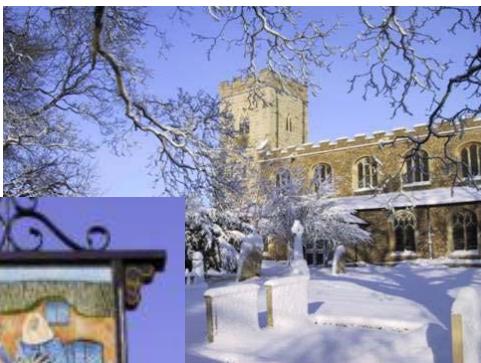


COMBERTON PARISH COUNCIL

Annual Report 2008



Chairman's Report

Planning, conservation, policing and affordable housing are all areas that have been high on the topics for debate and decision. Again the last year has been a fruitful time for the Parish Council and the village in general – but often when working with other agencies the process of achieving things can be incredibly time consuming and slow.

The additional recreational sports area to the north of the present recreation ground has had a couple of cuts and a stock fencing has been erected to the northern boundary. At the time of writing the overhead power cables are about to be placed underground, this has been a long drawn out affair because of the complexities of lease agreements with EDF.

The first Comberton Combathon (village sporting event for all ages) took place in June and was very successful with some talented youngsters taking part in the Herring Mile.

The annual Christmas Lights event took place in December and again was well supported, with over 200 people turning out on a cold frosty evening.

The Connections youth bus continues to visit on a Tuesday and is well received by the youth of the village.

Following the uncontested Parish election we welcomed 2 new councillors, Mrs Julie Horne and Mr Jock Walsh. Mr David Ellis resigned his position in March 2008 and the vacancy has been advertised. In October 2007 South Cambridgeshire District Council held their Scrutiny and Overview Committee meeting in the village hall. The Parish Council were able to put forward several concerns/questions relating to planning, exception sites, licensing and village design statements.

The Parish Council continues to support a number of village groups and activities through the S137 grants. The majority of the sections in the Parish Plan (written in 2003) have been reviewed and a high proportion of the tasks completed.

Who and what is the Parish Council?

The Parish Council comprises 13 voluntary councillors who serve for a term of 4 years and represent an electorate of 1763.

The Council meets on the second Wednesday of each month except August with additional Planning Committee meetings being held as necessary. The agenda is displayed on notice board in South Street.

The public are welcome to attend these meetings and a short time is allocated on the agenda for comments and observations from members of the public. The Chairman and other members are available in the village hall to talk with parishioners before the meeting.



The Parish Council has representatives on other bodies outside the Parish Council and Councillors attend meetings on the Council's behalf.

Each member of the Council either serves on a committee or working group or has an area of responsibility.

Members' reports

Focus Group

The focus group has responsibility for organising the community events and the placement of additional litter and dog bins. The group continues to work closely with the County Council on the enhancement and restoration of the ancient footpath between Barton Road and Swaynes Lane. (This has been delayed due to planning applications and planning appeals). This will include of the replacement of the parish-pump in Barton Road. The Christmas lights event again was a huge success.

Footpaths – Parish Path Partnership (P3)

Comberton continues to be a member of The Parish Paths Partnership (P3). This involves the parish working with the County Council to ensure that the footpaths are well maintained and accessible to all. Work has been delayed on the Barton Road to Swaynes Lane path [Footpath 5] due to recent planning applications. These were recently refused by SCDC, but taken to appeal by the owner. It was refused at appeal and an amended application was submitted. We should now be able to proceed with the planned work. This includes replacing the parish-pump that was 'removed' and enhancing this ancient pathway to improve access for all. The Bridleway from Long Road to Coton [Bridleway 3] has had a barrier erected. This has helped keep vehicles off the bridleway but there is still a fair amount of 'fly-tipping' that happens at the entrance to the wooded area. In Long Road we are continuing to look at improvements to the bridleway and nearby footpaths to improve the safety for all users. (Due to the speed and amount of traffic). We have surveyed all the rights of way within the parish and are working with local landowners to improve access to all.

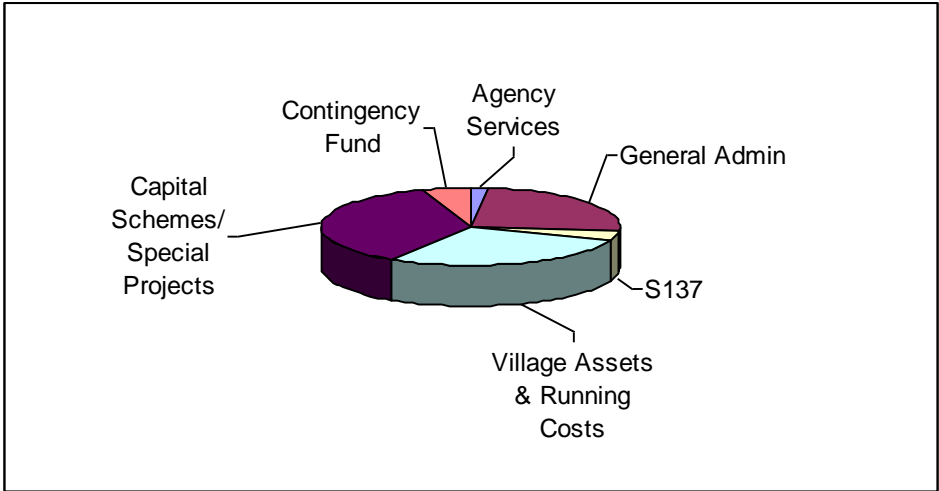
At the time of writing this report we are still waiting for the County Council to sign the agreements with landowners in order to create some new definitive and permissive paths in the village.

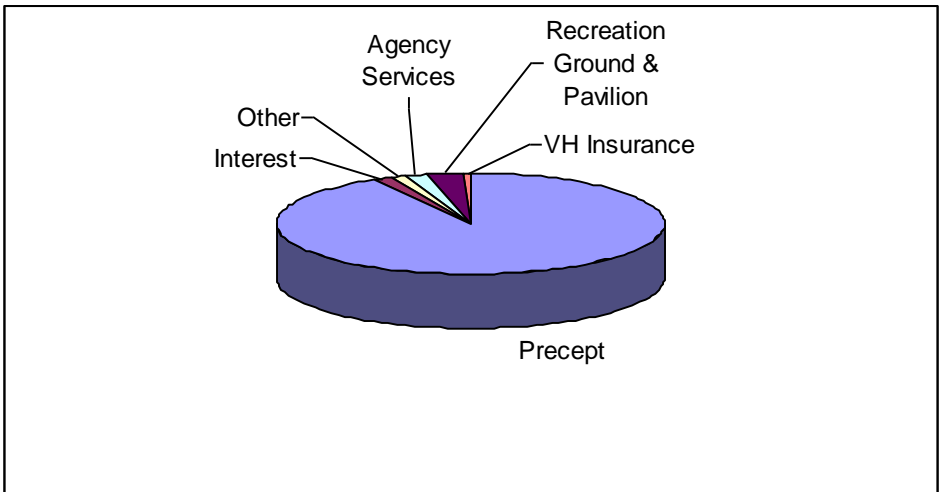
