Allowance. This is a benefit payable to people who are disabled, and need help with personal care, getting around or both, before the age of 65.

Within Comberton, the proportion of people receiving Attendance Allowance in May 1998 was 2 per cent. Attendance Allowance is a benefit paid to people over the age of 65 who are so severely disabled, physically or mentally, that they need supervision or a great deal of help with personal care.

Employment, income support, students and qualifications

Comberton

Within Comberton, the average Key Stage 2 score for primary school pupils was 4.30 in 1998. Key Stage 2 tests are taken by children at age 11 and have a target level of 4.

In August 1998, there were a total of 15 Jobseeker Allowance claimants in Comberton of which 33 per cent have child dependants.

In September 1998 there were 300 employee jobs in Comberton.

In August 1998 there were 50 Income Support claimants in Comberton. This represents 2 per cent of the resident population aged 16 or over. For South Cambridgeshire, the proportion was 3 per cent compared with an average of 8 per cent for England overall.

In 2001 there were 5,111 full-time students and schoolchildren aged 16 to 74 in South Cambridgeshire. Of these, 2,413 were aged 18 and over. These figures come from the 2001 Census, where students were enumerated at their term-time address.

Of the resident population aged 16 to 74, 20 per cent had no qualifications, whilst 30 per cent were qualified to degree level or higher.

Households

South Cambridgeshire

Within South Cambridgeshire in 2001, 75 per cent of households living in owner-occupied accommodation, whilst 14 per cent lived in social rented housing (renting from the Council, a Housing Association or a Registered Social Landlord), and the remaining 10 per cent rented privately, or lived rent free.

The proportion of one-person households in South Cambridgeshire was 24 per cent. This compared to an England and Wales average of 30 per cent.

The proportion of lone parent households in South Cambridgeshire with dependent children was 4 per cent, compared to the England and Wales average of 6 per cent.
